






305 South Congress Overview

Parks and Recreation Department and Endeavor Council Ordinance outlines the process for the public park space:

- 1. Engagement process and timeline
- 2. Community groups and stakeholders
- 3. Park prioritization and approval by Department
- 4. Fee in-lieu of Parkland Dedication









305 South Congress

The 18.9-acre 305 South Congress site will include:

- Over 7 acres of urban living with 3.5 million square feet of office, hotel, residential and retail space.
- Over 8 acres of dedicated parkland and public plaza space.
- Over 3.5 acres of public realm streets including protected bike lanes.
- 5 new ADA access points to the dedicated parkland.











305 South Congress Park Amenities

- Over 6.5 acres of new park and open spaces along the lake, accessible via Congress, Riverside, with an extension of Barton Springs Road.
- Expand existing bike and pedestrian pathways increasing connection points that will enhance the Ann and Roy Butler Hike-and-Bike Trail.
- Protect heritage trees and minimize disturbance of existing trail topography and tree canopy.
- Support the restoration of the shoreline area to a natural state with riparian and wetland vegetation.
















What is your gender?








What is your annual household income?








What is your age range?










Findings & Themes Pier



PIER CONSIDERATIONS



Findings & Themes Pier

- ADA Accessibility Make it wheelchair accessible; deaf-friendly design including signage
- Greenery / Landscaping / Trees Increase riparian plantings at base of pier; Keep free of invasives and poison ivy; address algae mats that form on lake and cling to pier
- Overlooks / Views / Bats Great for bat viewing;
 Help get people off trail who want to sightsee
- Safety Ensure it has barriers / railing; Clear signage to indicate safety risks; Not slippery, Reduce length because unsafe for boaters
- Seating Benches perhaps extend to accommodate more people on the pier

Are there major considerations missing?




- Shade Shade features to help with comfort; May interfere with bat viewing
- Structure / Design Concerns about concrete or metal; preference for sustainable, low-maintenance materials; Some suggestions to reduce length to increase safety for boaters; Questions regarding height of pier; Consider boat and standup paddle board storage
- Uses Accessible to canoe, kayaks and paddle boards;
 Concerns over keeping it accessible and not commercial (no rental or concessions); Create area for fishing
- Other Concern about where people would park to launch boats; Comments both supportive of and not supportive of pier








Findings & Themes Water Steps



WATER STEPS CONSIDERATIONS



Findings & Themes Water Steps

- ADA Accessibility Desire for meeting ADA provisions for this amenity and making steps usable by people of all abilities
- Greenery / Landscaping / Trees Thoughtful entryways so surrounding area not trampled; Keep free of invasive trees, shrubs and poison ivy; Ensure plantings don't inhibit viewing and overall experience
- Lighting Mixed views about lighting: desire for minimal / downlighting but also desire for sufficient lighting for safety
- Safety Minimize risk of drowning; Include safety signage; Concerns about conflicts with trail users; Concerns about dog access to water and interaction with blue algae

Are there major considerations missing?




- Structure / Design Like formalized water access to keep people from trampling sensitive areas; Ensure sufficient room between steps and trail to avoid conflicts with people with kayaks and paddle boards and trail users; Make wider to double as seating and step height that is kid-friendly; Low steps for kayak users
- Uses Anticipate users with kayaks, canoe, paddle boards, as well as place for seating and dogs to enter; Concerns over management of kayak traffic and trail conflicts, as well as commercialization








Findings & Themes Great Lawn



GREAT LAWN CONSIDERATIONS



Findings & Themes Great Lawn

- ADA Accessibility Create welcoming pathway that it's well lit, ADA compliant, comfortable so people can seamlessly move to the Great Lawn
- Amenities Provide amenities such as trash cans/composting, water stations, animal waste centers, restroom
- Greenery / Landscaping / Trees Include larger caliber trees; Consider more trees for shade and for privacy/enclosure from street traffic and noise; Create open space with native landscaping; Keep area and lawn maintained; Suggestion to consider artificial turf; Protect trees during construction
- Overlooks / Views / Bats Provide ample room for bat viewing; Perhaps sloped or stadium-style so people can see the bats well; Good people watching

Are there major considerations missing?




- Seating Seating areas that are safe so you can see surrounding areas; Benches; A few picnic tables; Perhaps tiered seating
- Shade Ensure the area has plenty of shade
- Structure / Design Like large open space; Away from bridge and back off trail; Large lawn of grass and addition of shade and seating around the edges
- Uses Suggestions for programming and activities (i.e. yoga on the lawn, music, farmers market, food truck);
 Questions / concerns about dogs; Create all abilities space that's dynamic and child-friendly








Findings & Themes Boardwalk



BOARDWALK CONSIDERATIONS



Findings & Themes Boardwalk

- ADA Accessibility Important to have good ramp access for wheelchair users
- Bicycle/Scooters Important to ensure sufficient space so bicycle and pedestrian modes can coexist; Some comments to restrict scooters or any wheeled vehicles (except wheelchair/strollers); No motorized vehicles
- Greenery / Landscaping / Trees Design so habitat behind boardwalk is protected so it can become thriving estuary; Clear enough line of sight so users know it is there
- Lighting Ensure it has adequate lighting

Are there major considerations missing?




- Overlooks / Views / Bats Excellent place to watch the bats
- Seating Include benches; Ensure sufficient seating
- Shade Provide shade; Similar shading pergola like section east of IH-35
- Structure / Design Sufficiently wide and long; Make similar to existing boardwalk; Mesh fencing and not slippery for safety
- Uses Like that it provides opportunity to users to get off of the trail; Don't allow people to shoot off fireworks from boardwalk








Findings & Themes Prairie Terraces



PRAIRIE TERRACES CONSIDERATIONS



Findings & Themes Prairie Terraces

- ADA Accessibility Include a wheelchair ramp
- Greenery / Landscaping / Trees Plant natives only and add more open space; Similar to Pease Park amphitheater
- Overlooks / Views / Bats Helps with stadium-style seating for bat viewing; Question regarding height to ensure visibility of bats from underneath

Are there major considerations missing?



- Seating Like additional seating; Terraced seating
- Shade Importance of shade; Concerns that it won't be used enough if not shaded
- Structure / Design Importance of open space
- Uses Concerns over use by unhoused population;
 Desire for programming for children would need to be safe; Perhaps use for small civic meetings








Findings & Themes Nature Play



NATURE PLAY CONSIDERATIONS



Findings & Themes Nature Play

- ADA Accessibility Want accessible for all ages and abilities
- Safety Concerns about safety; Potential need for fencing to keep children safe; Avoid interaction with trail users
- Seating Need for seating
- Shade Importance of shade

Are there major considerations missing?



- Structure / Design Could be "untraditional"; Suggest a natural aesthetic with limited impervious cover; Other ideas such as splash pad
- Uses Concerns over use as dog area, need to have distinction between children and pet areas; Could be nature learning area
- Water Fountains Have water fountains in this area


- 1. Enhance connections to and along the waterfront

Findings & Themes High Level Takeaways

- Make sure the ADA accessibility is prioritized so all individuals can enjoy
- Concerns over congestion on this area of the trail and conflicts between types of users
- Importance of bats; appreciation for new opportunities for bat viewing and for areas off trail for users to stop and enjoy
- Properly address ecological sensitivities (bats, erosion, pollution, native plantings, maintaining tree canopy, habitats)
- Mixed views about uses and concerns about concessions, such as kayak rental
- Programming of these spaces is key; ensure parkland is welcoming experience for all Austin residents, not just tenants
