SUMMARY STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

The staff's recommendation is to grant LR-CO, Neighborhood Commercial-Conditional Overlay District, zoning. The conditional overlay would prohibit the Service Station use on the site.

ZONING & PLATTING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION:

4/06/10: Approved the staff's recommendation of LR-CO zoning, with additional conditions to prohibit Consumer Convenience Services, Off-Site Accessory Parking, Guidance Services, and 24-hour uses (6-0, S. Baldridge-No); D. Tiemann-1st, T. Rabago-2nd.

DEPARTMENT COMMENTS:

The property in question is a currently being used as a paving company (Construction Sales and Services use). The applicant maintains compacting equipment and has storage buildings on the site. There is a lot with what appears to be vehicle storage to the north and a religious assembly use to the west (Walnut Creek Baptist Church and cemetery). To the east, across North Lamar Boulevard, there is a multifamily use (On the Green Apartments). The lot to the south contains a used tire sales business (Automotive Repair). The applicant is requesting LR, Neighborhood Commercial District, zoning so that he can develop new commercial uses on the site.

The staff recommends LR-CO zoning for this property because it meets the intent of the Neighborhood Commercial district as the site is located adjacent to a religious assembly use and a multifamily residential use. In addition, low intensity commercial zoning is appropriate at this location because the property fronts onto and takes access from an arterial roadway, North Lamar Boulevard. The staff's recommendation in this case includes a prohibition for the Service Station use because the property backs up to existing floodplain, Walnut Creek, to the west. The applicant is currently operating a Construction Sales and Services use on the site. This use is not permitted in the LR zoning district that the applicant is requesting.

The applicant agrees with the Zoning and Platting Commission's recommendation.

