The City Council Questions and Answers Report was derived from a need to provide City Council Members an opportunity to solicit darifying information from City Departments as it relates to requests for council action. After a City Council Regular Meeting agenda has been published, Council Members will have the opportunity to ask questions of departments via the City Manager's Agenda Office. This process continues until 5:00 p.m. the Tuesday before the Council meeting. The final report is distributed at noon to City Council the Wednesday before the council meeting.

## **QUESTIONS FROM COUNCIL**

Agenda Item #3: Authorize negotiation and execution of job order contracts with the following contractors: BROWN & ROOT INDUSTRIAL SERVICES, LLC; JAMAIL & SMITH CONSTRUCTION, LP; ALPHA BUILDING CORPORATION; and HENSEL PHELPS CONSTRUCTION CO., (staff recommendation), or one or more of the other qualified responders for RFP Solicitation No. CLMB328 for the 2017 Job Order Contract Program for an initial two year term with three additional one-year extension options for a total contract amount not to exceed \$27,000,000.

QUESTION: Is there a way to determine if there was any effort to abide by the Good Faith letter? COUNCIL MEMBER HOUSTON'S OFFICE

ANSWER: Alpha Builders did not meet the Native/Asian American goal that was set for the solicitation. When a firm does not meet the goal(s) established for a particular solicitation, the Small & Minority Business Resources (SMBR) Department reviews the supporting Good Faith Effort documentation that the firm submits to ensure compliance with the Minority-Owned Business Enterprise/Women-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE/WBE)Procurement Ordinance. In determining whether the firm has made Good Faith Efforts, SMBR will consider, at a minimum, the following efforts to do the following:

- 1) Did the firm solicit the certified MBEs and WBEs with a Significant Local Business Presence;
- 2) Did the firm provide interested MBEs and WBEs with information related to the solicitation or project;
- 3) Did the firm negotiate with any MBE or WBE firm who showed an interest in the project;
- 4) Did the firm select portions of the work to assist in identifying areas for potential MBE/WBE participation;
- 5) Did the firm publish a solicitation in a local publication;
- 6) Did the firm notify or contact local community organization; and
- 7) Did the firm contact SMBR for assistance.

In this particular case, although Alpha Builders did not meet the Native/Asian American goal, they were found compliant by meeting the Good Faith Effort requirements as outlined above. The Small & Minority Business Resources

Department reviewed their MBE/WBE Compliance Plan and supporting documentation and deemed them compliant with the MBE/WBE Procurement Ordinance. If Alpha Builders were to have been found to be non-compliant with the ordinance, they would not have been recommended to Council for award.

QUESTION: What was the total authorization, contract length, and annual expenditures under the previous contract? Can staff provide a sample of the projects under the previous contract? Why is the City doing construction work on leased buildings? COUNCIL MEMBER TROXCLAIR'S OFFICE

Agenda Item # 14: Authorize negotiation and execution of a design and commission agreement with Thoughtbarn LLC for artwork at Austin Fire Department/Austin-Travis County Emergency Medical Services Station # 47 Onion Creek project at 11112 Old San Antonio Road for a total contract amount not to exceed \$90,000. (District 5)

QUESTION: Were there other respondents to the request for qualifications? What will the art installation consist of? COUNCIL MEMBER HOUSTON'S OFFICE

ANSWER: 1) Yes, there was a total of 24 eligible respondents who submitted applications in response to the Request for Qualifications.

The outreach to professional visual artists included, but was not limited to, two Artist Information Meetings (at Cultural Arts Division Offices and at the University Hills Branch Library), announcements made at community meetings, including the African American Resource Advisory Commission, Dove Springs Recreation Center and Springdale-Airport Neighborhood Association. The call was posted to websites, including Glass Tire, Austin Chronicle, Austin Monthly, Culture Map Austin, Now Playing Austin, Texas Society of Sculptors, and community news websites within the seven-county area. The press release was sent to the CAD local and regional Media List, Event Listings database, and a cultural arts resource list, totaling over 350 news, arts, cultural, educational, entertainment, family and community-focused outlets. Facebook announcements were made to over 50 local arts organizations, publications, news outlets, chambers and educational institutions in the seven-countys.

2) The design phase of the project will define what the art installation will consist of. The Request for Qualifications states that the commissioned artist will design, fabricate, and install a permanent exterior artwork to be incorporated into the parking lot enclosure at the new Austin Fire Department/Austin-Travis County Emergency Medical Services Station #47. This artwork opportunity was defined in collaboration with project stakeholders and approved by the Art in Public Places Panel and the Arts Commission.

The design phase may result in an artwork that is mounted on, or incorporated

into, the planned parking lot enclosure, or it may replace some of the enclosure with an artwork, as long as the security of the enclosure is maintained. During the project design phase, the commissioned artist will create a conceptual approach and design for the artwork by working with community stakeholders, the project design team, Austin Fire Department staff and Austin-Travis County Emergency Medical Services staff. The concept for the artwork will be reviewed by the Art in Public Places Panel, then the artist will develop the design further into a final design. The final design will be approved by the Art in Public Places Panel and the Arts Commission before the artist may begin fabrication of the artwork.

Agenda Item # 15: Authorize execution of a service agreement compensating the City for providing fire services within Travis County Emergency Service District # 4.

QUESTION: Please provide the breakdown of line items that make up the AFD Cost to Provide Service including portions supporting overtime costs. COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

QUESTION: What are the taxable boundaries of the ESD 4 area? Can staff overlay those boundaries with the City of Austin boundaries? COUNCIL MEMBER TROXCLAIR'S OFFICE

Agenda Item # 16: Approve second and third reading of an ordinance relating to special events and high capacity event venues, repealing and replacing City Code Chapter 14-8 relating to right-of-way closures for special events and neighborhood block parties, amending requirements for temporary food establishments during a special event, repealing City Code Section 14-6-3 relating to closures for a street festivity, amending City Code Chapter 9-2 relating to 24-hour live music and multiday special event permits; creating offenses and establishing penalties.

QUESTION: The RCA States: "These changes include: removing the high capacity event venue requirements, incorporating specific sound equipment requirements (based on existing City Code), allowing legacy events to give notice of proposed special event dates for a five year period, changes to conform the ordinance to staff's practices; and other changes that are based on information learned since first reading." Please provide the information learned since the last reading and justification for each proposed change. COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

Agenda Item # 17: Authorize negotiation and execution of an interlocal agreement with the City of Round Rock, City of Pflugerville, Travis County, Williamson

County, Housing Authority of the City of Austin, Housing Authority of Travis County, Housing Authority of the City of Georgetown, Housing Authority of the City of Round Rock, Housing Authority of the City of Taylor, and the Housing Authority of the City of Granger related to conducting a regional assessment of fair housing.

