Overall Park Planning Process guides Adopt-A-Park groups through visioning and creating an adopted Park Concept Plan *Estimated Value: \$100,000*

Awarded:

- Once a year to neighborhood, school or pocket parks only
- Spring Application date
- Grand Meadow Neighborhood
 Park is the 2022-2023 recipient

Process:

- Year-long process
- Form Park Design Committee
- Conduct Site Inventory and Analysis
- Community Outreach including three public meetings
- Primary Outcome: Adopted Park Concept Plan by City of Austin

September 26, 2023 - Community Meeting #3 Final draft plan presentation. open online survey for fin

Final draft plan presentation, open online survey for final comment and prioritization

October 2023 - APF to submit concept plan to COA PARD for official review and adoption Incorporate final comments from Survey #3 into final plan

Beginning of 2024 - Anticipated Concept Plan Approval






89% own a house or duplex:




80% live within $\frac{1}{2}$ mile of the park:



72% are between ages 25-44:








Survey Results - Dog Park

On a scale from 1 to 5, how interested are you in a dog park at Grand Meadow?



Survey Results - Parking Lot


On a scale from 1 to 5, how important is it to you to have designated parking at Grand Meadow Park?



Because of the added project cost and negative impact of the impervious cover, a parking lot will not be included in the final design. Ample street parking is available around the park.

Survey Results - Lighting


On a scale from 1 to 5, how important is it to you to have designated parking at Grand Meadow Park?

Dog Park

PARD requires a 300' from adjacent homes to the proposed dog park