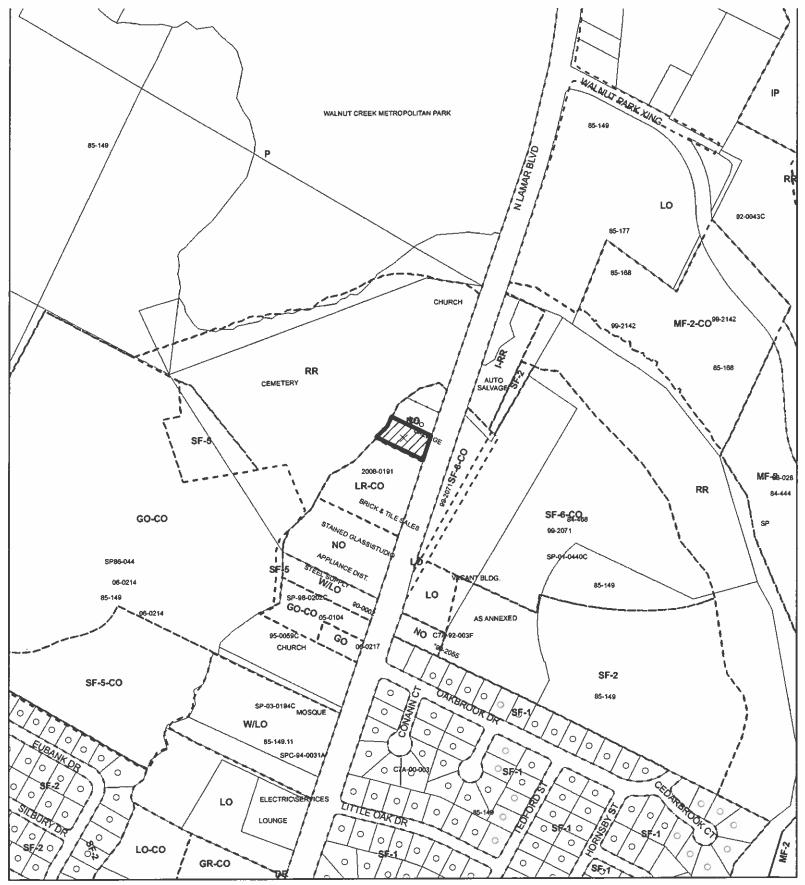

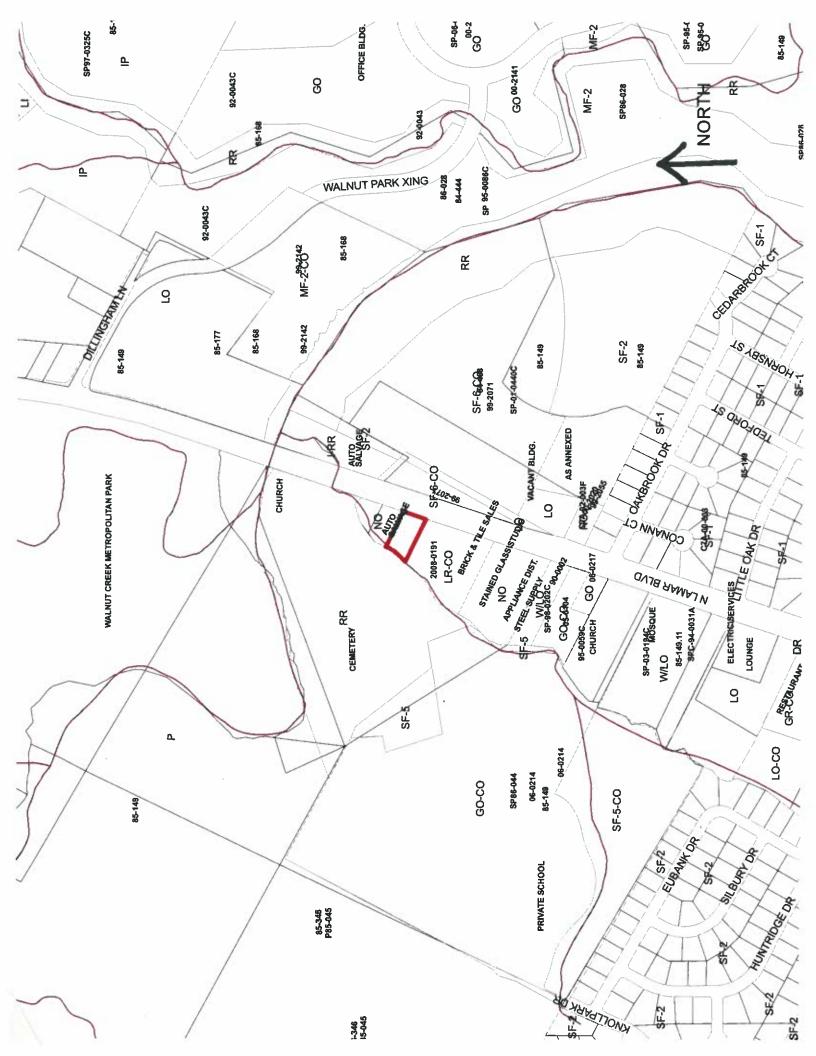

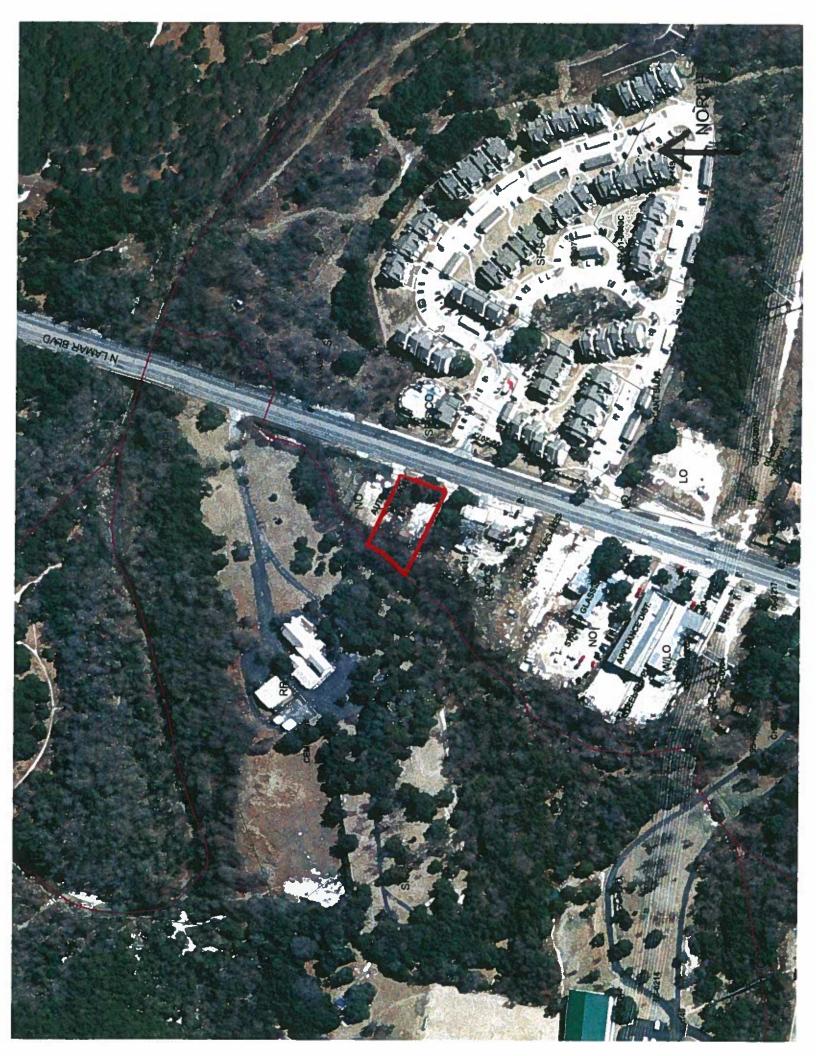

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The staff's recommendation is to grant LR-CO, Neighborhood Commercial-Conditional Overlay District, zoning. The conditional overlay would prohibit the Service Station use on the site.

BASIS FOR RECOMMENDATION (ZONING PRINCIPLES):

1. The proposed zoning should be consistent with the purpose statement of the district sought.

Neighborhood commercial (LR) district is the designation for a commercial use that provides business service and office facilities for the residents of a neighborhood. Site development regulations and performance standards applicable to a LR district use are designed to ensure that the use is compatible and complementary in scale and appearance with the residential environment.

2. Granting of the request should result in an equal treatment of similarly situated properties.

The property directly to the south of this site, which is similarly located with the religious assembly use to the west and the multifamily use to the east, was zoned LR-CO through zoning case C14-2008-0191 in November of 2008.

3. Zoning should allow for reasonable use of the property.

The proposed LR-CO zoning will allow the applicant to develop low intensity commercial and office uses on a property that fronts on and takes access to North Lamar Boulevard, an arterial roadway. LR-CO zoning at this location will permit the development of retail uses that will provide services to the multifamily residential use to the east.

EXISTING CONDITIONS

Site Characteristics

The site under consideration is a currently being used as a paving company (Construction Sales and Services use). The applicant maintains compacting equipment and has storage buildings on the site. The lot to the north appears to be used for vehicle storage. The property to the west has a religious assembly use with a cemetery (Walnut Creek Baptist Church and cemetery). To the east, across North Lamar Boulevard, there is a multifamily use (On the Green Apartments). The lot to the south contains as a used tire sales business (Automotive Repair use).

Environmental

The site is not located over the Edwards Aquifer Recharge Zone. The site is in the Desired Development Zone. The site is in the Walnut Creek Watershed of the Colorado River Basin, which is classified as a Suburban Watershed by Chapter 25-8 of the City's Land Development Code.

According to flood plain maps, there is a floodplain adjacent to the project boundary. Based upon the close proximity of flood plain, offsite drainage should be calculated to determine whether transition zone exists within the project location. If transition zone is found to exist within the project area, allowable impervious cover within said zone should be limited to 30%.

Standard landscaping and tree protection will be required in accordance with LDC 25-2 and 25-8 for all development and/or redevelopment.