QUESTION: Who determined this list of stakeholders and are any geographical partners missing? COUNCIL MEMBER FLANNIGAN'S OFFICE

ANSWER: NHCD staff reached out to all entitlement jurisdictions within the Austin-Round Rock Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) who receive funding from U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to invite them to participate in this Interlocal Agreement for a regional Assessment of Fair Housing. All interested entities are included. An Assessment of Fair Housing is required for all entitlement jurisdictions and HUD encourages them to be completed at a regional scale.

QUESTION: What does the draft interlocal agreement looks like for the Assessment of Fair Housing. Do you have a copy? COUNCIL MEMBER HOUSTON'S OFFICE

ANSWER: Discussions with potential parties to this agreement have only recently begun, and public dissemination of a preliminary draft agreement at this stage is premature. We do know that the terms of the agreement to be negotiated if the item is approved by Council are as follows:

- Conduct a regional assessment of fair housing that complies with federal requirements. It will identify barriers to fair housing choice and possible solutions to those barriers.
- Identify the regional parties to the agreement. To date the following potential parties include:
- o City of Austin
- o City of Pflugerville
- o City of Round Rock
- o Travis County
- o Williamson County
- o Austin Housing Authority
- o Georgetown Housing Authority
- o Granger Housing Authority
- o Round Rock Housing Authority
- o Taylor Housing Authority
- o Travis County Housing Authority
- Outline the obligations of the City of Austin to develop, procure, manage, and pay for the contract.
- Establish each party's percentage of cost participation and maximum cost
- Outline obligations of the regional parties regarding reimbursement, provision of technical assistance, and rights of access to records and consultant

material.

• Include timeline for accomplishing the purpose of the agreement.

Agenda Item # 24: Approve up to 20 days that Republic Square Park may be closed to the general public per fiscal year.

QUESTION: Can get a list of the events that are taking place throughout the 20 days requested for closure? COUNCI MEMBER RENTERIA'S OFFICE

ANSWER: There are no specific events scheduled for the 20 days the park would be closed. The Downtown Austin Alliance (DAA) is asking for the authority to reserve 20 days as part of their financial and programming plan. On page 21 of the DAA Management Plan, approved by the expansive management team, includes an overview of the type, scopes and kinds of all programming proposed for the park. As a reminder, the square is closed for construction until late summer or early fall.

QUESTION: This request is for 20 days per year (maximum) that the park would be closed to the public for private/ticketed events. 1) Please describe which scale events would be counted towards the 20 days per year maximum. 2) Does an event where less than 50% of the park is closed for private/ticketed use count towards the maximum? 3) Please provide any documents staff and stakeholders will use to define the types of events that will count towards the limit. COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

ANSWER: 1) The Downtown Austin Alliance, with Parks and Recreation Department's (PARD) consent, has adopted the Austin Parks & Recreation Department's definition for park closure—"no accessibility to the park; ticketed participation only." All ticketed events will count towards the 20 day limit. 2) No, it would not. Smaller rentable zones were designed to accommodate events with smaller capacities and minimal set-up/equipment. The intent is to utilize the zones as much as possible to avoid closing the park to the public. Smaller zoned events accommodate up to 180 people, considerably less than half the park. 3) The Downtown Austin Alliance has adopted the Austin Parks and Recreation Department's definition for park closure, which was developed by the Parkland Events Task Force—"no accessibility to the park; ticketed participation only." Currently the Downtown Austin Alliance is working to develop an event application. In this Development, the Downtown Austin Alliance is using Austin Parks and Recreation Department's current event application, as well as recommendations from park consultant Tim Marshall (ETM Associates), as guidance for developing the application. Once submitted, any application would be reviewed and qualified based on event set-up and design, anticipated attendance, and cost to the public. (Please see the attached document for more details.)

Agenda Item # 31: Authorize negotiation and execution of a 60-month contract with SCHNEIDER ELECTRIC SYSTEMS USA INC., to provide generator control system maintenance and support services, in an amount not to exceed

QUESTION: 1) What was the start date of the previous contract? 2) As the AE budget only has \$60,000 in its current budget for this contract, what is the reason for the 60 month length of this contract? 3) How much money per year during the 60 month contract will be set aside for this need in the AE budget? 4) Do we lose opportunities to use more up to date technologies by entering into this length of contract? 5) Do we lose opportunities to negotiate a better price by entering into this length of contract? Please explain. COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

ANSWER: 1) The previous contract began on 7/19/2012. 2) The \$60,000 referenced only represents the amount of funding required for the rest of fiscal year 2016/2017 (3-months @ \$20K per month). 3) The annual amount is \$240,000 (\$20K per month). 4) No. This keeps the existing control systems up to date over the next five years. Complete change-outs of control systems are relatively infrequent due the complexity and expense involved verses the process improvement gained. 5) This time frame provides cost certainty over a reasonable period after which AE can consider whether better control system alternatives exist.

Agenda Item # 33: Authorize negotiation and execution of six contracts with TEXAS ELECTRIC COOPERATIVES, POWER SUPPLY INC., TECHLINE INC., STUART C. IRBY, PRIESTER-MELL & NICHOLSON INC., and KBS ELECTRICAL DISTRIBUTORS, to provide critical electric utility materials and supplies, for a term of 60 months, in an amount not to exceed \$125,000,000, divided among the contractors.

QUESTION: What was the annual spend on the previous contract over the last 5 years? COUNCIL MEMBER TROXCLAIR'S OFFICE

ANSWER: The annual spend for the past five fiscal years are as follows:

QUESTION: What was the length of the previous contract(s)? What is the reason for the proposed 60 month term? COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

ANSWER: 1) The current contracts are for a total of nine years. 2) This contract is unique in that there are over 400 commodity lines that the contractors must stock, submit monthly pricing and deliver within 24 hours after an order is made with each individual contractor. A 60 month term is ideal for this type of contract as this fast moving material is critical to the utility

to ensure that material is available as needed for new jobs and repairs. A 60 month term also provides vendors continuity for a contract that requires them to carry inventory over that may not turn over in a shorter contract period.

Agenda Item # 34 and # 35: Authorize negotiation and execution of a 24-month contract with GCA SERVICES GROUP, INC., or one of the other qualified offerors to Request For Proposals JXP0504REBID, to provide janitorial services, in an estimated amount of \$1,635,932, with three 12-month extension options in an estimated amount of \$817,966 per extension option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$4,089,830. Authorize negotiation and execution of a 24-month contract with PRITCHARD INDUSTRIES SOUTHWEST, INC., or one of the other qualified offerors to Request For Proposals JXP0504REBID, to provide janitorial services, in an estimated amount of \$585,310, with three 12-month extension options in an estimated amount of \$292,655 per extension option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,463,275.

