The contract will provide community engagement and outreach services for the Colony Park Master Plan. The services to be provided under this contract include outreach management, meeting facilitation, public relations, marketing content development, and facilitation of discussions between the community, stakeholders and developers.

In 2009, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), U.S. Department of Transportation and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency partnered to develop the Community Challenge Planning Grant program. According to HUD, the grant program will foster reform and reduce barriers to achieving affordable, economically vital, and sustainable communities. In 2011, the City was awarded a three-year, \$3 million Community Challenge Grant for the Colony Park Sustainable Community Initiative Project. As a result of that grant, the Colony Park Master Plan was developed and adopted on December 11, 2014.