Numerous trees will likely be impacted with a proposed development associated with this rezoning case. Please be aware that an approved rezoning status does not eliminate a proposed development's requirements to meet the intent of the tree ordinances. If further explanation or specificity is needed, please contact the City Arborist at 974-1876. At this time, site specific information is unavailable regarding other vegetation, areas of steep slope, or other environmental features such as bluffs, springs, canyon rimrock, caves, sinkholes, and wetlands.

Under current watershed regulations, development or redevelopment on this site will be subject to the following water quality control requirements:

Structural controls: Sedimentation and filtration basins with increased capture volume and 2 year detention.

At this time, no information has been provided as to whether this property has any pre-existing approvals that preempt current water quality or Code requirements.

Hill Country Roadway

The site is not within a Hill Country Roadway Corridor.

Impervious Cover

The maximum impervious cover allowed by the LR zoning district would be 80 %. However, because the watershed impervious cover is more restrictive than the zoning district's allowable impervious cover, the impervious cover is limited by the watershed regulations.

Under current watershed regulations, development or redevelopment on this site will be subject to the following impervious cover limits:

Note: The most restrictive impervious cover limit applies.

Site Plan/Compatibility Standards

The site is subject to compatibility standards. Along the west property line, the following standards apply:

- No structure may be built within 25 feet of the property line.
- No structure in excess of two stories or 30 feet in height may be constructed within 50 feet of the property line.
- No structure in excess of three stories or 40 feet in height may be constructed within 100 feet of the property line.
- No parking or driveways are allowed within 25 feet of the property line.

• In addition, a fence, berm, or dense vegetation must be provided to screen adjoining properties from views of parking, mechanical equipment, storage, and refuse collection. Additional design regulations will be enforced at the time a site plan is submitted.

Stormwater Detention

At the time a final subdivision plat, subdivision construction plans, or site plan is submitted, the developer must demonstrate that the proposed development will not result in additional identifiable flooding of other property. Any increase in stormwater runoff will be mitigated through on-site stormwater detention ponds, or participation in the City of Austin Regional Stormwater Management Program if available.

Transportation

No additional right-of-way is needed at this time.

A traffic impact analysis was not required for this case because the traffic generated by the proposed zoning does not exceed the threshold of 2,000 vehicle trips per day. [LDC, 25-6-113]

Water and Wastewater

The landowner intends to serve the site with City of Austin water and wastewater utilities. The landowner, at own expense, will be responsible for providing any water and wastewater utility improvements, offsite main extensions, utility relocations and or abandonments required by the land use. The water and wastewater utility plan must be reviewed and approved by the Austin Water Utility for compliance with City criteria. All water and wastewater construction must be inspected by the City of Austin. The landowner must pay the City inspection fee with the utility construction. The landowner must pay the tap and impact fee once the landowner makes an application for a City of Austin water and wastewater utility tap permit.

PUBLIC HEARING INFORMATION

This zoning/rezoning request will be reviewed and acted upon at two public hearings: before the Land Use Commission and the City Council. Although applicants and/or their agent(s) are expected to attend a public hearing, you are not required to attend. However, if you do attend, you have the opportunity to speak FOR or AGAINST the proposed development or change. You may also contact a neighborhood or environmental organization that has expressed an interest in an application affecting your neighborhood.

During its public hearing, the board or commission may postpone or continue an application's hearing to a later date, or may evaluate the City staff's recommendation and public input forwarding its own recommendation to the City Council. If the board or commission announces a specific date and time for a postponement or continuation that is not later than 60 days from the announcement, no further notice is required.

During its public hearing, the City Council may grant or deny a zoning request, or rezone the land to a less intensive zoning than requested but in no case will it grant a more intensive zoning.

However, in order to allow for mixed use development, the Council may add the MIXED USE (MU) COMBINING DISTRICT to certain commercial districts. The MU Combining District simply allows residential uses in addition to those uses already allowed in the seven commercial zoning districts. As a result, the MU Combining District allows the combination of office, retail, commercial, and residential uses within a single development.
