

Called meeting of City Council
Austin Tex. June 16th 1874.

His Honor J. B. Wheeler Mayor in the chair called the Council to order. Present: Aldermen - W^m Brueggerhoff, G. J. Boardman, J. Dohme, H. H. Metz, J. H. Robinson, A. Scholz and P. H. Todd.

Absent Ald. C. Bremond, Ed. Christian, and N. B. Mitchell.
His Hon J. B. Wheeler stated that city Marshall M. McLong had this day tendered his resignation and that the Council was called together to decide whether the resignation of M. McLong be accepted or not; whereupon the yeas and nays were called and the resignation accepted by the following vote: Yeas - Ald. Brueggerhoff, Boardman, Dohme, Metz, Robinson, Scholz, and Todd; Nays: none.

Ald. Robinson moved that the Mayor be and is hereby, authorized to order an election for a city Marshal, to be held on the 30th day of June 1874, at Geo. H. Hancock building and in the Mayor's Office, and to appoint the judges and clerks of said election. Carried.

Called meeting of City Council.
His Honor J. B. Wheeler Mayor in the chair called the Council to order. The roll being called the following named Aldermen, answered to their names: G. J. Boardman, W^m Brueggerhoff, J. Dohme, H. H. Metz, N. B. Mitchell, J. H. Robinson, A. Scholz and P. H. Todd.
Absent Aldermen C. Bremond, & Ed. Christian.
His Honor stated that the meeting was called to receive the report from the judges of election and install the elected Marshall. Whereupon motion the report from the judges of the election, held June 30, 1874, for City Marshal, was read received and approved.

On motion of Ald. Brueggerhoff Mr. Ed. Creary was duly declared City Marshall elect for the balance of the term of this administration.

Ald. Brueggerhoff introduced the following resolution. Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin that the Mayor is hereby authorized to issue bonds of the City of Austin to the amount of three thousand dollars, to Messrs. Forster, Ludlow & Co. the financial agents of the City of Austin, to complete the settlement with them in full, as agreed upon by the Finance Committee. Said bonds are for exchange of floating debt of the city; said ^{bonds} to be exchanged at same price as the bonds authorized to be sold by said financial agents, namely, seventy-five cents on the dollar.

On motion the rules were suspended the resolution read second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the resolution read the third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas Ald. Boardman, Brueggerhoff, Coburn, Kety, Mitchell, Robinson, Scholz & Todd. Nays: none.

On motion of Ald. Robinson, the report from Printing Committee on the bid of Cardwell & Walker for the printing of the new city Code, was received and approved.

On motion of Ald. Robinson, the report from Printing Committee on the bid of J. D. Elliott for the city printing, was received and approved.

On motion of Ald. Brueggerhoff the report from Street Committee on the bid of J. Sheehan for the building of a stone bridge over Waller Creek, on Cherry Street, was received & approved.

Ald. Brueggerhoff ^{moved} that the Police Committee be authorized to draw up an ordinance to regulate the salary of Policemen. Carried. Ald. Brueggerhoff moved, introduced the following resolution, to wit:

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, that the Mayor is hereby

authorized to draw upon his warrant such amount of Money from the city treasury as will pay off the police force and city officers, for the month of June 1874, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated. The resolution passed by the following vote: Yeas Ald. Boardman, Wm. Brueggerhoff, Dohme, Mett, Mitchell, Robinson, Scholz, & Todd. Nays: none. Mr. Ed. Greary was then installed as City Marshal. Ald. Boardman was excused from further attendance. An ordinance was introduced, N^o 47, to be entitled: "An ordinance providing for the appointment of public weighers and regulating the same." The ordinance was read. On motion the rules were suspended the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas Ald. Brueggerhoff, Dohme, Mett, Mitchell, Robinson, Scholz, and Todd. Nays: none. The following resolution was introduced, and unanimously passed, to wit: Be it resolved by the city Council of the city of Austin, That the city Attorney be and he is hereby, authorized and directed to revise, digest and prepare the various ordinances of a general nature for printing in book form. An ordinance was introduced N^o 48, to be entitled: "An ordinance relative to weights and measures." The ordinance was read. On motion the rules were suspended, the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were further suspended, the ordinance read the third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas: Ald. Brueggerhoff, Dohme, Mett, Mitchell, Robinson, Scholz, and Todd. An ordinance was introduced, N^o 49, to be entitled: "An ordinance providing for the registration of voters." The ordinance was read. On motion the rules were suspended, the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance

read the third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas: Ald. Brueggerhoff, Dohme, Metz, Mitchell, Robinson, Scholz, & Todd. Nays: none.

An ordinance was introduced No. 50. to be entitled: "An ordinance prescribing the rules of order of the City Council." The ordinance was read. On motion the rules were suspended the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read the third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas: Ald. Brueggerhoff, Dohme, Metz, Mitchell, Robinson, Scholz, and Todd. Nays: none.

An ordinance was introduced No. 51. to be entitled "An ordinance relative to vagrants." The ordinance was read. On motion the rules were suspended, the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read the third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas: Ald. Brueggerhoff, Dohme, Metz, Mitchell, Robinson, Scholz, and Todd. Nays: none.

An ordinance was introduced No. 52. to be entitled: "An ordinance adopting and announcing the Code of the city as ordered to be digested and printed and prescribing the manner in which the same may be amended or repealed, and repealing all ordinances in conflict therewith." The ordinance was read. On motion the rules were suspended the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read the third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas: Ald. Brueggerhoff, Dohme, Metz, Mitchell, Robinson, Scholz, and Todd. Nays: none.

On motion the Council adjourned to Monday 8 o'clock P. M.