QUESTION: 1) Did any MBEs and WBEs respond to this solicitation? 2) Of the number of responders, how many of them were MBE and WBE? 3) Is the lack of participation by MBE and WBE contractors due to requirements, such as the sustainability requirement, that small businesses are unable to meet? COUNCIL MEMBER HOUSTON'S OFFICE

ANSWER: 1) No MBEs or WBEs responded to the solicitation. The solicitation was sent to 28 M/WBE firms. Four M/WBE firms subscribed to the solicitation. 2) Of the 498 bid announcements that were sent, 28 were to M/WBE firms. Of the 18 proposals received, none were from an M/WBE firm. 3) After the offers were opened, Purchasing contacted each of the M/WBE firms that subscribed to this solicitation to inquire why they didn't respond. None of the M/WBE firms contacted indicated concerns with the solicitation's sustainability requirements. Two firms indicated they were too small to respond to any of the solicitation's four packages. One firm indicated they intended to respond but could not assemble their proposal by the due date. No concerns were communicated to staff regarding the solicitation's requirements prior to the due date.

QUESTION: Do other contracts for janitorial services have City Code Chapter 2-9D opportunities? Please explain why these do not? COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

ANSWER: This solicitation was released under City Code Chapter 2-9C, Non Professional Services. The Small & Minority Business Resources (SMBR) Department reviewed the scope of services for this solicitation to determine if there were subcontracting opportunities. As part of this effort SMBR also reviewed the prior contract to see if subcontractors were used in the performance of the current contract. There are no subcontractors being used on the current contract and no subcontracting opportunities were identified for this solicitation. After a thorough review SMBR recommended the release of this solicitation with No Goals.

Agenda Item # 38: Authorize negotiation and execution of two contracts with ARBORHOLIC, LLC and TREEFOLKS, INC., to provide tree distribution and education programs, with a 12-month initial term, in an estimated amount of \$400,000, with four 12-month extension options in an estimated amount of \$400,000 per extension option, for total contract amounts not to exceed \$2,000,000, divided between the contractors.

QUESTION: 1) What is the distribution pattern? 2) Where are the plants maintained until they are distributed? 3) How does this relate to the Austin Energy Program to ensure adequate canopy coverage is occurring with the trees? 4) Who are the Urban Forest Stewards? How are they hired? Is there a process to ensure diversity in the hiring process? COUNCIL MEMBER HOUSTON'S OFFICE

#### ANSWER:

- 1) The NeighborWoods Tree Distribution & Education program distributes free trees during the Central Texas planting season (October 1st to March 31st) to Austin area residents by two main methods: tree give-away events held throughout Austin and tree delivery directly to a recipients' location when ordered by phone or online. The event locations will be established each year with a goal to distribute over 4,500 trees per year. The Ready, Set, Plant! program will coordinate event locations to plant tree saplings with the City and Keep Austin Beautiful Adopt-a-Creek. At least 10 events will be scheduled per year using volunteers to help plant the tree saplings.
- 2) Trees and saplings will be maintained at the recommended contractor's facility, which is equipped to properly irrigate and care for the trees.
- 3) Austin Energy funds the NeighborWoods Tree Distribution & Education program. The tree species distributed include large shade trees, small ornamental trees, and fruit and nut trees suited for the Central Texas region.
- 4) Urban Forest Steward program is an educational program open to all interested Austin residents that want to learn about arboriculture and urban forestry. Graduates of the program become "Urban Forest Stewards" and are encouraged to volunteer their time and expertise to enhance Austin's urban forest.

Agenda Item # 40: Authorize award and execution of a 24-month contract with LEIF JOHNSON FORD, to provide parts and repair services for Ford vehicles, in an estimated amount of \$4,800,000, with three 12-month extension options in an estimated amount of \$2,400,000 per extension option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$12,000,000.

QUETSION: What repair services are we contracting for that we don't already offer in fleet services? COUNCIL MEMBER FLANNIGAN'S OFFICE

ANSWER: Fleet staff are capable of performing all repair services but must rely on contractors to supplement the repair services not performed in-house. Each Service Center Manager uses their discretion based on workload, resource

availability, and facilities to determine what repairs will be done in-house or by contract. Common examples of work done by contractors include repair of major system components such as engines and transmissions.

QUESTION: Is this the first contract that this vendor has received? COUNCIL MEMBER HOUSTON'S OFFICE

ANSWER: This is not the first contract the City has had with Leif Johnson Ford, they are the current provider for these goods and services.

QUESTION: What was the annual spend for these services under the 5 existing contracts over the last 5 years? COUNCIL MEMBER TROXCLAIR'S OFFICE

ANSWER: See attachment.

QUESTION: How many Ford vehicles does the City currently have in its fleet? COUNCIL MEMBER GARZA'S OFFICE

ANSWER: The City currently has approximately 2,500 Ford vehicles in its Fleet.

Agenda Item # 43: Authorize negotiation and execution of a 35-month contract through National Intergovernmental Purchasing Alliance Company cooperative purchasing program with AUTOZONE PARTS, INC., to provide automotive batteries and repair parts, in an estimated amount of \$1,743,000, with two 12-month extension options in an estimated amount of \$581,000 per extension option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$2,905,000. Related to Item # 42.

QUESTION: What was the annual spend for the life of the previous contract? COUNCIL MEMBER TROXCLAIR'S OFFICE

ANSWER: See attachment.

Agenda Item # 44: Authorize negotiation and execution of a 60-month contract with AIR CLE ANING TECHNOLOGIES INC., to provide diesel exhaust removal systems, preventative maintenance, and inspection services, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$350,000.

QUESTION: Being that AFD only has \$17,500 in its current budget for this contract, what is the reason for the 60 month term of this contract? What is being included in the base budget for 2018 for this service? How long was the previous contract for these services and what was the annual spend for those contracts? COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

Agenda Item # 45: Authorize negotiation and execution of a 34-month contract through the Local Government Cooperative, administered by Texas Association of

School Boards, Inc. (BuyBoard) cooperative purchasing program with DOOLEY TACKABERRY INC., to provide bunker gear, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,650,000.

QUESTION: 1 )Can an itemized list of what is considered to be bunker gear be provided to council including associated costs? 2) What gear or equipment are fire fighters/ems employees required to purchase on their own? 3) The last line of the Request for Council Action(RCA) states the following: "Delay in approving or failure to approve this contract will result in first responders not having appropriate gear for rescue operations". How does a contract that provides life-saving equipment for EMS and Fire Fighters lapse? COUNCIL MEMBER HOUSTON'S OFFICE

ANSWER: See attachment.

Agenda Item # 50: Authorize negotiation and execution of a 12-month contract with DROPCOUNTR, INC, or one of the other qualified offerors to Request For Proposals GAZ0100, to provide a customizable residential water efficiency, customer engagement and water consumption reporting software program, in an estimated amount of \$157,500, with four 12-month extension options in the estimated amount of \$157,500 per extension option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$787,500.

