Welcome to the Dougherty Arts School's new Create Away After School Program for Fall 2020. We are so excited to have your child participating in our program!

This Program Specific Handbook provides information that you will need to be prepared for your child's participation in Create Away. This handbook is a supplement and does not replace the Austin Parks and Recreation Department's handbook (see the link above), but does provide Dougherty Arts Center's online program specific information.

All participants are required to have a completed **Dougherty Arts Center Create Away After School On-Line Program Permission and Waiver form** on file before the program starts. Our low teacher-to-student ratio (1:6) allows for virtual classrooms with 2 instructors and up to 12 students so every student will get individual attention from program staff and have a chance to socialize with peers of their age group.

Our virtual classrooms take a process-balanced approach to instruction in order to allow children to feel confident in themselves as well as with others while learning new skills. Students will have the opportunity to exercise their cognitive abilities through creative problemsolving while working with a variety of artistic media.

This year, we will be exploring the theme of Storytelling through visual, performing, and digital arts. We will tell and be told of stories from different times, places, cultures, and settings. We will examine the process of building a story, sharing with with others, and how stories may change over time.

We look forward to an amazing session and hope to bring our community closer through the practice and celebration of art! Thank you for joining us during this trying time.

Program Information



FOR AGES 5* - 12

*(5-year-olds must be enrolled in kindergarten) Students will be grouped by age in their Zoom rooms.

Create Away is a digital after school program held over Zoom where elementary-aged students can connect with others, socialize with peers, and flex their creative skills under the guidance of our Arts Instructors who specialize in various visual, performing, and digital arts mediums. The goal of Create Away is to give students a supportive virtual environment to come together, have fun, and foster creative expression from home.

Starting in September, Create Away will run from 3:30pm to 5:30pm, Monday through Thursday. 5-year-olds may register if enrolled in kindergarten. Create Away lesson plans are based on TEKS (Texas Education Knowledge and Skills) in the arts. This program will be free but will require registration and a completed waiver to attend. A basic supply kit will be provided.

Program Hours

Create Away will meet weekly, Monday through Thursday, from 3:30pm to 5:30pm.

Theme

Our Program Theme for Fall 2020 is **STORYTELLING**.

DAILY SCHEDULE

3:30 - 4:00 Arrival / Homework / Greetings / Check-Ins

4:00 - 5:00 ARTS LESSON

5:00 - 5:30 Wrap-Ups / Presentations / Closing Activities

Students will rotate through different arts lessons which focus on different disciplines of art, including:

- 2-Dimensional Art
- 3-Dimensional Art
- Performing Art
- Music
- Digital Art
- Mixed Media

Preparing Your Child for Class

Supervision

Program staff members will not and are not expected to act in a supervisory capacity for enrolled students. Parents and guardians retain full supervisory responsibilities for any and all activities that occur during the program. (See Permission/ Waiver form, page 8.)

PARTICIPANT ATTENDANCE

Attendance is not mandatory. Attendance is the responsibility of participants and their families.

Enrollment & Attendance

Enrollment is set on a per session basis and attendance is the responsibility of the student and parent or guardian.

Zoom Account

Please set up a Zoom account with your student's name so Instructors know who they are letting into the rooms. Only registered participants may participate in the program. https://zoom.us/signup

Zoom Classroom Links

Links to your student's Zoom classroom will be sent to your registered email address on the Friday before the program session begins. Sometimes our correspondence can get filtered into spam, so check there too.

If you would like to receive Zoom links and program correspondence to a different email address than the one you used to sign up for the program, please let us know at your earliest convenience.

Supplies & Equipment

Equipment required for virtual programs, such as a computer, tablet, internet access, headset, earphones, microphone, webcam, etc., are the responsibility of your household and will not be provided by the program.

Free basic art supply kits will be available for pickup on specific dates per session. We will inform you of the pickup dates and times via email. Waiver/Permission forms must be turned in order to receive supplies.



Appropriateness

Ensure that your child is appropriately dressed while they attend the Create Away program. Use an appropriate Zoom background or check the surrounding area to make sure that there is nothing inappropriate in view.

If program staff notice something on your child's video that is not appropriate, they will turn off the student's video until the issue is resolved.

