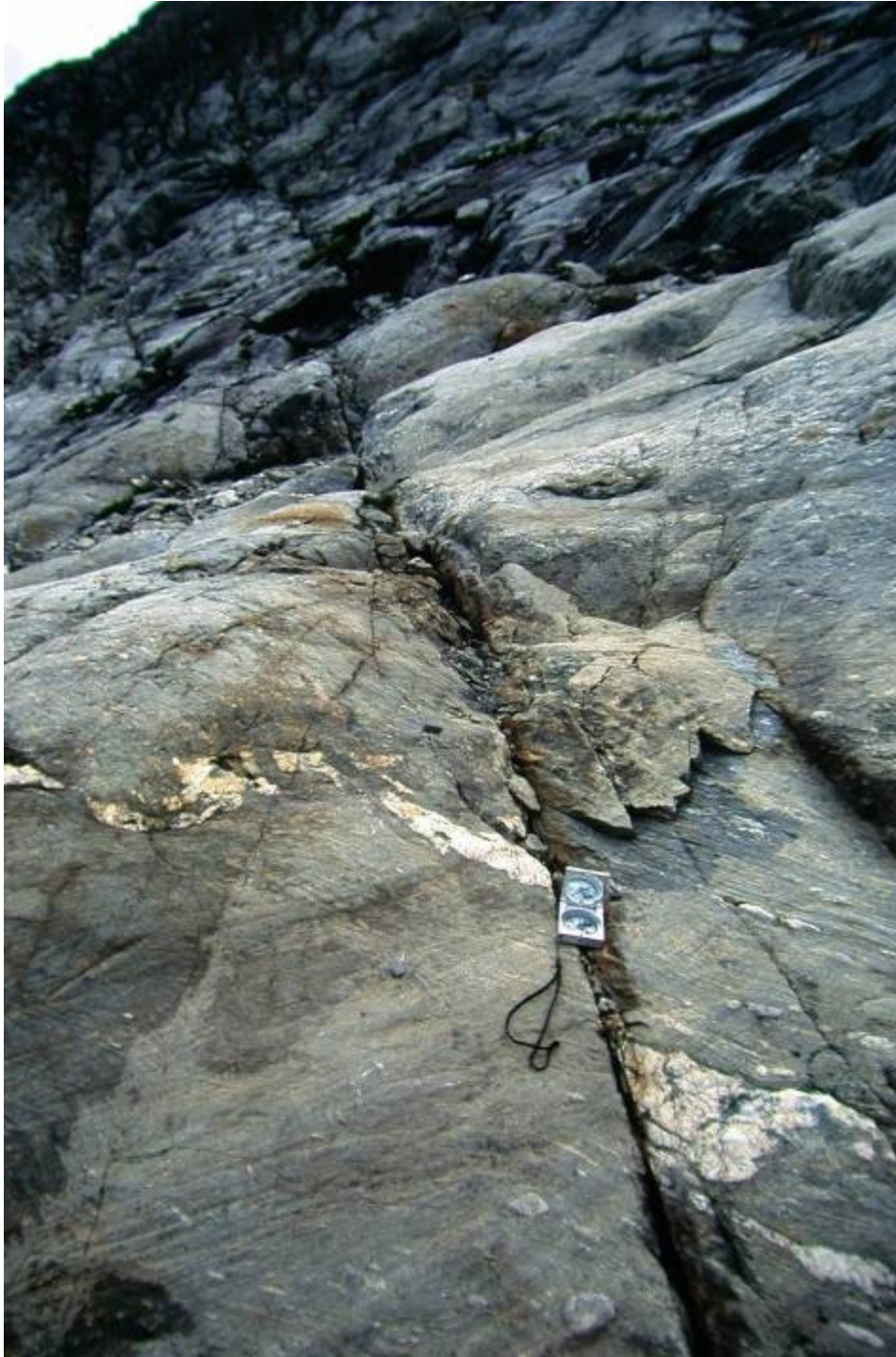

Fault Station

- Hike to an observable fault in Shoal Creek
- Distinguish between natural and man-made resources
- Investigate rapid changes that shaped Central Texas
- Explore the geologic time line of Pease Park

