

AIPP Ordinance 1985 = 1% of eligible 2002 = 2% of eligible

CIP eligible = buildings, parks, streetscapes, bridges and more

- Artwork must be sited at funding project/facility
- Staff works with AIPP Panel, department staff, project teams and the community





AUSTIN ART IN PUBLIC PLACES

Since 1985, the Art in Public Places (AIPP) program has collaborated with local and nationally known artists to create cultural landmarks for the city. These artworks incorporate our community's history and values and have become cornerstones of Austin's identity.

Austin was the first municipality in Texas to make a commitment to include works of art in City construction projects. By ordinance, 2% of the budget for eligible capital improvement projects is allocated to commission or purchase art for that facility. Austin's public art collection, located at sites such the airport, convention center, libraries, parks, police stations, recreation centers, and streetscapes, greatly enhances public spaces for all residents and visitors.



Art In Public Places Panel:

Seven visual arts and design professionals who help guide the Art in Public Places program.



The approval process includes the AIPP Panel, Arts Commission, and sometimes City Council, as well as collaboration with City staff and project stakeholders





Request for Qualifications



Artwork Opportunity

This public art opportunity is open to a wide range of ideas to be proposed by the selected artist, or artist team, in consultation with the City staff and project stakeholders.

The artwork must be located near the entrance to the library (exterior), as shown below, and may include alterations to the existing landscape that enhance the siting of the artwork.

A variety of media suitable for exterior applications will be considered. It is expected that the selected artist(s) will engage with the local community to develop the design of the artwork.

Artist Eligibility

A Request for Qualifications will be solicited from professional visual artists, or artist teams, **who live in the Austin metropolitan area**. This includes Travis, Williamson, Bastrop, Caldwell, and Hays counties.

Artists who currently have one active contract with the Art in Public Places program or who have more than two commissioned permanent projects in the AIPP Collection are ineligible to apply.

Evaluation Criteria

technical expertise;

demonstrated ability to successfully execute public art projects, of a similar scope, on time and on budget;

expressed interest in creating artwork in a library setting.

Selection Process

Staff will convene a three member Selection Panel to evaluate the submissions. **Up to three finalists will be selected for interviews**. The Selection Panel will review qualifications (images of work, resume, letter of interest, references), interview finalists, and select one artist and one alternate.


This recommendation will be presented to the Art in Public Places Panel and Arts Commission for approval.

Public Art Intent & Goals

- strengthens the identity of the library by providing a visually engaging landmark visible to motorists and pedestrians;
- reflects the character of the surrounding neighbourhoods and the diverse population served by the library;
- is accessible physically and conceptually by all ages of library patrons and neighborhood residents;
- > is made of durable, low maintenance materials suitable for exterior applications;
- > enriches the depth and breadth of the City's public art collection.

Submission Requirements

- **DEADLINE:** 5:00pm, Thursday, October 15, 2015
- Applicants must submit all materials through <u>www.PublicArtist.org</u>
 - Sign up for FREE!
 - Select up to 10 images to apply for the call. Artist teams must have each team member's work represented in the 10 images.
 - Letter of Interest: briefly describe your specific interest in the project and explain why your qualifications are a good fit. Please keep in mind the "Public Art Intent & Goals."



AIPP is a program of the Cultural Arts Division within the City of Austin's Economic Development Department.
