Austin, Texas November 23<sup>rd</sup> 1872.

Council met pursuant to a call of His Honor  
Mayor F. B. Wheeler.

Present: His Honor F. B. Wheeler, Mayor.

The Roll being called the following  
Aldermen answered to their names:

Aldermen: E. Bremond, W. Brueggerhoff,  
E. Christian, J. W. Fleming,  
J. H. Robinson, A. Schaly,  
F. P. Sneed, & George Sushman.

Aldermen: E. Bremond, & F. P. Sneed, were  
then by his Honor the Mayor sworn into  
office.

It was then moved and seconded, that  
the Election of City Recorder, now be in order.

The Board proceeded to Ballot for City Rec-  
order, and at the 7<sup>th</sup> Ballot,  
F. Hertzing  
was elected City Recorder by an absolute ma-  
jority (5 votes.)

The Ballot for City Attorney, was then  
taken up, and at the 1<sup>st</sup> Ballot,  
Judge Gray,  
receiving 5 votes, was elected City Attorney.

At last the ballot for City Sexton was  
taken up, and on the second Ballot  
Alex. Eanes,  
receiving 5 votes, was declared City Sexton.

Alderman Brueggerhoff made the  
following Motion, which was duly seconded;  
That the appointment of the 5 police, as  
having been sworn in previous.

M. L. Langford. C. L. Metz. Alex. Dickerson  
All: Musgrove. & W. W. Fletcher  
be ratified by the Board.

The Motion was carried by an unanimous vote.

Petition of J. Mattison for the use of the City Hall for School purposes, was read and on Motion of Alderman Ineed, the petition was referred to Committee on Market House & Streets.

Petition of Weed & House for use of City Hall, for skating rink, was read and on Motion of W. Bueggerhoff, the Petition referred to Committee on Streets and Market House.

Petition of R. W. Ford for the position as City Engineer & Surveyor, was read and on Motion of W. Bueggerhoff, referred to Committee on Law & Ordinances.

Petition of G. W. Sampson asking the right for opening the Street, South of L. 12 and North of L. 11 in Divis E. as set forth in the petition, was read and

on Motion of Alderman J. L. Ineed the following Resolution was adopted:

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, that the right to open said Street, be granted to the petitioners.

The Resolution was adopted by an unanimous vote.

Petition of J. H. Robinson, asking Morrow, asking to be allowed 6 days instead of 4 days already allowed, for services as Clerk of Election, was read and on Motion of J. H. Robinson, referred to Finance Committee.

Alderman Ineed offered the following Resolution:

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, that the Committee on Finance be and they are hereby instructed, to

ascertain the public Debt of the City, and to recommend measures for the extinguishment of the same.

The Resolution was adopted by an unanimous Vote.

On Motion of Alderman W. Brueggerhoff the following Resolution was adopted:

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, that the Mayor and Marshal be instructed, to retain as many of the old Police, as they may think advisable, and to appoint

Henry Maddock  
as a Police in Ward No 1.
