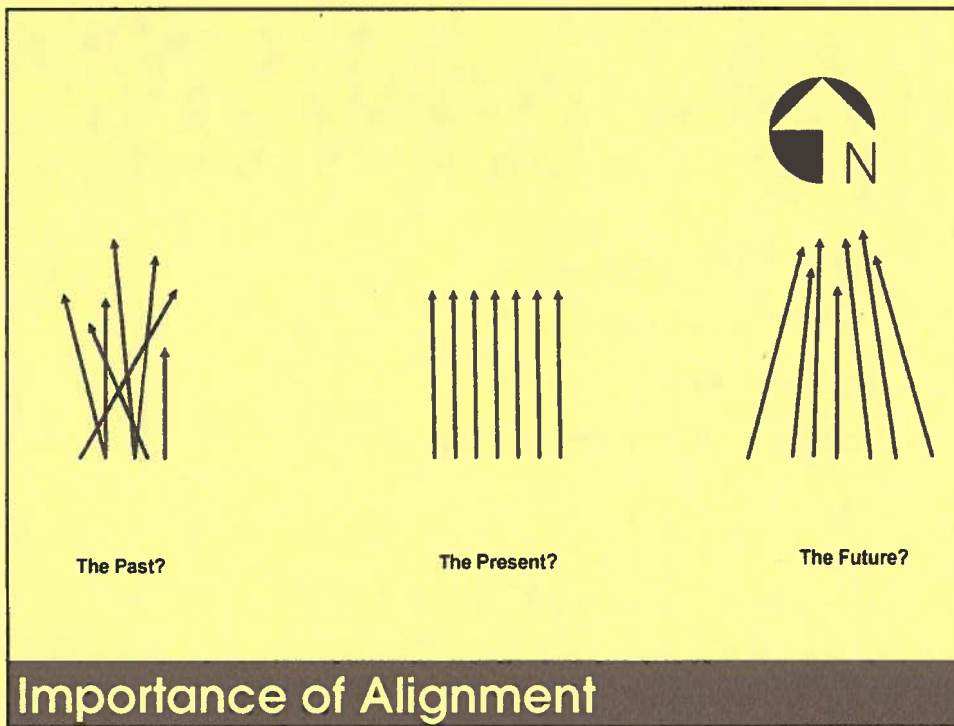
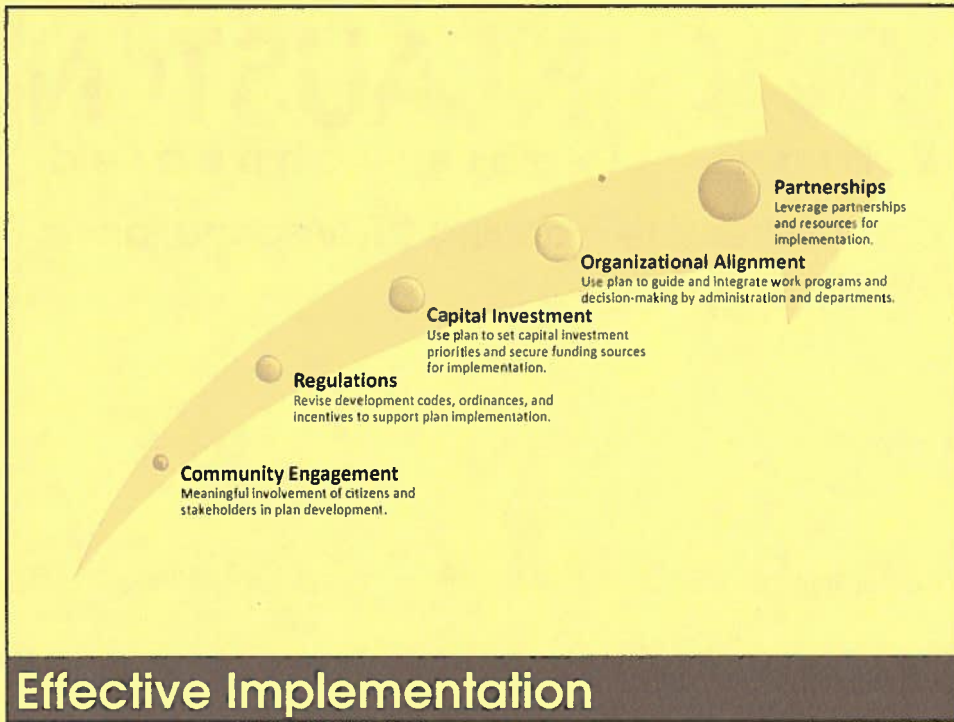

Moving Priority Programs Forward

Benefits:

- Provides a holistic, strategic, and comprehensive view of City's processes and investments.
- Forwards PRIDE values such as *Public Service* and *Engagement* by encouraging partnerships with one another and with our community, and *Innovation & Sustainability* by fostering good ideas that have a lasting, positive impact on our work, our community and our environment.
- Support City of Austin Core Competencies such as effective communication, leadership, decision-making, planning priorities, boundryless perspective, strategic thinking, and managing purpose and vision.

Executive Team

Members: City Manager, appropriate ACMs, and key Dept. Directors
Role: Coordinate partnerships and cultivate relationships, provide feedback and direction to Priority Program Coordination Team, prepare for annual Council updates.
Meeting Frequency: Quarterly (potentially as part of existing CMO meetings)

Priority Program Coordination Team

Members: CIP/A Implementation Steering Committee
Role: Coordinate priority program implementation efforts, provide direction/set expectations and reporting standards/metrics /deadlines for IA implementation applicable to all priority programs, and prepare for Executive Team updates
Meeting Frequency: Monthly and on ad-hoc basis, as needed. Team may need to create committees to address particular issues (e.g. Capital Infrastructure)

Priority Program Implementation Teams

Members of Each Priority Program Implementation Team: Asst. Directors/Program Managers (team leads), and appropriate implementation staff.
Role: Day to day implementation, coordination with other departments and entities as needed, and tracking and monitoring of priority programs
Meeting Frequency: Ongoing