Behavior

Appropriate behavior for participants is expected. Program staff will review appropriate and inappropriate behaviors with all participants. Bullying, including cyberbullying, during a session or outside of a session is not appropriate. Issues and consequences will be addressed with participant and parent and may include but are not limited to temporary or permanent removal from the program.

Photo & Video Policy

PARD and Dougherty Staff may take screenshots of students during the program. These images are for department use and may be included in newsletters, presentations, brochures, fliers, public service announcements, City of Austin websites, and other public media uses.

Staff will announce if they are going to take a screen shot or start recording the Zoom room before they do so. If you do not want your child to be captured in a screen shot or video/audio recording, it is your responsibility to prevent this by turning off the camera or microphone.

Videos

Classes occasionally view media related to topics of study. All books or media clips are previewed by Program Specialists to evaluate content and suitability for students.

Professional Program Staff

All instructors for youth programs are artists in their own right, have been screened, approved, and received the appropriate training before the start of the program. We will also continue training and professional development throughout the semester.

Required staff training includes: CPR/AED certification, first aid certification, curriculum development, lesson planning, the 40 Developmental Assets®, positive behavior intervention, social emotional learning, online teaching strategies, the City of Austin Parks and Recreation Department youth program policies, Dougherty Arts Center site policies, and emergency site/program procedures.

A minimum of two(2) DAC staff members will be stationed in each Zoom classroom every day.

Ethics

Because of a potential conflict of interest, our staff cannot be hired by a participant's parent/guardian for babysitting or private lessons. City of Austin employees may accept thank you gifts under \$50 which are not cash/gift cards nor intended to improperly influence our work.

I understand and agree:

- I retain full supervisory responsibility for any and all activities that happen as a part of this program.
- Program staff refers to adults who have been screened, approved and trained.

- I will not expect program staff to provide supervision for my child.
- I understand that participation in these events is at my and my child's own risk. While program staff take measures to manage any risk, there is still the risk that something unexpected may happen. If my child gets hurt while participating in any program activity or activity recommended by program staff, I will assume full responsibility.
- If my child is under 13 years of age, I will maintain and supervise any online accounts that they may participate in.
- If my child or I upload any photos or videos of my child, our family and/or their activities, I am giving permission for them to be used and shared publicly.
- I understand that two-way classes or group sessions that my child participates in will be closed and will only allow registered participants and approved staff to participate.
- For all two-way classes, like a zoom class, I will ensure that my child is appropriately dressed and that the computer and camera that they are using does not show inappropriate things in our home. If possible, we will have their back against (or camera facing) a blank or non-descript wall, a wall with their program drawings, use a nature zoom background, or blur the background. If program staff notice something on your child's video that staff determines is not appropriate, they will turn off your child's video until the issue is resolved.
- Appropriate behavior for participants is expected. Program staff will review appropriate and inappropriate behaviors with all participants. Bullying, including cyberbullying, during a session or outside of a session is not appropriate. Issues and consequences will be addressed with participant and parent and may include but are not limited to temporary or permanent removal from the program.
- My child may be in either a screenshot and/or video record. These records may be used by the Parks and Recreation
 Department for current or future advertisements. Before either a screenshot or a recording happens, I will be notified. If I
 do not wish for my child to be in the picture or the recording, I will immediately turn off my child's camera and mic.
 Leaving either of those two on is implied consent. The room will be told when the recording is stopped. It is solely my
 responsibility to take any necessary steps to prevent my child from being recorded.
- To follow and to ensure that my child follows the Parks and Recreation Electronic Communication Policy that states:
 - Any private (one to one) electronic communication between staff and youths, including the use of social networking websites like Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, instant messaging, texting, etc is prohibited.
 - o All communication between staff and youths must be transparent and public.
 - Example:
 - they may communicate on group sites where anyone who is a member can see the conversation
 - email communication is preferred to be between the parent and program staff/volunteer
 - email communication to the child will include at least two approved volunteers
 - They may communicate in private media set up for two-way classes and discussion groups. Such as a zoom class. These will be always facilitated by at least two approved adults with at least two children and one approved adult in each breakout room. The overall facilitators may join any breakout room at any time.
- It is my responsibility to provide any equipment needed for virtual programs, such as a computer, tablet, internet access, headset, earphones, microphone, digital camera, etc. I also understand that any damage to said equipment is the sole responsibility of the owner of said equipment. I will not hold the City of Austin responsible for any damage that may happen during the program.
