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**Subject**

Approve an ordinance approving the proposed 2017 assessment roll for the Indian Hills Public Improvement District. Related to Items # 11 and # 59.

**Amount and Source of Funding**

The 2017 assessment, estimated to produce \$344,395.78, is based on each parcel owner's share of the district's assessable acres.

**Fiscal Note**

There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required.

**Prior Council Action:** June 18, 2009 – Council approved the Indian Hills Development Agreement. August 26, 2010 – Council approved an ordinance authorizing negotiation and execution of an amended and restated cost reimbursement agreement with Club Deal 116 Indian Hills, LP for construction of a 48 and 24 inch water main; for the design of a wastewater treatment plant; Approved a resolution authorizing creation of a Public Improvement District for the Indian Hills Area; Approved an ordinance annexing the Indian Hills Annexation Area for limited purposes of planning and zoning; Approved an ordinance adopting a regulatory plan for the Indian Hills annexation area. November 3, 2011 – Council approved initial Service and Assessment Plan and Assessment Roll. Council authorized the issuance of City of Austin, Texas Special Assessment Revenue Bonds, Senior Series 2011, in an amount not to exceed \$3,500,000 and authorized the issuance of City of Austin, Texas Special Assessment Revenue Bonds, Subordinate Series 2011, in an amount not to exceed \$3,000,000. November 20, 2014 - Council approved an ordinance accepting the 2015 assessment and approved the assessment roll. December 11, 2014 – Council approved an ordinance levying assessments for 2015. September 17, 2015 (#008) – Council approved an amendment to the Water Cost Reimbursement Agreement (CRA). November 19, 2015 (#25) – Council approved an ordinance setting the assessment and approving the 2016 assessment roll; (#26) – Council approved a resolution adopting the Indian Hills 2016 Service Plan. December 17, 2015 (#17) – Council approved an ordinance adopting the 2016 budget for Indian Hills; (#94) – Council approved an ordinance levying the 2016 assessments. September 14, 2016 (#001) – Council approved an ordinance adopting the Indian Hills 2017 Budget as part of the Fiscal Year 2016-2017 City of Austin Operating Budget (Volume 1, Page 707 of the Proposed Budget).

**Additional Backup Information**

Indian Hills is a mixed-use planned community located west of SH 130 and east of FM 973 in the City of Austin's Desired Development Zone. The planned development for the 240-acre Indian Hills property includes approximately 1,200 medium density apartment units and 1.5 million square feet of office, warehouse, distribution and neighborhood retail uses. The center portion of the site will be used for the extension of Decker Lake Road, the main thoroughfare.

The Public Improvement District (PID) provides the financing mechanism through the apportionment, levying and collection of assessments to support the issuance of debt for the basic infrastructure that will support the planned community (water, wastewater and roads).

On November 3, 2011, Special Assessment Revenue Bonds, Subordinate Series, in the amount of \$3,500,000 and Senior Series in the amount of \$3,000,000, were sold to finance the infrastructure improvements. Assessments will be used to make the debt service payments on the bonds, fund required reserves and cover administrative costs of administering the PID.