QUESTION: Will this extension of the pilot program include all customers or is it a smaller population of targeted customers? COUNCIL MEMBER TROXCLAIR'S OFFICE

ANSWER: The new contract is for a new expanded program, and not an extension of the pilot program. Under the new contract, services will be made available to all Austin Water residential customers.

Agenda Item #53: Authorize negotiation and execution of an amendment to the professional services agreement with URBAN DESIGN GROUP PC, to provide planning services for the Colony Park Sustainable Community Initiative and the Colony Loop Drive Corridor Mobility Project in an amount not to exceed amount of \$605,000, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$648,729.38. (District 1)

QUESTION: Why is this contract being funded by both ATD and the Economic Development Department? What is the planned annual spend for the for the Colony Park Sustainable Community Initiative and the Colony Loop Drive Corridor Mobility Project for the 2017-2018 Fiscal year? What is the annual spend planned for the 2017-2018 fiscal year on master plans housed at Economic Development and ATD? Please provide details. COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

ANSWER: 1) This project was placed by Council into the 2016 Mobility Bond and approved by voters. ATD is the fund manager for the 2016 Mobility Bond and therefore shown as funding the preliminary engineering study related to the

project. The Corridor Program Office is managing the project in conjunction with ATD. Additional information can be found in the memo provided by Capital Contracting Office. 2) EDD's planned spending for this Council item with Urban Design Group in the additional amount of \$105,000 will consist of approximately \$30,000 in FY 2017 and \$45,000 in FY18 and \$30,000 in FY 2019. EDD also estimates additional Colony Park Sustainable Community Initiative related expenditures of \$150,000 in FY 2018 for outreach activities, and legal and financial services associated with the master developer solicitation process. Based on our estimates, the planned spend for the 2016 Bond PER project is \$50k in FY17, \$350k in FY18, \$100 in FY19. 3) Per the FY2017 Five Year CIP Plan, the only EDD projected 2017-2018 expenditures for existing master plans, other than the Colony Park Master Plan, are \$961,000 for capital expenditures related to the Seaholm EcoDistrict.

Agenda Item # 54: Authorize negotiation and execution of a professional services agreement with TOOLE DESIGN GROUP, LLC, (staff recommendation) or one of the other qualified responders for Request for Qualifications Solicitation No. CLMP226 to provide planning and engineering services for the Austin Safe Routes to School Infrastructure Plan for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,000,000.

QUESTION: After the spend of this \$1,000,000 how much money is left per school for projects? How many schools are to receive projects (estimate ok)? Is there any opportunity to combine contracts with other planning efforts in the 2016 bond and reach any efficiency, leaving more money for projects versus consulting/planning? Please provide details of any effort to look into this possibility and why contracting in this way was chosen instead. COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

ANSWER: 1) Safe Routes to School received \$27.5 million to be allocated evenly among all 10 council districts. That means that each council district would receive \$2.75 million, with the hiring of the consultant there would be \$2.65 million to spend within each council district. The amount allocated per school depends on the number of schools in each council district, which ranges from 7-15, and the specific needs of each school. 2) Safe Routes to School is estimating that over 100 schools will receive some type of infrastructure safety improvements. These improvements may include: New or Rehab Sidewalk construction, Curb Ramps, Bike Lanes, Cross Walks, Pedestrian Islands, Signals and other safety improvements. 3) The current program is focused and staffed for education, engagement, and providing crossing guards to help our children safely commute to and from school. With the 2016 Bond, the role of the program has expanded to include infrastructure improvements. Safe Routes to School Program is coordinating with the Sidewalk Program and the Austin Transportation Department to make sure that all processes and improvements are streamlined and as efficient as possible. To aid in this effort we have created the Local Mobility Steering Committee that is made up of project leads from Public Works and The Austin Transportation Department. However, it is important to note that Austin is one of the few municipalities in the Country that has infrastructure improvements included in their Safe Routes

to School Program. For this reason, an experienced consultant was needed to create a Safe Routes to School Implementation Plan. This implementation plan will identify all Safe Route to School needs and then will prioritize those needs over the whole network and by districts. As part of this effort, the consultant and staff will be coordinating with all stakeholders, to include each Council Office, to incorporate their input.

Agenda Item # 56: Approve an ordinance amending City Code Section 12-3-5(B) to extend metered parking hours on Wednesday nights.

QUESTION: Do we know if there is an impact to industry workers of hospitality, service and musicians who work downtown and pay for their own parking? COUNCIL MEMBER HOUSTON'S OFFICE

ANSWER: On-street parking is intended for customers rather than for employee parking, however, we believe that adding Wednesday nights will be of minimal impact, due to Austin Transportation Department's (ATD) affordable parking program in place, that currently provides parking in the downtown area to hospitality and service industry workers, with a greatly reduced monthly charge. The monthly reduced parking charge is \$35, at a facility located in the 9th Street and Red River area, which is significantly lower than what the typical downtown garage operators charge. The garage can accommodate up to 200 vehicles. Additionally, we are also working on providing a second location for this program. ATD will be sending out a reminder to the various stakeholder groups about the program and its availability.

QUESTION: As extending parking meters to Wednesday could impact musicians and service workers, please describe the progress that the Department of Transportation has been made in regards to the parking considerations for these and other similar constituencies. MAYOR PRO TEM TOVO'S OFFICE

ANSWER: On-street parking is intended for customers rather than for employee parking, however, we believe that adding Wednesday nights will be of minimal impact, due to Austin Transportation Department's (ATD) affordable parking program in place, that currently provides parking in the downtown area to hospitality and service industry workers, with a greatly reduced monthly charge. The monthly reduced parking charge is \$35, at a facility located in the 9th Street and Red River area, which is significantly lower than what the typical downtown garage operators charge. The garage can accommodate up to 200 vehicles. Additionally, we are also working on providing a second location for this program. ATD will be sending out a reminder to the various stakeholder groups about the program and its availability.

QUESTION: Specifically what programs will this revenue support? COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

ANSWER: The revenue from Wednesday nights will be used to fund parking

enforcement and pedestrian initiatives that are supportive of the pedestrian environment and contribute to traffic congestion reduction such as sidewalk improvements, wayfinding signage, sidewalk power washing, and enhanced parking initiatives.

## Agenda Item # 57-59: Speed limit changes

QUESTION: What process is followed to request an engineering study to review merit for an updated speed limit? Is there an ongoing list of projects to review speed limits? What is the criteria for a speed limit change? COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

ANSWER: 1) The Austin Transportation Department (ATD) receives speed limit requests regularly from citizens via 311. ATD staff reviews each request and determines if an engineering study is warranted. If the request is on a neighborhood street with a posted speed limit of 25 or 30 mph, a speed study is often completed as part of a Local Area Traffic Management (LATM) application to determine if the street is eligible for traffic calming. On collectors and arterial streets, ATD staff considers a number of factors in determining the need for an engineering study such as changes in traffic volumes or patterns, pedestrian and bicycle activity, new development and access points, and crash history.

