BASIS FOR RECOMMENDATION:

Architecture:

One-and-a-half story irregular-plan side-gabled frame Craftsman bungalow with a partial width front-gabled independent porch on paired plain square wood posts on cast-concrete-capped brick piers; The tympanae of the principal side gables as well as the porch contain false half timbering set in stucco. The offset entry consists of a single-leaf wood door with leaded glass glazing, with leaded glass sidelights and a leaded glass transom. Fenestration consists of single, paired, and triple 1:1 windows with

Craftsman styled screens which are vertically divided in the top "sash". The house is constructed out of long leaf pine, obtained from the Becker Lumber Company of Austin, which was run by Ernest Wilde's brother Paul.

Historical Associations:

Ernest R. and Irma R. Wilde, who married in 1915, purchased this property that year from Carl and Sophia Wendlandt, who lived next door at 1500 W. 9th Street, and who subdivided this section of their land. Ernest R. Wilde was from a prominent Austin German-American family; his father, Rudolph, who had been born in Germany in 1858, was a cabinet-maker. His mother, Agnes, was born in Germany in 1862. Both had immigrated to the United States in 1882. Their two sons, Paul and Ernest, three years younger, had both been born in Texas. In 1900, when the boys were 15 and 12, respectively, the family lived at 1700 Chicon Street. Rudolph and Agnes moved to 2002 University Avenue – the 1930 U.S. Census shows that he was then 70 years old and still worked as a cabinet-maker. According to family history, young Ernest worked with his father as a cabinet maker, and due to a number of customer inquiries about piano repairs and tuning, Rudolph sent Ernest to Polk's School of Piano Tuning in Valparaiso, Indiana to learn the trade. When Ernest returned to Austin around 1909, he went to work as a piano tuner for the J.R. Reed Music Company on Congress Avenue. J.R. Reed signed Ernest Wilde's passport application in 1911 so that he could accompany his mother on a trip to Germany. He listed J.R. Reed as his employer on his World War I draft registration card. Ernest Wilde worked as a piano tuner for J.R. Reed from around 1909 until his retirement in the 1960s. He was probably the most sought-after piano tuner in Austin during his long career. His son, Albert, also worked as a piano tuner for J.R. Reed from his return from World War II until the mid-1970s.

Ernest Wilde married Irma Reisner in 1915. Irma, also from a prominent German-American family in Austin, was the daughter of Theodor Reisner, the step-son of August Scholz, who founded the German Saengerrunde next to Scholz' Garten on San Jacinto Boulevard. Theodor Reisner was a bookbinder; the family lived at 307 E. 16th Street in 1900, and at 1601 San Jacinto in 1910. Irma, who was 17 at the time of the 1910 U.S. Census report, worked as a saleslady in a millinery shop. The Wildes had three children: Agnes, Walter, and Albert. Albert continued his father's trade as a piano tuner – he worked as a piano tuner for J.R. Reed for many years after his return from World War II. The Wilde family was very active in German-American affairs in Austin; both Ernest and Irma were very active in the Saengerrunde choirs for many years.

Ernest and Irma Wilde sold the house in 1971 to June E. Brooks and Alice M. Corcoran, who had the Three Geese Antique Store here until 1985, when Alice Corcoran passed away. The house changed hands several times before the current owners, Jeffrey and Mary Cris Crawford, purchased it in 1994.



The 1920 U.S. Census shows Ernest and Irma Wilde living at 1412 W. 9th Street with their two young children, Agnes and Walter. Ernest Wilde was then 32 years old, had been born in Texas to German-born parents, and is listed as a piano tuner. Irma Wilde was then 27, had been born in Texas to German-born parents, and had no occupation listed.


The 1930 U.S. Census shows that the Wilde family resided at 1412 W. 9th Street, a house they owned, and which was worth \$4,500. Ernest and Irma had another son, Albert, who was then 8 years old. Ernest Wilde was listed as a piano tuner.

F.3: HISTORICAL DOCUMENTATION - BIOGRAPHICAL DATA

Biographical Data for Owners of 1412 West Ninth Street

1. Ernest Rudolph and Irma Reisner Wilde built the house at 1412 West Ninth Street.

Ernest Wilde's parents were Rudolph and Agnes Wilde who resided at 2002 University Avenue in Austin. Both of them emigrated from Germany to Austin in 1882. Even thought they did not know each other before they moved here, they soon met and were married in 1883. Rudolph Wilde was a cabinetmaker who worked at Swann Furniture and Carpet Company. Ernest Wilde worked with his father in the cabinetmaking trade. They were often asked to repair pianos. Rudolph thought that Ernest should learn to tune pianos so they could provide this service for their customers. So he sent his son, Ernest to Polk's School of Piano Tuning in Valparaiso, Indiana to study piano tuning. A few years after he returned to Austin, Ernest went to work at J. R. Reed Music Company. He worked there from the time he was 19 until he retired at 73. For many years he was the most sought after piano tuner in Austin.

Irma Reisner Wilde's father was Theodor Reisner the step-son of August Scholtz who built and operated Scholtz's Garten. Theodor Reisner operated this bar and restaurant for two years following his step-father's death in 1911.

