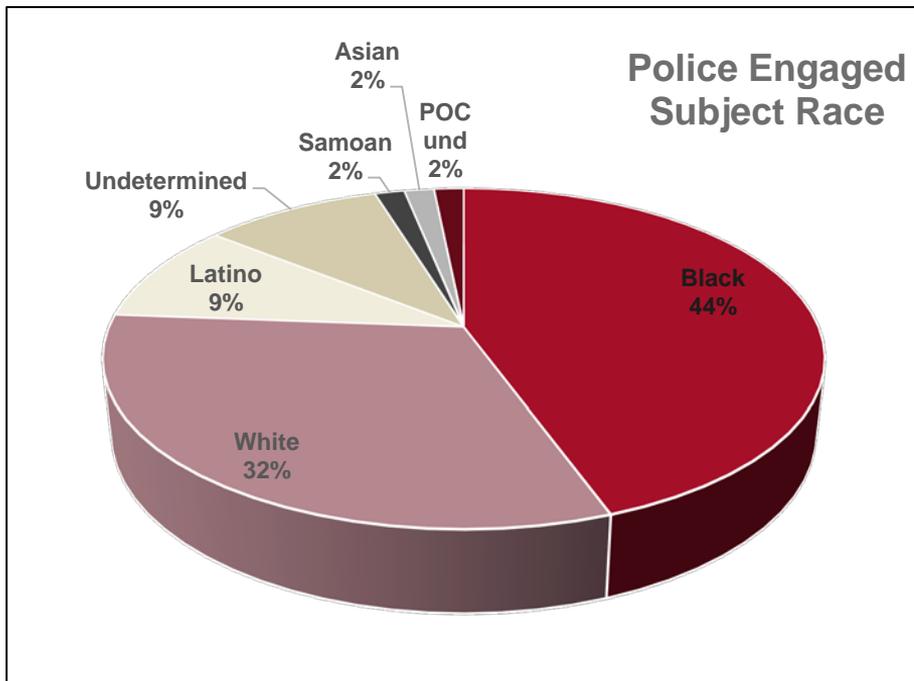

0.1% Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander

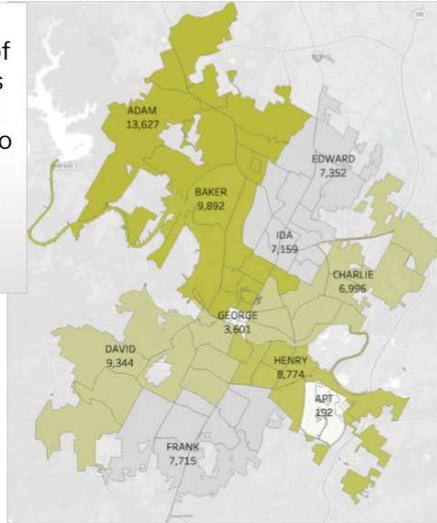
3.5% selected "two or more races"

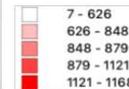
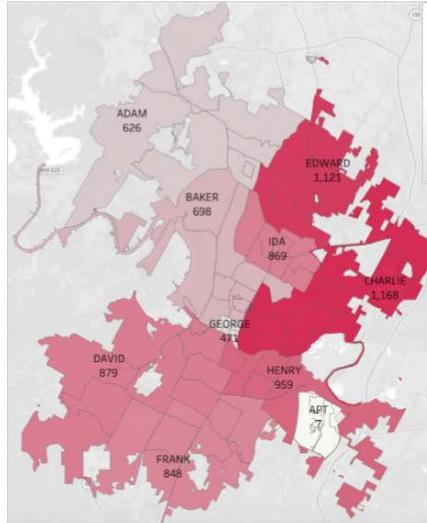
## Geographic Analysis

## Patterns – Bias and Stereotypes

- Racial Bias, Stereotypes and Use Of Force
  - Issues of Racism, Implicit Bias, Not Integrated Throughout
  - Dehumanizing Footage
  - Rapid Escalation and Use of Force with People of Color

## Patterns – Bias and Stereotypes

- Racial Bias, Stereotypes and Use Of Force
  - Working Class and People of Color Seen as Threats
  - Gendered Stereotypes
  - Who Is Allowed To Be In Crisis
  - Particular Crises Are Validated; Racialized Trauma Is Not

## Patterns - Police

- Us Versus Them” Mentality
- Dramatic Reinforcement of the “Danger Imperative”
- A Few Bad Apples” Theory of Police Accountability

## Patterns – Teaching

- Overrepresentation of “What Not To Do” Videos
- Ineffective Language and Neglected Power Dynamics
- Videos Emphasized Transactional Interactions
- Inappropriate Use of Mass Media News Clips
