Additional Backup Information

The Mechanical Plumbing and Solar Board denied an appeal on April 25, 2017, that the applicant be allowed to forgo connection to the public water system. As part of Plan Review Number 2017-015962, the building official, Carl Wren and Kevin Critendon, Austin Water Assistant Director, denied the customer's request to forgo connection to the water system based on Plumbing Code requirements. Austin Water, consistent with the Plumbing Code, requires customers within the jurisdiction to connect to the public water supply infrastructure.

The residential property is a vacant lot, annexed in 1985 into Austin's limited purpose jurisdiction. The applicant proposes that the property is self-sufficient with a functioning water well and plans to create a rainwater collection system and should not be required to connect to the City's public water infrastructure. The applicant requests an exception to forgo connecting to the public water system. City Code Section 25-12-153 (601.1.1) provides limited exceptions to forgo connecting to the public water system. Austin Water has determined that these limited exceptions do not apply in this case.
