\$30 Million for:


- Destination park in Oak Hill
- Infill parks
- Greenbelts



If the bond were increased to \$50 Million ...

These acquisitions could be added:

- North Austin metro park
- Central Austin district park
- 5 pocket parks
- 5 more miles of greenbelt

Parks within walking distance

The Imagine Austin goal for access to parks is:


- ¼ mile walk in urban core
- ½ mile walk outside the urban core

Located in park-deficient areas


Pocket parks: up to 2 acres

~ 200 acres with sports fields

Explore partnership with WPD to preserve water quality

North Austin metro park




Onion Creek Soccer Complex


Destination parks to serve existing residents


Colorado River
