HUD Community Challenge Planning Grant Colony Park Sustainable Community Initiative Fact Sheet



<u>Award Amount</u>: \$3,000,000

Grant Term: 3-year planning grant

<u>Summary</u>: The Colony Park Sustainable Community Initiative is a 3-year Community Planning Process that will culminate in a Master Plan for 208-acres of publicly-owned land in Northeast Austin, on Loyola Lane between Johnny Morris Road and Decker Lane. The development will incorporate best practice strategies for energy-efficient building design, water conservation and zero-waste technology and standards to create a model sustainable and livable mixeduse, mixed-income community. The project will include completion of a Master Plan, resulting in rezoning; engineering for subdivision and site planning for review and approval by the City of Austin; infrastructure construction plans and architectural design guidelines for new sustainable residential and commercial development.

The proposed project will support and furthers the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's six "livability principles:" provide more transportation choices; promote equitable, affordable housing; enhance economic competitiveness; support existing communities; coordinate policies and leverage investment; and value communities and neighborhoods.



Project Goals

- 1. Further land-use planning and development of 208 acres of publicly-owned land at Colony Park inspired by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Livability Principles.
- 2. Foster cross-department/agency coordination and create successful models of comprehensive systems change to support sustainable and equitable development.
- 3. Support capacity building and community transformation goals of Colony Park area residents and stakeholders.

Project Activities



Activity 1: Team Formation and Initial Analysis

Long-Term Outcome: Establish clear channels of communication with area residents and stakeholders; build capacity and breadth of project team; assess opportunities and constraints of proposed development.

Activity 2: Kickoff and Visioning Phase

Long-Term Outcome: Determine a shared vision of the proposed development based on local interpretation of the HUD Livability Principles.


Activity 3: Plan Development and Approval

Long-Term Outcome: Incorporate the vision into a vibrant Master plan for the Colony Park initiative; achieve regulatory approvals to proceed with project.

Activity 4: Evaluation and Knowledge Sharing

Long-Term Outcome: Assess project implementation and success; achieve best practices in sustainability; foster cross-department/agency coordination, create successful models of comprehensive systems change to support sustainable and equitable development.
