The Brentwood Water and Wastewater Renewal Project will begin construction in June 2020. The selected contractor is Santa Clara Construction. Construction is expected to take nearly 2 years to complete.

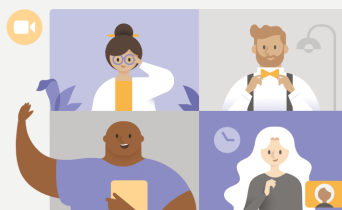

Notice regarding Austin Water construction projects

Austin Water construction projects support critical Water and/or Wastewater infrastructure for the health and safety of our community and therefore construction activities are allowed to proceed under current City of Austin restrictions. You can view the latest City of Austin orders at austintexas.gov/covid19.

The City of Austin Order includes Construction Requirements that apply to all active construction sites. These requirements include:

- Workers [must wear face coverings](#) and maintain a 6-foot physical distance.
- Sites with more than 10 active workers must stagger shifts.
- All sites must begin each workday with safety briefings that include reminders of all COVID-19 safety requirements and a check of personal protective equipment.
- Hand washing is required, and hand-washing stations and restroom facilities must be at least six feet apart.
- Worksites must provide single-use disposable paper towels and no-touch trash receptacles.
- The Site Manager must designate a COVID-19 Safety Monitor, who must be present at the site during all work activities.

In addition, contractors and city crews working on Austin Water construction projects continue to follow stringent installation, disinfection and testing procedures to safeguard our water pipelines. These procedures, including flushing water lines when necessary, are in place to ensure contamination does not enter a water line during construction activities. The health and safety of our customers remains our highest priority during this time.

Tap water provided by Austin Water is safe both for drinking and for washing away germs. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ([CDC](#)) says that “The COVID-19 virus has not been detected in drinking water. Conventional water treatment methods that use filtration and disinfection, such as those in most municipal drinking water systems, should remove or inactivate the virus that causes COVID-19.” The World Health Organization adds that the “presence of the COVID-19 virus has not been detected in drinking-water supplies and based on current evidence the risk to water supplies is low.
