- 1. Do not expect grants to be your primary source of income
- 2. Grantors want to fund you!
- 3. Do your research be sure you are seeking the right grantor for your project
- 4. Don't create a program just to apply for funding
- 5. Contact the Grantor and ask questions

Most common reasons for a declined funding application

- Applicant did not meet the funding program eligibility
- Applicant did not complete the application correctly







Artist Funding Opportunity: Art in Public Places — LaunchPAD



- A program to match local professional artists with artists commissioned for AIPP projects with budgets over \$200,000. The purpose is to grow our local artists and provide an opportunity to gain technical and administrative public art experience.
- A professional visual artist already on the path of public art, ready to develop their skills in order to gain bigger commissions!
- LP artists support the commissioned artist in administrative and technical challenges. The expectation is for a symbiotic relationship!
- To grow your network; to meet high level artists and curators; to better understand what it takes to create lasting public art; to embrace your creative community!

Funding Requests: \$3,000

Quarterly Funding Cycle

Proposed event in July, August, September 2020

→ deadline is Monday, April 27th

Eligibility Requirements

Austin based w/ 1 year history

Arts event open to the public

1:2 (Half) match

Insurance

Priority 1 5 points each

- Ensures and encourages racial & social equity
- Sustains ethnic or historical heritage
- Engages community

Priority 2 3 points each

- Grows the cultural arts ecology
- Enhances accessibility & inclusion
- Deepens lifelong learning

Priority 3 1 point each

- Demonstrates financial resourcefulness
- Maintains affordability
- Compensates personnel
- Inspires cultural & artistic innovation
- · Cultivates leadership
- Fosters collaboration



Application Review: Peer Panel Process

Peer Panels are held for Core and CHFP, CI is staff reviewed

Panelists provide a numerical score (1-100) along with written comments to justify the score.

Panelist may include first hand experience as part of their review but not hearsay They are instructed not to consider geographical service area or financial need

Panels are open to the public and applicants may attend.

Applicants may provide clarification, or correct misinformation but they cannot add new information during the review

Olympic scoring method is used to determine the final score.



Frequent Peer Panelist Comments

Detail is key

Do not use jargon, acronyms, or flowery language - Keep it clear and easy to understand

Provide explanation for any major changes to budget, organization or project history

Double check for typos, calculation errors in the budget and that links to documentation work

The focus of the application should be on the activities you wish the funds to support

Consider including in-kind contributions in your budget – it shows community support

Back up claims with data and documentation

Describe efforts to reach out to tourists and the hotel/motel industry



Helpful Tips

Start early!!

Attend application workshops and open office hours

Ask questions

Be clear about what you want, why you want it and how you plan to achieve your stated goals

Attend the peer panel

If you don't receive funding contact us for feedback



Considering Fiscal Sponsorship...



What is Fiscal Sponsorship?

Fiscal sponsorship generally entails a nonprofit organization (the "fiscal sponsor") agreeing to provide administrative services and oversight to, and assume some or all of the legal and financial responsibility for, the activities of groups or individuals engaged in work that relates to the fiscal sponsor's mission.

Sponsorship Agreement Sponsored Project

- The individual or group the is under the fiscal umbrella of the 501 (c) organization



Benefits of Fiscal Sponsorship

Ability to offer a **tax deduction** to your donors

Ability to apply for grants

Ability to focus on developing programming vs. developing and maintaining administrative capacity

Technical Support

Access to insurance

No immediate need to become a 501(c)

How soon do you need to be sponsored?

What is the application process?

Do your missions align?

What are the fees?

What services does the sponsor provide?

How much oversite does the Fiscal Sponsor offer?

How is intellectual property handled?


