Creative Content Incentive Program

City of Austin Economic Development Department

The City of Austin offers incentives to qualifying film, television, video game, and visual effects projects equal to 0.50% of wages paid to local workers. Projects produced by an Austin-based company or which significantly promote Austin may be eligible for an additional 0.25% incentive for a total incentive of 0.75%. http://www.austintexas.gov/department/film-digital-media-production-incentives

Media Production and Development Zone Incentive

City of Austin Economic Development Department

The Media Production and Development Zone incentive, nominated by the City of Austin and administered by the Texas Film Commission, is a two-year exemption on sales and use taxes charged on select equipping of a media production facility. https://austintexas.gov/economic-development-compliance

Souly Austin

Redevelopment Division, City of Austin Economic Development Department

Souly Austin is a program of the City of Austin's Economic Development Department that provides a flexible set of tools and resources to assist in the formation of merchants associations that will anchor Austin's business districts. A merchants association is a group of business owners that work together to anchor and stabilize neighboring businesses by organizing around beautification efforts, marketing and promotions, business retention, and economic development activities within a commercial district. CSAP: Creative Space Assistance Program

Cultural Arts Division, City of Austin Economic Development Department

The Creative Space Assistance Program (CSAP) provides direct support to qualifying creative organizations facing temporary or permanent displacement, or to those previously displaced. The program is open to arts-focused nonprofits as well as qualifying for-profit live music venues, performance spaces, and art galleries. Grants will be made on a competitive basis with priority given to organizations confronting immediate and critical needs. http://www.austintexas.gov/csap

Village of the Arts

Village of the Arts is a pilot collaborative program with MINDPOP that provides local artists and arts organizations with studio space at select public schools in exchange for their service to students and families.

FORTHCOMING PROGRAMS UNDERWAY:

\$12M Bond for Creative Space: Proposition B of the 2018 Bond package included \$12M in funding for Creative Space. Per Council Resolution No. 20180809-061, the City Manager was directed to recommend "a proposed process, description, and criteria for Creative Space Acquisition and Improvements...developed in consultation with the Arts and Music Commissions and in compliance with the use of bond funds." Location Enhancement Program: The Location Enhancement Program support private-sector led real estate development projects that deliver community benefits. Community benefits include the creation of vibrant centers of commerce, culture and residences in an equitable and sustainable manner or the provision of a stable location for specific types of tenants that City Council has identified as targeted industries, such as arts and music businesses and venues.
