PROJECT SPOTLIGHT FOOD ENVIRONMENT MAPPING

Our office led an extensive outreach effort focused on food insecurity in Austin-Travis County. This Food Environment Anaysis addresses four key barriers to accessing healthy food:

- » proximity to healthy food
- » household income
- » availability of healthy food
- » access to a vehicle

As part of this effort, the team surveyed over 900 food retail establishments to assess the healthiness of the food available. Food Environment maps for all 10 Austin City

Council districts will be released in early 2018.

ELECTRIFYING OUR FLEET

The City of Austin fleet comprises over 6,200 vehicles that include police cars, fire trucks, EMS vehicles, waste packers, and more. As such, vehicles represent the largest source of our municipal greenhouse gas emissions.

To help meet carbon neutrality goals, a Fleet Electrification Plan was created by our office, the Fleet Services Department, and Austin Energy. The plan includes transitioning 330 gas-powered vehicles to all-electric, and adding over 300 fleet electric charging stations.