Ernest Rudolph and Irma Reisner Wilde married on October 6, 1915. They purchased Lot 12 from Carl Wendlandt who lived next door at 1500 West Ninth Street where they built this house. The Wilde's had three children, Agnes Emily Wilde Lehmann Buhl, born in 1917, Walter Ernest Wilde, born in 1919, and Albert Rudolph Wilde, born in 1921.

The Wilde's participated with other German Americans in many events at the Saegerrunde Hall located next to Scholtz's Garten. Ernest Wilde was a member of the Macnnerchor or men's choir at the Saegerrunde Hall for many years. When a Damenchor or women's choir was formed, Irma Wilde joined.

Mr. Wilde's brother, Paul A. Wilde worked at Calcasieu Lumber Company and later became the manager of Becker Lumber Company. Paul Wilde built a house at 1207 West Sixth Street, that still stands and is the present location of Texas Ceiling Fans. Becker Lumber Company was located at the north end of the Congress Avenue Bridge where the Radisson Hotel is now located.

F.9: HISTORICAL DOCUMENTATION - HISTORICAL NARRATIVE

Historical Narrative for 1412 West Ninth Street

The first house built in the immediate vicinity was located at 1500 West Ninth Street. The first construction at this location was probably in 1882 and was a two-room house with a front porch although there is some evidence that a small cabin was constructed there much earlier around 1855. In 1894 a two-story structure with brick front was added to the house with Victorian gingerbread on the large porch. Carl Wendlandt who lived in the house decided to subdivide his property which surrounded the house. So in 1911, he platted the Wendlandt's Subdivision.

Ernest Wilde purchased Lot 12 in the Wendlandt's Subdivision in March 1915 for \$1,200. The next spring he built a two bedroom bungalow at 1412 West Ninth Street. The construction cost \$3,000. The house is a classic arts and crafts style bungalow. It has large windows, a wide front porch, a fireplace in the living room and beveled glass in the front door and sidelights that surround the door. All the ceilings in the downstairs are ten feet high. The living room and dining room have exposed beams on the ceiling. There are short bookcases with leaded glass in the doors and columns above the bookcases that separate the living and dining rooms. The house was built with long leaf pine that came from Becker Lumber Company where Mr. Wilde's brother was the manager. A single car garage was also constructed. This garage was extended so two cars could use it and a shed was added to the rear of the garage at some unknown time. Also a wooden utility shed with a tin roof was constructed at the rear of the property that housed chickens for many years.

Mr. Wilde worked as a piano tuner at J. R. Reed Music Company in downtown Austin for 52 years. He and his bride moved into their new home and had three children, Agnes Emilie Wilde Lehmann Buhl, born in 1917, Walter Ernest Wilde, born in 1919, and Albert Rudolph Wilde, born in 1921. Since the house had only two bedrooms, they had a stairway built in the wide hallway and finished out the large attic to use as a third bedroom. They lived in this house for over 50 years and sold it to June E. Brooks and Alice M. Corcoran in 1971 when they moved to a nursing home in New Braunfels, Texas.

Ms. Brooks and Ms. Corcoran opened the Three Geese Antique Store in the house. It remained an antique store until around 1985 when Ms. Corcoran died. Ms. Brooks sold her remaining interest in the house to Ms. Corcoran's nieces and nephews who had inherited her estate. The house became a rental house until the Crawford family purchased the house in 1994.

The Crawford family did extensive remodeling to the house, even though they did not alter the classic craftsman bungalow look. The remodeling included adding a screen porch on the back of the house and extensive work on the upstairs including adding a second bathroom and another bedroom. The kitchen and back porch area were also updated. All of the major work was done on the back of the house so the look of the from of the house has not changed since it was originally constructed.

The house is a well-preserved example of a craftsman-style bungalow that is a contributing structure to the National Register Historic District. The house has a large front porch and wide eaves that are always associated with this style. The details of the wooden trim and leaded glass front door with matching sidelights and transom are also classic arts and crafts elements.

In the front yard of the house there is a magnificent live oak tree. This tree measures 100 inches in circumference at breast height. Mr. Jim Rhoades, the City Arborist, in a letter dated January 20, 1998, stated that this impressive tree is a Class I Protected sized tree under the city method of evaluating trees. This tree is at least 300 years old.

Justification for city historic landmark criteria:

A. ARCHITECTURE

This residence embodies the distinguishing characteristics of the Arts and Crafts Style (also known as the Craftsman Style). The house is well preserved and retains all the architectural features of this architectural style.

B. HISTORICAL ASSOCIATIONS


The Ernest Wilde Family that built this house and resided there for about fifty-five years. They were active members of the German-American community in Austin and participated in many events at the Saegerrunde Hall. Mr. Wilde was a well-known piano tuner at J.R. Reed Music Company where he worked for more than fifty years.

D. COMMUNITY VALUE

This property is a contributing property in the National Register Historic District.

E. LANDSCAPE FEATURE

The live oak tree that is located in the front yard is a Class I Protected sized tree under the city method of evaluating trees and is at least 300 years old.


