2013 Youth Programming

Beginner Guitar/ Ages 8-12

Monday & Wednesdays / February 25 - April 10 (No class March 11 & 13)

Time: 4:30-5:30pm // Cost: \$65

In this 6 week session, led by Anthony Ortiz Jr, students will learn basic guitar playing skills, as well as an understanding of performing music. Participants will be introduced to the different genres of guitar such as Mariachi, Conjunto, Tejano, and more. Family members will be invited to enjoy the student's performance at the end of the session. No prior musical experience is required and class instrument is provided.

Minimum of 4 participants to make. Registration closes February 20th.

Intermediate Guitar/ Ages 8-12

Tuesdays & Thursdays / February 26 - April 11 (No class March 12&14)

Time: 4:30-5:30pm // Cost: \$65

In this 6 week session, led by Anthony Ortiz Jr, students will learn advance guitar playing skills, as well as an understanding of performing music. Participants will be introduced to the different techniques and exercises to become more technical guitar players. They will be able to apply all they have learn to Latino genres of guitar such as Mariachi, Conjunto, Tejano, and more. Beginner's guitar required and class instrument is provided.

2013 Youth Summer Camps

¡Mexico Lindo! Adventure Abroad!

Have your child embark on an imaginative journey that will take them through the interior of Mexico this summer! During each 2-week session students will focus on a specific region, enriched with native music, dance, arts, crafts, and traditions! Join us as we celebrate the marvelous and wonderful culture Mexico has to offer! ¡Ven a crear!

Session 1: Northern Mexico / June 17 - 28 / M-F 9AM-5PM / \$300

Northern Mexico is composed of Baja California Norte, Chihuahua, Nuevo León and Durango to name a few. Ranging across this region, students will learn about the Tarahumara Indians, Norteño music, Casas Grandes pottery, La Danza del Venado (Yaqui Indian deer dance) and much more!

Session 2: Eastern Mexico / July 1 – 12 (no class 6/4) / M-F 9AM-5PM / \$270

Enriched with the rich cultures and traditions of San Luis Potosi, Mexico City, Puebla and Veracruz, Eastern Mexico has an array of customs to share. Students will have the opportunity to learn about the Trees of Life made in Metepec, Talavera pottery from Puebla and the lovely dances of Veracruz!

Session 3: Southern Mexico / July 15 – 26 / M-F 9AM-5PM / \$300

Southern Mexico is best known for Chichen Itza and Alebrijes! Oaxaca, Chiapas and Yucatán are some of the province states that make up this vibrant region. Students will be introduced to the ancient and modern history of this area such as the Maya civilization, the mystical imaginative creatures known as Alebrijes and the regional dances of Chiapas heavily influenced by indigenous and Spanish roots!

Session 4: Western Mexico / July 29 – August 9 / M-F 9AM-5PM / \$300

With bold traditions and customs, Western Mexico is the home to many crafts! Offering an array of styles, the province state of Michoacán has a variety of pottery, wooden masks, and furniture. Huichol territory lies among the borders of province states Nayarit, Jalisco and Zacatecas. These indigenous peoples are known for their yarn paintings and seed bead art. Your student will have the chance to learn about all the wonderful cultures this region has to share!

Note: Teacher-to-student ratios are maintained at a minimum of 1:12. Students are grouped by age. Snacks are not provided by the program; please send an extra snack with your student.