- 2) No, however, as per a recommendation in the Vision Zero Action Plan, ATD staff will systematically evaluate arterial speed limits citywide for appropriateness. Currently both the design speeds and posted speed limits on streets in Austin vary to some degree. The Austin Strategic Mobility Plan (ASMP), led by the Systems Development Division of ATD, will include an update to the Austin Metropolitan Area Transportation Plan (AMATP) roadway table by evaluating functional classification, context, and mode specific plans which are primary factors that influence target design speed. This will form a basis for future evaluation of arterial speed limits for appropriateness citywide. The ASMP is underway, with the Roadway Table being developed in the fall of 2017. Plan adoption is planned in Spring 2018.
- 3) Per current practice, the City of Austin follows the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) "Procedures for Establishing Speed Zones" when determining appropriate speed limits on City streets. Per "Procedures for Establishing Speed Zones," the posted speed limit should be selected to the nearest value ending in 0 or 5 and within 5 mph of the 85th-percentile speed. Variations greater than 5 mph from the 85th-perentile speed are allowed after engineering judgment determines them appropriate considering the following factors:
- o Horizontal and vertical roadway curvature
- O Driveway visibility and density
- o Crash history with speeding as a contributing factor
- o Rural or developed areas adjacent to the street
- Presence of shoulders and curbs

While we follow the guidelines noted above, ATD is currently developing best

practices related to speed limit changes on City streets.

Agenda Item # 62: Approve a resolution establishing a 2018 Charter Review Commission to align the City Charter with changes to municipal ordinances and to make recommendations on improving other functions of city government.

QUESTION:1) Has this topic in the resolution: "City boards and commissions, including terms of Planning Commission members;" already been treated by the Board and Commissions Transition Taskforce? 2) What were their findings and what is left for this commission to explore? 3) Has this type of commission existed in the past for the City? If so, please provide a copy of their work products. 4) Please provide context for the establishment of this commission at this juncture. COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

ANSWER: See attachment.

Agenda Item # 72: Approve a resolution directing the City Manager to identify funding for childcare services for participants in the Passages Program.

QUESTION: What is the funding amount per child? COUNCIL MEMBER HOUSTON'S OFFICE

ANSWER: The funding amount per child varies, depending upon whether daily child care is part-time (less than 6 hours/day x 4 days/week) or full-time (minimum of 6 hours/day x 4 days/week) and the length of time child care is needed while a parent in the program searches for employment. This short-term "gap funding" for families experiencing homelessness typically lasts up to 2 months. The budget of \$160,000 is projected to serve 73 clients, at an average cost per child of \$2,192. All care is provided by child care centers licensed by the Department of Family & Protective Services that are not on corrective action with Child Care Licensing. Child care cost caps are based on average cost of care in the community in consultation with the local child care subsidy program.

QUESTION: Please indicate:

- (a) how long this property has been zoned historic
- (b) the total amount of tax abatements this property has received as a historic property
- (c) the amount of (b) attributable to the portions of property that would now be rezoned non-historic.

Does the City of Austin or any other entity have the ability to assess taxes retroactively for portions of a property that might be rezoned? MAYOR PRO TEM TOVO'S OFFICE

ANSWER: 1(a) The Pompee-Clark-Cook House was designated in 2000. (b) The Travis Central Appraisal District (TCAD) maintains these records; we will contact TCAD for this information. (c) An amount could be calculated based on land area, but would require a TCAD re-appraisal of the property for an accurate figure. 2) Chapter 11 of the City Code provides that the city can recoup any foregone taxes for up to the 3 years prior to a zoning change that removes historic zoning.

Agenda Item # 98: Conduct a public hearing to receive citizen input on the City's Draft Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Action Plan, as required by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Community Development Program, as required by Texas Local Government Code Chapter 373.

QUESTION: This action plan indicates we anticipate assisting 32 individuals through the HOPWA Permanent Housing Placement program. How many individuals did we assist through this program last year, and what was the average amount of assistance provided per individual?

This action plan indicates we anticipate assisting 15 households through the Down Payment Assistance project. How many households did we assist through this program last year, and what was the average amount of assistance provided per household?

This action plan indicates we anticipate assisting 31 businesses through the Microenterprise Technical Assistance project. How many businesses did we assist through this program last year, and what was the average amount of assistance provided per business? What type of technical assistance is provided and what qualifies as a microenterprise?

This action plan indicates that we anticipate creating/retaining 6 jobs through Community Development Bank program. How many of those jobs will be newly created, rather than retained? How many jobs have we created through this program last year, and what was the average amount of assistance provided per job newly created?

On page 62 of the plan, the Family Business Loan Program is described as an

activity that will create at least 229 jobs over the next three to five years. However, it also says "Jobs created/retained: 85 (Source: Austin Economic Development Department)". Can staff please clarify how many jobs are anticipated to be created/retained through this program, and please explain the 85 job figure cited in this section?

Can staff please explain how we monitor/measure the number of jobs we create/retain through these various programs detailed in this plan. Please provide any reports that document this over the last 2 years. COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

Agenda Item # 99: Conduct a public hearing and consider an ordinance that continues and readopts City Code Chapter 9-3, relating to juvenile day and night time curfews.

QUESTION: 1) Does the Austin Independent School District recommend or support renewal of the juvenile curfew ordinance? 2) What are the citations for breaking the juvenile curfew, broken out by race? Do citations always result in a conviction, or can the citation be dismissed? If a citation can be dismissed, please provide the data broken out by race of the proportion of juveniles who have their curfew violation dismissed, and those who do not. 3) For a first offense of breaking the juvenile curfew where the Austin Police Department would issue a warning, does a warning of that type end up on a juvenile's record? 4) Is the Austin Police Department aware of any data that would indicate what proportion of youth who are cited for violating the juvenile evening curfew are subsequently cited for additional criminal offenses? If so, please share that data. 5) Is the Austin Police Department or any other relevant city department aware of any community input from parents of children who requested the evening curfew be eliminated? COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

