

Called Meeting of the City Council

Austin Texas, October 18<sup>th</sup> 1875.

Present: Mayor J. B. Wheeler, in the chair; Aldermen — G. T. Boardman, Wm. Brueggerhoff, O. H. Cullen, F. Dohme, N. B. Mitchell and S. H. Todd.  
Absent: — Aldermen E. Bremond, Ed. Christian, J. H. Robinson, and S. Sijer.

The Mayor stated that the meeting was called to appoint the judges and clerks <sup>for</sup> holding the city election on the first Monday in November 1875, whereupon motion, the following named parties were appointed the judges, to wit:

Sixth Ward — W. N. Shanahan, J. M. Peacock and David O. Whiting.

Seventh Ward — Geo. Hancock, Dennis Corwin and L. Schoolhouse.

Eighth Ward — S. G. Haynie, P. L. Hopkins and A. C. Strong.

Ninth Ward — E. C. Bartholomew, J. H. Haughton and H. Melasky.

Tenth Ward — F. M. Noble, S. Billingsley and A. S. Roberts.

On motion of Alderman Cullen the Mayor was authorized to appoint other judges, in case any of the above named should fail to act, and that they shall be required to act as clerks and shall receive for their services the sum of \$200 each.

On motion of Alderman Brueggerhoff, the Mayor was authorized to have a street lamp erected between Mr. von Rosenberg's residence and Mrs. Schroeder's store.

On motion the Council adjourned.
