


AIPP Ordinance

Austin Arts Commission is made up of citizens appointed by Council to serve.


Art In Public Places Panel:

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Budget and Scope of Work

Colony Park District Park:

Funded from 3 park projects pooled to build a budget of:

Total: \$39,500

The budget must include all expenses related to design, fabrication, and installation including engineering and permitting fees, travel and shipping, insurance, any and all project-related costs.

The goal of the Colony Park District Park AIPP Project is to select an artist/artist team who will design artwork that:

- establishes a simple, visually engaging landmark, potentially through lighting, visible to visitors entering the park;
- reflects the history and current aspiration of the surrounding neighborhoods;
- is physically and conceptually accessible to visitors of all ages;
- is easily maintained and vandal resistant in an exterior environment; and
- contributes to the depth/breadth of the City of Austin's public art collection.

Artist Eligibility

A Request for Qualifications will be solicited from professional visual artists, or artist teams, who live in the Austin metropolitan area. This includes Travis, Williamson, Bastrop, Caldwell, Hays, Burnet, and Blanco counties.

Artists who currently have one active contract with the Art in Public Places program or who have more than two commissioned permanent projects in the AIPP Collection are ineligible to apply. Artist teams are considered as separate entities; their projects do not count as projects by the individual artists. We encourage artist teams to apply.

Selection Process

AIPP will convene a Selection Panel to evaluate the submissions. Artists may be selected directly from the submissions (images of work, resume, letter of interest, references) or through an interview process. The Selection Panel will review submissions, select finalists, interview finalists, and select one artist and one alternate for the artwork opportunity.

Please also consider applying to our open call for Pre-Qualified Local or Pre-Qualified National Pools if you are eligible. More information here:

- √ technical expertise
- ✓ demonstrated ability to successfully execute public art projects, of a similar scope, on time and on budget
- ✓ expressed interest in creating artwork within this project's site and context
- ✓ experience working collaboratively within a community context or residency setting



Request for Qualifications for Colony Park District Park

Project Budget: \$39,500



Art in Public Places seeks to commission a professional artist or artist team to create a permanent public artwork for Colony Park District Park. Located between Loyola and Decker Lanes, and adjacent to the community's Turner Roberts Recreation Center, the park is being developed in partnership with Austin Parks Foundation and St. David's Foundation, with planned improvements including a multi-purpose field, nature-based play area, pedestrian bridge and other amenities. The selected artwork will reflect the unique history and values of the neighborhood and serve as a visual marker to help identify Colony Park District Park. The total project budget is \$39,500, and professional visual artists, or artist teams, at least 18 years of age who live in the Williamson, Travis, Bastrop, Caldwell, Hays, Burnet and Blanco counties are eligible to apply. The deadline is January 4, 2018. Applications must be received online via www.PublicArtist.org/AustinAIPP.



Austin Art in Public Places

The City of Austin's Art in Public Places (AIPP) program acquires and maintains works of art for City facilities through commissions, donations and loans for the cultural enrichment of the Austin community. AIPP is a program of the Cultural Arts Division within the City of Austin's Economic Development Department.

In 1985, the City of Austin became the first municipality in Texas to make a commitment to include works of art in construction projects. By ordinance, 2% of eligible capital improvement project budgets are allocated to commission or purchase art for that site. The AIPP Collection is found at sites such as the airport, convention center, libraries, parks, police stations, recreation centers, and streetscapes, enhancing public spaces for all residents and visitors to our City.

- Letter of Interest: why you are interested, what makes you a good match for the project, and how you might approach it. Please keep in mind the project Goals & Priorities! (700 words)
- Up to 10 images of completed relevant artwork with the required descriptions
- Resume (up to 3 pages)
- 3 professional references (name and contact information)

For Artist TEAMS:

- Artist teams must have each team member's work represented in the 10 images
- In Letter of Interest, please include your team members' names

The City of Austin Art in Public Places program seeks artists from diverse demographic backgrounds for public art commissions. Visual artists or artist teams in the United States at least 18 years of age are eligible to apply for the National Pool, and artist and artist teams who live in Irravis, Williamson, Bastrop, Caldwell, Hays, Burnet, and Blanco counties are eligible for both the Local and National Artist Pool.

The purpose of the Pre-Qualified Artist Pools is to provide a streamlined application and selection process for artists interested in being commissioned for public art projects through Art in Public Places.

ADDITIONAL NOTICE OF ARTIST OPPORTUNITIES~

Pre-Qualified Artist Pools:

PURPOSE

- Streamline application and selection processes
 - Reduces staff time spent in selection
- Facilitate inter-departmental collaboration
 - Allows project design teams and eligible staff, such as ABIA's architectural staff, to vote in selection
- Reduces artist time spent applying for calls
 - Artists apply once to be considered for Pool;
 able to be direct selected or nominated or invited to apply for invitational

USE

- Short-time frame projects where window of artist collaboration is short
- Projects with limiting parameters (small budgets, specific artwork opportunity area, specific media in mind, enterprise departments, etc.)
- Artist roster may be shared with community, including private developers and other commissioning agencies or entities
- Selection process to be determined in each Prospectus, as usual.

ADDITIONAL NOTICE OF ARTIST OPPORTUNITIES~

Pre-Qualified Artist Pools:

LOCAL

Opportunities for artwork commissions with budgets ranging from \$20k to \$250k, for emerging and established artists.

Artists must be practitioners of the visual arts, have original, selfconceptualized bodies of work, and generally be recognized as professionals with serious intent and abilities.

Artists must have managed projects with budgets of at lease \$10K.

Artists must have experience working with materials suitable for durable indoor or outdoor settings, and experience in site-specific design.



Qualified artists and artist teams will have demonstrated experience working with: budgets in excess of \$100,000; materials suitable for indoor or outdoor public settings; site-specific design; experience working with public entities; and/or demonstrable skills in public art project management and/or collaboration with other artists, design professionals, or community members.