ANSWER: 1) AISD Interim Police Chief Chris Evoy confirmed that AISD is in support of the renewal of the juvenile curfew ordinance. 2) The attached spread sheet has the data by race. There are many citations that are diverted and dismissed through the successful completion of the Austin Youth Diversion (AYD) program; these cases are never filed as criminal charges. There are also a lot of cases that are filed in the Austin Municipal Court (AMC) that are dismissed. Please see attached spreadsheet (first attachment) which includes four tabs: AMC Summary, AYD Summary, AMC Total Day& Night detail, AYD total Day & Night detail. There are filters on the summary tabs for the race; the race can also be seen on the detail tabs. Again, this spreadsheet only contains cases which were diverted and dismissed before being filed as criminal charges (AYD) and those that were dismissed after being filed as criminal charges (AMC). None of these resulted in convictions on the juveniles' records. 3) A warning issued to a juvenile for a violation of the curfew ordinance would be a juvenile justice record maintained by APD. Because a

violation of the curfew ordinance is a class C misdemeanor, warnings are not automatically reportable to the State. Warnings (and convictions) issued under the curfew ordinance are not releasable in response to a criminal background check or a criminal background investigation conducted by the military, business, passport, or travel abroad requirements, etc. In general, access to records related to a juvenile's curfew warning or conviction will be limited to officials involved in the criminal justice process (judges, court staff, prosecutors, attorneys for the juvenile), the Office of Juvenile Affairs, and other law enforcement agencies. In addition, the juvenile and the juvenile's parent or guardian may have access to the records. There are also different procedures that permit or require expunction or removal of records related to a curfew warning or violation. 4) We do not currently have this data. We can likely get it; however, it will take several days (maybe more) to do so. Please let us know if you would like for us to work on this. 4) We do not have any documented input from stakeholders asking for the curfew to be eliminated.

Agenda Item # 101: Conduct a public hearing and consider an appeal by Michael Rooney relating to the Mechanical, Plumbing, and Solar Board's decision to deny an exception to the Plumbing Code's requirement that 3704 Ranch Creek Drive be connected to the City's public water supply infrastructure. (District 10)

QUESTION: Absent the plat language, does this property and water well qualify under the code provision 25-12-153, 601.1.1 (3)? COUNCIL MEMBER TROXCLAIR'S OFFICE

ANSWER: Austin Water Utility is tasked with, and given specific authority for provision 601.1.1 of Austin City Code Chapter 25-12-153. The position of the Water Utility was the well was not "existing" prior to the installation of the central water system in the 1980's. Therefore, the situation does not warrant a waiver from 601.1.1.

QUESTION: 1) What condition or physical situation constitutes a connection of a lot in a subdivision to a public water system? (reference 15-9-1 (13)(b) Definitions) 2) Can a Lot in a subdivision have an actual physical connection to the public water system that terminates at the Point of Delivery on the lot (i.e. cut-off valve)? 3) Is a connection to the public water system created when the property or lot of a subdivision has a service line coming from the main water line in the street and terminates in meter box with a cut-off valve on the lot itself? 4) Does installing a meter at the end of the service line on the lot create the contractual relationship with the water utility? (15-9-35 (A) 5) Does Chapter 25-12 Article 6 (Uniform Plumbing Code) apply to structures which are not served by the city's water utility? [See 25-1-2 (A)(5)] 6) When is the "service contract" created with Austin Water? 7) Can a customer of Austin Water terminate his/her service and thus the contract at his//her option? 8) If a client terminates his/her service and contract with Austin Water can they then use any alternate source of potable water at his/her disposal? 9) Does the Austin Development Services Department routinely investigate and enforce subdivision plat note restrictions? 10) The City of Austin Development Services Department has a "Request for Modification or Alternate Method of Compliance" form. What is the process for utilizing that form? Did the applicant submit that form to the department? 11) Does the Development Services Department concur with Austin Water? 12) Is the property served by an existing private potable water system? 13) What specific factors such as the type of facility served, the age, condition, and capacity of the private potable water system, and the availability of records regarding the system, changes to the system, or the system demand have led the water utility to determine that any existing private potable water system cannot be used?

14) Plat notes restricting accessory dwelling units being built on a property are not taken into consideration when the city issues building permits. Why does staff city reference a plat note on the property requiring connection to the City of Austin public water system as part of the basis for their denial? Under what circumstances does the city make permit decisions based on plat notes? COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

ANSWER: See attachment.

Agenda Item # 102: Conduct a public hearing to consider an ordinance amending City Code Section 25-1-21 (Definitions) and 30-1-21 (Definitions), amending City Code Chapter 25-2 relating to Planned Unit Development green building criteria, amending City Code Chapters 25-7 (Drainage) and 30-4 (Drainage), and amending City Code Chapters 25-8 (Environment) and 30-5 (Environment). This ordinance will amend Chapter 25-8, Subchapter A, Article 13 (Save Our Springs Initiative) and Chapter 30-5, Subchapter A, Article 13 (Save Our Springs Initiative). This action concerns land located within the Barton Springs Zone.

QUESTION: Could staff advise what questions the Environmental Commission raised and the answers that were given? COUNCIL MEMBER POOL'S OFFICE

ANSWER: The following are key questions and issues discussed by the Environmental Commission:

Section 25-8-2, boundary verification: The Environmental Commission asked whether the Watershed Protection Department director has the authority to require an applicant to verify the boundary of any regulated area described in Section 25-8-2, or only the Edwards Aquifer recharge zone boundary as clarified in Section 25-8-2(C). Staff confirmed that the director may require verification of any boundary and revised the proposed amendment accordingly.

Section 25-8-41, findings of fact: The Commission was concerned that the preliminary revisions to the Land Use Commission findings of fact were not clear, and worked with staff to refine the proposed language to ensure that the historical interpretation is both preserved and clarified. The Commission recommendation is reflected in the draft ordinance.

Redevelopment exceptions and agricultural facilities: The Commission also

discussed and asked questions about many of the proposed amendments to the Barton Springs Zone Redevelopment Exception, the related proposal to allow on-site restoration as mitigation for redevelopment in the water supply watersheds, and the proposal to exempt some agricultural facilities from water quality control requirements. The Commission recommended that these three topics be deferred to allow for further review (with the exception of minor clarifying amendments to the redevelopment exceptions). These proposed amendments will return to the Commission in July and are scheduled for a Council hearing in October.

Finally, the Commission had clarifying questions about various amendments and recommended minor revisions to several sections. The recommended revisions are reflected in the draft ordinance.

Agenda Item # 103: Conduct a public hearing and consider a resolution supporting an application to be submitted to the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs by Del Valle 969 Apartments, Ltd., or an affiliated entity, for the new construction of an affordable multi-family development to be located at approximately 14011 FM 969, in the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Austin.

QUESTION: Have staff conducted a fair housing assessment of this site? Does staff conduct fair housing assessments for any tax credit applications? Does staff believe conducting these types of assessments would be helpful for future decisions? Please explain why, or why not. COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

#### ANSWER:

NHCD does not currently conduct fair housing assessments of tax credit applications to be submitted to the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA). NHCD serves as the administrative portal for the development community seeking City Council resolutions of no objection or letters of support, depending on application requirements.

Del Valle 969 Apartments, however, has been reviewed by Travis County due to its location in the City's Extra-Territorial Jurisdiction (ETJ). This analysis is included in the Travis County Commissioner Court backup http://traviscountytx.iqm2.com/Citizens/FileOpen.aspx?Type=1&ID=1638&Inline=True on pages 488-496.

