

Called meeting of City Council,  
Council Room Austin Tex.

June 8<sup>th</sup> 1874.

G. J. Brardman President presiding called the Council to order. The roll called, the following named Aldermen were present: Wm. Brueggerhoff, J. Dohme, <sup>Actg.</sup> Wm. B. Mitchell & Robinson & Todd.

Absent. Ald. Ed. Christian, C. Bremond & A. Scholz.  
Committee reported favorable on petition of Jules Randle about opening a branch office for Galveston Gift Enterprise. On motion the report was received and licensed ordered to be issued.

Petition of Charles Cooney asking for a license to open a barroom in Ward No. 1. was read and referred to Police Committee to report at next regular meeting.

Petition of Wm. Stelfox John S. Carrel and others, praying that the nuisance about Mrs. Huberichs dogs be abated, was read and referred back to petitioners to make complaint to the Mayor.

Dr. J. M. Litten's account for \$67<sup>00</sup> was read, and on motion referred to the Mayor.

Dr. J. M. Litten's account for ten dollars, was read and referred to the Mayor.

Petition of L. Silva, asking privilege to open Bar Room in Ward 1, was read and on motion referred to Police Committee to report at next regular meeting.

Ald. Brueggerhoff, on part of the fire Committee, reported progress on the purchase of furniture for the Central Depot fire Company No. 3. Also, about proposition of Mr. Erwin about the erection of a tank, and was allowed more time.

Ald. Dohme reported about securing a house for female prisoners, stating that he could get one at \$10<sup>00</sup> specie per month, but some repairs were necessary. On motion, the Committee were empowered to make all necessary arrangements and secure the house.

An ordinance No. 35. was introduced; to be entitled: "An Ordinance concerning Fire limits and fire regulations" The ordinance was read, On motion the rules were suspended the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read the third time - and

An ordinance was introduced <sup>and water</sup> No. 36, to be entitled: "An Ordinance regulating gas <sup>and water</sup> companies and the use of gas." The ordinance was read. On motion the rules were suspended the ordinance read the second time.

On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read the third time, and passed by the following vote: Yeas, Ald. G. J. Boardman, Wm. Brueggerhoff, J. Dohme, H. M. Metz, N. B. Mitchell, J. H. Robinson, and S. H. Todd. Nays: none.

An ordinance was introduced No. 37, to be entitled: "An Ordinance relative to Markets and Market privileges." The ordinance was read. On motion the rules were suspended, the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read the third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas Ald. G. J. Boardman, Wm. Brueggerhoff, J. Dohme, H. M. Metz, N. B. Mitchell, J. H. Robinson, and S. H. Todd. Nays: none.

An ordinance was introduced No. 38, to be entitled: "An Ordinance defining nuisances and prescribing the penalty." The ordinance was read. On motion the rules were suspended the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read the third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas Ald. G. J. Boardman, Wm. Brueggerhoff, J. Dohme, H. M. Metz, N. B. Mitchell, J. H. Robinson and S. H. Todd. Nays: none.

Austin Tex. June 12<sup>th</sup> 1874

City Council met pursuant to adjournment His Honor the Mayor in the chair called the Council to order. The <sup>(rolls)</sup> being called the following named Aldermen answered to their names. Ald. Ed. Christian, W<sup>m</sup> Brueggerhoff, J. Dohme & H. M. Metz, N. B. Mitchell, J. H. Robinson, S. H. Todd. Absent, Ald. C. Bremond, G. T. Boardman, & A. Scholz. Petition of Osola Archer, and others, praying for a foot bridge to be built by the city on West Pecan Street next to the stone bridge near Mr. C. S. Wiste residence, was read, and referred to Street Committee take such action as they might deem necessary.

On motion, the action of the Fire Committee in regard to having a floor put in the engine room of Central Depot Fire Company No. 3, was approved.

An estimate of the grading done by J. Limerick on Ash Street, near the new stone bridge in third Ward, was presented and referred to Street Committee.

On motion the petition of B. W. Darwin in regard to erecting a water tank near the Fitzhugh Hotel, was laid on the table.

Ald. Brueggerhoff moved that the Street Committee be authorized to advertise for proposals for the building of a bridge over Waller creek on Cherry Street. Carried.

Ald. L. Dohme moved that from and after the first day of July, 1874, no more salary be paid for a deputy marshal, nor to Mr. W<sup>m</sup> Henrichs. Carried.

An Ordinance No. 39, was introduced, to be entitled; "An Ordinance prescribing the manner of letting the city printing." The ordinance was read. On motion the rules were suspended the ordinance read second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas - Ald. Brueggerhoff, Ed. Christian, Dohme, Metz, Mitchell, Robinson, and Todd. Nays - none.

An ordinance No. 40, was introduced, to be entitled

entitled: "An Ordinance regulating the numbering of houses in this city." The ordinance was read. On motion the rules were suspended the ordinance read second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read the third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas - Ald. Brueggerhoff, Dohme, Christian, Metz, Mitchell, Robinson & Todd.

An ordinance No. 41, to be entitled: "An Ordinance defining the meaning of the term 'public places' was taken up and read. On motion the rules were suspended the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas - Ald. Brueggerhoff, Dohme, Christian, Metz, Mitchell, Robinson and Todd. Nays - none.

An ordinance No. 42, was introduced to be entitled: "An ordinance regulating shooting galleries and gunsmiths." The ordinance was read the first time. On motion the rules were suspended the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas - Ald. Brueggerhoff, Dohme, Christian, Metz, Mitchell Robinson, and Todd. Nays - none.

An ordinance No. 43, was introduced to be entitled: "An Ordinance relative to naming certain streets, etc." The ordinance was read the first time. On motion the rules were suspended the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read the third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas - Ald. Brueggerhoff, Dohme, Christian, Metz, Mitchell, Robinson and Todd. Nays - none.

An ordinance No. 44, was introduced to be entitled: "An Ordinance relative to taxes." The ordinance was read. On motion the rules were suspended the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were suspended, read the third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas - Ald. Brueggerhoff, Dohme, Christian, Metz, Mitchell Robinson and Todd. Nays - none.

An ordinance No. 45, was introduced to be

entitled: An ordinance defining Riots and unlawful assemblages, and fixing the punishment therefor. The ordinance was read. On motion the rules were suspended the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas - Ald. Brueggerhoff, Osborne, Christian, Mety, Mitchell, Robinson and Todd. Nays - none.

An Ordinance No. 46 was introduced, to be entitled: "An ordinance prescribing the manner how the printed ordinances of the new city code may be amended, or repealed." The ordinance was read the first time. On motion the rules were suspended the ordinance read the second time. On motion the rules were further suspended the ordinance read the third time and passed by the following vote: Yeas - Ald. Brueggerhoff, Osborne, Christian, Mety, Mitchell, Robinson and Todd. Nays - none.

Ald. Brueggerhoff moved that the Mayor appoint a committee of two, besides himself and City Attorney, to revise the new ordinances passed and make all necessary arrangements for the publishing of the same. Carried.

His Honor appointed on that committee Aldermen Robinson and Brueggerhoff.

Ald. Robinson asked permission on part of Police Committee, to make report on petitions of E. Cooney and L. Silva. Permission granted.

Whereupon Ald. Robinson moved that the petitions be granted on condition that petitioners fully comply with the requirements of the ordinances, and that they give bond of \$500.00 to keep an orderly house, to be approved by the Mayor. The yeas and nays being called resulting as follows:

Yeas - Ald. Christian, Osborne, Mety, Mitchell, Robinson and Todd.

Nay - Ald. Brueggerhoff.

On motion Council adjourned.
