

This film follows a veteran reporter and his colleagues at ZETA, a Tijuana-based independent newsweekly, as they stubbornly ply their trade in one of the deadliest places in the world. In Mexico, more than 50 journalists have been slain or have vanished since December 2006, when President Felipe Calderon came to power and launched a government offensive against the country's powerful drug cartels and organized crime.