Staff concurs this analysis can inform community decisions related to development proposals. The City's Fair Housing Action Plan, completed as part of the City's last Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing, calls for this analysis and staff will work with the City Council Housing and Planning Committee to discuss policy direction on this issue.

QUESTION: Please provide any available information on how the proposed rents compare to unsubsidized rental rates in the nearby area. COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

ANSWER: The developers contracted with Apartment MarketData, LLC, to have them prepare a market feasibility study for Del Valle Apartments (Austin ETJ, Travis County, Texas) in compliance with TDHCA guidelines. Apartment MarketData completed a best estimate of market rents for the subject property, based on existing rents within the submarket. This analysis was based on the most comparable market rate projects in and around the Project Market Area. The projects included in the analysis were: Cityview, Creekstone, Ellie Reserve at Walnut Creek, Springdale Gardens, and Travis Station.

The Apartment MarketData, LLC, estimate of market rents in the area range from \$1,025 for a one-bedroom unit to \$1,865 for a four-bedroom unit.

Approximate rents for the proposed development range from as low at \$346 for a one-bedroom unit to \$1,1163 for a four-bedroom unit.

QUESTION: Can NHCD provide a map of tax credit properties citywide?




REQUEST: What are the taxable boundaries of the ESD 4 area? Can staff overlay those boundaries

We have provided a map which shows ESD 4's entire territory with the ETJ and Limited Purpose, plus a separate map which displays the Council Districts.

#### **ANSWER:**

#### Removing the high capacity event venue requirements:

Since first reading, staff determined that regulating high capacity event venues is not necessary since there is only one high capacity venue in the city limits, Circuit of the Americas (COTA).

## Incorporating specific sound equipment requirements (based on existing City Code):

This change was made at the request of stakeholders.

## Allowing legacy events to give notice of proposed special event dates for a five year period:

This change was made to address stakeholder concerns about maintaining consistency between existing and future event dates and planning for future events.

#### Changes to conform the ordinance to staff's practices:

Most changes relate to documentation requirements for right-of-way closures in Chapter 14-8. Another change is to make the text of the ordinance be consistent with the approval/disapproval/inspection requirements. Staff approves applications earlier in the process but cannot approve the permit until inspections are passed.

## Other changes that are based on information learned since first reading:

The changes made to the draft ordinance include:

Changed "special event district" to "special event impact area," because using the term "district" created confusion. Modified an exception to the ordinance based on changes in the law.

Added clarity to the park or meeting room event exception to allow food or non-alcoholic beverage.

Changed the deadline for Tier 1 events on private property that would occur during or two weeks after Spring Festival Season to help staff better manage the workload leading up to and after Spring Festival Season.

Moved the content required in an application to administrative rules to allow the City Code requirements to focus on timelines.

Modified the types of non-public safety plans each Tier is required to provide to manage City staff resources (i.e. the waste reduction, diversion and emission reduction plans).

#### **Overview and Principles**

The Downtown Austin Alliance has worked collaboratively with the Austin Parks & Recreation Department to develop a comprehensive Management & Programming Plan for Republic Square. One aspect of this plan is a programming and events schedule developed by a group of community stakeholders who made up a Programming & Events Advisory Committee. The vision for Republic Square is to create an inclusive and welcoming space for a diversity of users. This space was originally designated as a community gathering space in the 1839 plan, and our intent is that Republic Square will continue to be that for residents, employees, and visitors of Austin. The guiding programming principles, as determined by the committee, include:

- Republic Square is <u>first and foremost a neighborhood park</u>, with the improvements and operations intended to support and encourage regular, everyday use and to provide a true outdoor asset to those who live, work or visit downtown Austin.
- Programs and amenities will support a diversity of users—including nearby residents and employees, families with children, seniors, transit users, tourists and others.

The agreement requires the Downtown Austin Alliance to be responsible for all operations, programming and management of the park. This includes revenue from park rentals in order to support not only daily operations, but the infrastructure to manage and coordinate free programming activities in the park.

#### **Closure Defined**

The Parkland Events Task Force recommended and the Austin Parks & Recreation Department's has adopted definitions related to park impacts. At this point, the Downtown Austin Alliance (DAA) do not know what types of events may approach the Downtown Austin Alliance for the use of Republic Square. The initial year of use will be about managing a well-balanced approach to programing in close coordination with the management team, but also with the Austin Parks and Recreation Office of Special Events.

## **Parkland Events Task Force Use Definitions**

- **Open** full accessibility normal day in the park without event uses.
- In Use no fences, no barriers, significant portion of the park reserved/impacted by the event. Includes increased pedestrian and vehicular activity.
- Partially Open greater than 50% available without a ticket and unfenced.
- Minimally Open more than 50% closed, only available to ticketed patrons.
- Closed no accessibility ticketed participation only.

#### Closed Events and Costs to the Public

All events will be vetted to ensure the principles of the Management Committee are implemented. As a priority Republic Square is first and foremost a neighborhood park, with the improvements and operations intended to support and encourage regular, everyday use and to provide a true outdoor asset to those who live, work or visit downtown Austin.

- To balance the infrequent revenue-producing opportunities, the Downtown Austin Alliance intends to activate the park throughout the year with free and family-friendly active and passive programming.
- Revenue generated from "closed events" will help support free programming in the park.
- The Downtown Austin Alliance will implement a flat fee schedule with no ticket share requirement.
- The 20 requested closed event days will be in response to the market.
- It is a business decision of each event to set ticket pricing.
- Some full-closure events may be ticketed; some may be free to invited guests only in response to market demand.
- As suggested, the Downtown Austin Alliance and the Austin Parks and Recreation
  Department are committed to discussing and organizing a balanced calendar of events
  to ensure closure impacts have equitable distribution.

## **Programming and Grounds Management**

The DAA hired park expert Tim Marshall and his team at ETM Associates to help create an operating plan that recognizes the balance of scheduling events and their direct impact on the landscaping and health of the park. ETM recommends "rest periods" between events based on the number of attendees, the time of the year, set-up requirements and the areas utilized.

- The park will continue to serve the SFC Farmers' Market each Saturday. This is defined as an in-use park event, open to the public.
- Following the maintenance and operations plan would prevent the DAA from renting the park out for major events every weekend during peak seasons.

#### **Progress Reporting**

The DAA will provide written programming and events report to the City Council in advance of the 2018 consideration of maximum closure days.

- The report will include information on the number and type of confirmed events.
- The report will include visual calendar of open weekends at the park.
- The DAA will provide this written update to City Council as follows:
  - o The 3 month operational period, and
  - the sooner of 6 months of operations, or at a time when 10 of the closed days are confirmed and booked at the park.

