RECOMMENDATION FOR COUNCIL ACTION****Item No. 82**

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**Subject:** Authorize award, negotiation, and execution of Amendment No. 1 to a requirements service contract with ROPER ASSOCIATES LLC, Fair Oaks, CA, for programming and support of flood early warning control equipment, training, and services to add five 12-month extension options in estimated amounts not to exceed \$39,520 for the first extension option, \$41,101 for the second extension option, \$42,745 for the third extension option, \$44,455 for the fourth extension option, and \$46,233 for the fifth extension option, for a revised total estimated contract amount not to exceed \$252,054.

**Amount and Source of Funding:** Funding in the amount of \$39,520 is available in the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Capital Budget of the Watershed Protection Department. Funding for the remaining extension options is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

**MBE/WBE:** This contract will be awarded in compliance with Chapter 2-9C of the City Code (Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program). No subcontracting opportunities were identified; therefore, no goals were established for this solicitation.

**Prior Council Action:** A fiscal note is attached.

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This proposed contract amendment is to add five 12-month extension options to an existing 12-month sole source contract for support of the City's flood early warning system that expires in March, 2011 and is administered by the Watershed Protection Department (WPD).

This contract provides for programming services and support of the programmable logic controllers that control the rain and stream gauge network. The contract also provides for the support and upgrades to the software interface with the real-time gauge network. The software interface controls the gate arms over the low water crossings as well as the other gauges within the City's network. It also provides the interface with the City's Oracle database that in turn provides information to the National Weather Service and to the City's public internet site. Other specific services within this contract include annual on-site testing of the programmable logic controllers and software interface and training for WPD employees.
