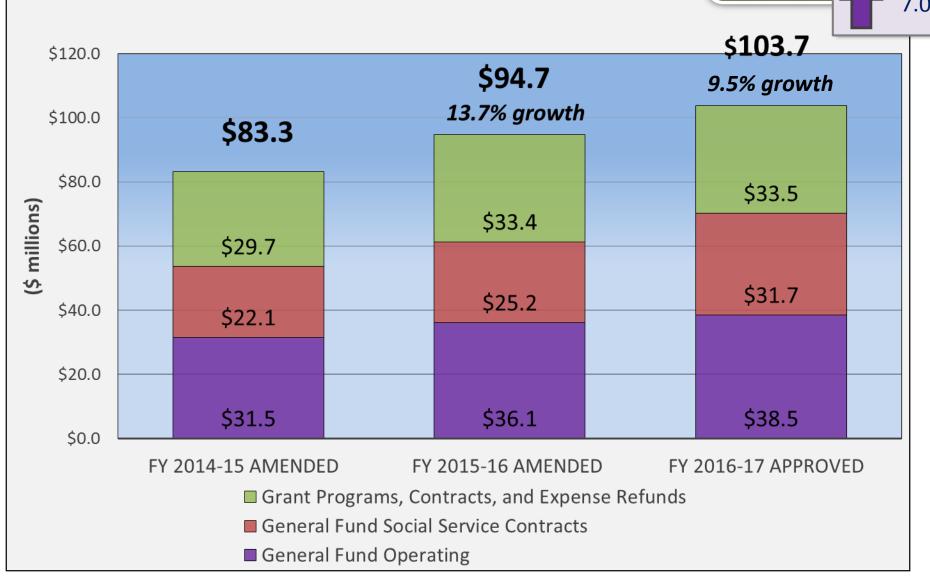

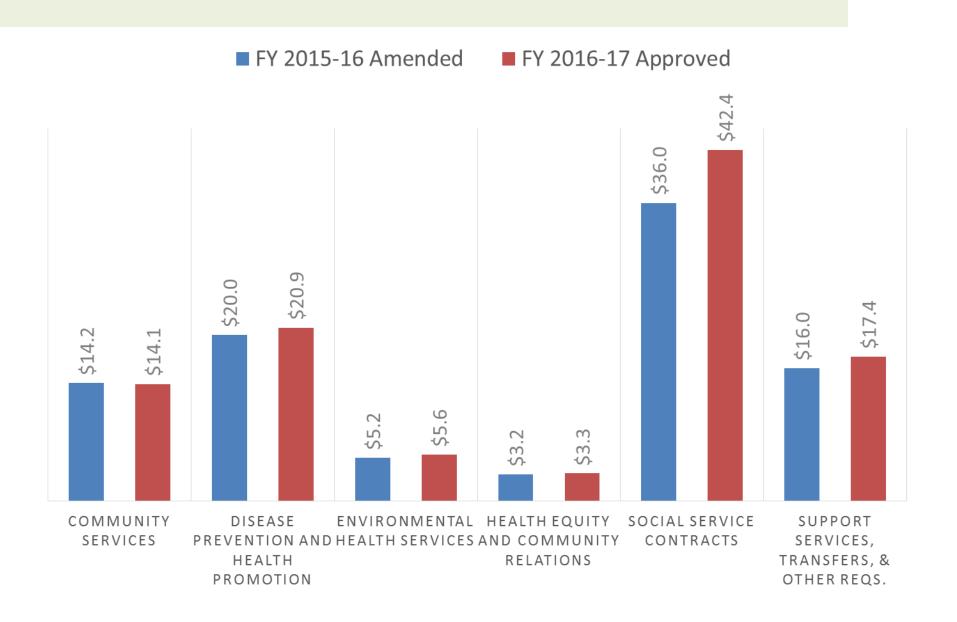
Budget comparison and position count

Council Resolutions

 Resolution No. 20141120-094 called for an additional \$1 million in funding for the FY 2016-17 Proposed Budget for social service contracts

Outcome: Fully funded in FY17

Council Resolutions

- Resolution No. 20160128-068 adopted a formal policy goal of additional funding within 2-4 years plus annual cost escalators
 - Investing \$12.0 million for social service contracts
 - Investing \$10.3 million for the Health and Human Services
 Department
 - Adding \$1.7 million for inflation and population growth

- Outcome: \$6.5 million added in FY17
 - \$5.5 million for social service contracts
 - \$1.0 million for HHSD
