




Adult Obesity in America 2011-12

Percent of adults who are physically inactive




Facts

- Studies show more access to parks means more physical activity
- By increasing access to places for physical activity, youth are less likely to be overweight or obese
- 30% of physically active adults exercise in parks
- Active park use means fewer visits to a doctor other than routine checkups
- Physically active people have lower blood pressure and lower annual direct medical costs

Facts

- Workers with a view of nature had reduced absenteeism, increased job satisfaction, less task frustration
- Cognitive functioning and Performance improves when people walk in nature
- Green outdoor activities and settings reduces ADHD symptoms
- Regular exposure to nature reduces fatigue





Small parks make up 37% of the total property value impact

43% of all residential properties in Chicago have a higher value due to parks

17% of the total tourism is due to parks

10 STEPS TO **RENEWED WATERWAY**




Combined Sewer Overflows (CSOs)




Step 1 Acquire former industrial property; Increase public access to water



Reduce CSOs with green infrastructure




Step 3 Install hydrological separation to stop invasive species; Connect neighborhoods




Step 4 Remediate Canal



Step 5 Create wetlands / park lands infrastructure



Step 6 Add wastewater treatment; Send cleaned water to Gulf of Mexico



Step 7 Move barrier west of Stickney



Step 8 Collect all cleaned water in wetland; Reverse flow



Step 9 Create inland waterfront



Step 10 Recharge Lake Michigan! Repeat

Facts

- The use of green outdoor common spaces <u>predicts</u> strength of neighborhood social ties and sense of community
- Experiencing nature has powerful influence on rehabilitation of people greatly affected by a crisis
- Having many prior nature experiences reduces crisis affects






















Divorce rate in Maine






