# Additional Backup Information

On February 17, 2005, City Council approved Resolution No. 050217-28 accepting a mission statement and approving a program for the Austin City Hall Artists Exhibition Program and the Cultural Arts Program Exhibition Series Guidelines for Austin City Hall.

The current guidelines authorize the Cultural Arts Program Exhibition Series to exhibit artworks on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> floors of City Hall. This proposed action authorizes guideline revisions to include expansion of the exhibition areas to the public plaza, mezzanine and parking garage, and outlines the artwork procurement policy.

The Austin City Hall Exhibition Series, also known as The People's Gallery, has exhibited almost 1,000 artists over the

past ten years and averages approximately 50% new artists exhibiting each year. The exhibition series provides opportunities for local artists to exhibit their works on City property and for citizens and tourists to experience Austin's arts and culture in the City's premiere public facility.