- Identify and keep three rocks or fossils

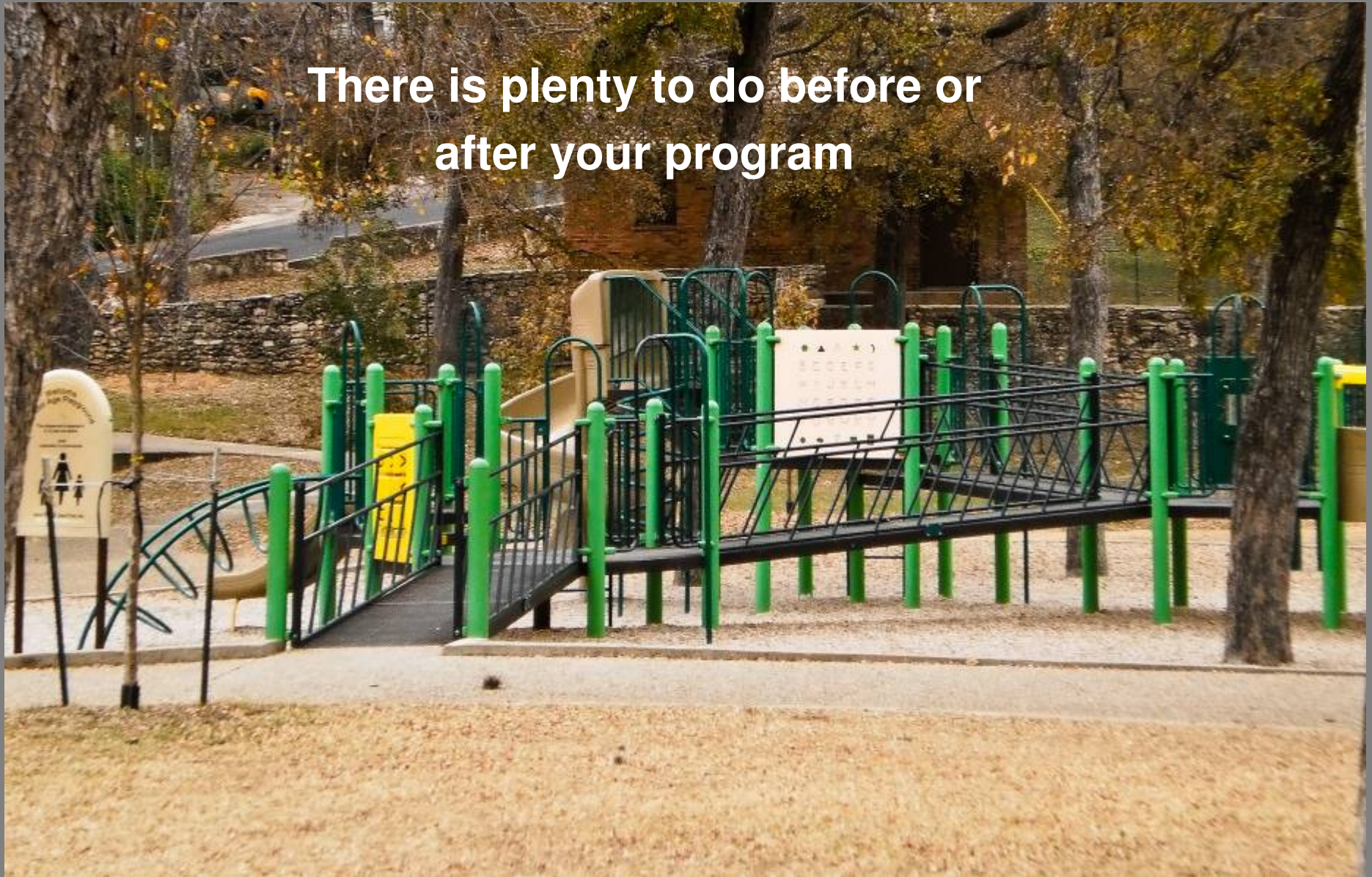


Rock Cycle Station