What is being included in the base budget for 2018 for this service? How long was the previous contract for these services and what was the annual spend for those contracts? #### **ANSWER:**

Agreeing to a longer single term rather than having extension options for the contract can result in better terms, pricing, and provides cost certainty over a reasonable period of time. Because of these benefits, longer single term contracts are often used for sole source contracts where there is only one source for the item and it is known that the item will be needed for an extended time into the future.

\$17,500 covers the remaining months of this fiscal year. There is \$20,000 included in the Fiscal Year 2018 base maintenance budget for this contract. There is no funding in the Fiscal Year 2018 budget for replacements, so upon a failure the department manages their bottom line to cover the additional costs as needed. Like most City contracts, this one will include a funding out clause, which allows us to cancel the contract if the budget for the contract is not approved in future years.

The current contract is for six years. The annual spend is summarized in the chart below:

1) Bunker gear is considered to be bunker coats, pants, suspenders, helmets, gloves, boots, and hood. Associated costs are:

- 2) Firefighters are not required to purchase their own gear or equipment. EMS employees are required to purchase their own designated footwear and duty belts to hold radios and accessory gear.

#### **ANSWER:**

(1) Has this topic in the resolution: "City boards and commissions, including terms of Planning Commission members;" already been treated by the Board and Commissions Transition Taskforce?

The Board and Commissions Transition Taskforce, in 2014, deliberated whether to merge the Planning Commission with the Zoning & Platting Commission and looked at possible re-allocation of workload. The specific issue of "terms of Planning Commission members" does not appear to have been considered.

(2) What were their findings and what is left for this commission to explore?

Directing general and/or specific areas of inquiry would be the province of Council via resolution.

Previous discussions/questions relating to "terms for Planning Commission members" have highlighted the issue that the Planning Commission terms (unlike almost all other boards/commissions) are set in Article X of the City Charter rather than in the Code. The Charter requirement is for a fixed 2-year term and for a stagger. With the unique situation of an entirely new 10-1 council being sworn in at the same time in 2014, the stagger does not now exist. Because the Planning Commission term is contained in the Charter rather than the Code, the terms do not run in consonance with the terms of appointing council members.

(3) Has this type of commission existed in the past for the City? If so, please provide a copy of their work products.

Yes. Attached are older resolutions from 1997, 1983, 1993, and 2001 establishing Charter Review Commissions.

The most recent have been a Charter Review Commission established by Council Resolution 20110804-028 to propose ballot items for the 2012 election relating to single-member district representation, and a Charter Review Commission established by Council Resolution 20070405-029 to propose ballot items for the 2008 election also relating to geographical representation for election for council members.

Historically, in Austin as well as in other similarly-situated home rule cities operating under charters, charter review commissions are constituted every several years to make "technical" recommendations and "substantive" recommendations to Council for possible inclusion on an upcoming ballot so that the electorate can vote whether to amend the existing charter. Some charters contain a provision for mandatory constitution of a commission at designated time intervals, but the City of Austin Charter does not. "Technical" recommendations involve provisions which have been superseded by state law or judicial interpretation, which contain obsolete references to state statutes, or which have been rendered meaningless due to passage of time (i.e. transition sections). Adoption of technical recommendations do not make any actual change in the prevailing law. Instead, they merely remove from the charter all provisions which are directly misleading because they conflict with superior authority, or which are clutter. In contrast, "substantive" recommendations are those which would actually result in some change in the city's governing law.

#### RESOLUTION 970814-29

#### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

The City Council establishes a Charter Revision Committee composed of nine members for the sole purpose of advising the City Council whether the City Charter should be amended to provide for changes in the method of the election of Council Members with emphasis on election from single-member districts. Members of the Committee shall be representative of the community and shall be appointed by the Council on a consensus basis. The Committee shall begin its work as soon as all members are appointed but no later than September 8, 1997, and shall work expeditiously with the goal of proposing appropriate amendments for consideration by the City Council. #### SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDATIONS CHARTER REVISION COMMITTEE CITY OF AUSTIN

#### **JANUARY 15, 2000**

The Charter Revision Committee recommends to the Austin City Council that a Charter Election be held in May, 2000 in order for the voters to vote on the following recommendations:

- 1. That the City Council consist of a mayor elected at large and ten members elected from neighborhood (single member) districts; that all district members have three year terms and must live in the districts from they are elected for at least six months prior to the filing deadline for the election in which they are candidates; that one third of the district representatives be elected each year except for the first year of implementation when all district candidates will be elected with terms for each district determined by lot; that the number of districts be increased to twelve when the population of the city increases by 25,000 above the population determined by the year 2000 Federal decennial census.
- 2. That the term of office of the Mayor be four years.
- 3. That an independent Redistricting Committee be appointed by the City Council to perform the decennial and interim redistrictings.
- 4. That, in the year preceding the year in which the Federal decennial census is conducted, the City Council appoint a Charter Revision Committee to examine and recommend on possible changes to the method of election of the City Council.
- 5. That Instant Runoff Voting be used to resolve general elections in which no candidates receives the required majority of the votes cast and that this item be a separate ballot item from the above.

#### INTRODUCTION

The Charter Revision Committee was established by the Austin City Council in August, 1997. Its charge was to advise the City Council as to whether the City Charter should be amended to provide for changes in the method of election of Council members, with emphasis on election from single member districts. Because of changes in the membership of the Committee and an intervening Charter amendment election in November, 1997, the Committee did not start meeting regularly until November, 1998. Since that time, it has met at least monthly, frequently with election experts, consultants, and people from other cities and has held five focus groups and seven public hearings with the citizens of Austin. (See appendix A for details).

Although the charge to the Committee focussed on election of the City Council from single member districts, the Committee looked at a broad spectrum of possible methods of election as it became apparent that the growth of the city both in area and in population and the dispersion of minority populations into the general population could have an impact on the dynamics of any system of election. The deliberations of the Committee were somewhat hampered by uncertainty about the dispersion of minority populations throughout the community as the most reliable data available is 1990 census data. Additionally, in the course of its research, the Committee found that state law precludes the use of a number of election systems which might address the issue of dispersion of minorities – whether ethnic or opinion groups – throughout the city. These include: at large elections without places; proportional voting; cumulative voting; and multimember districts with at large elections within the districts. In other words, the choices available to the city at the present time are the current system of at-large city wide election by place; single member neighborhood districts; multi member districts with places and mixed systems involving a combination of districts and at large Council members, again all being elected by place.

In addition to the system of election to the City Council, the Committee also considered related issues such as length of term of office, whether or not the Council should be elected on a staggered basis, term limits, when elections should be held, the need for periodic review of the election system, who should be responsible for drawing the lines of districts and later redistricting, and the possible use of instant runoff voting.

An issue that the City Council will have to face is the date on which to hold a Charter election. While the Committee believes that the election should be held in May, 2000 prior to the drawing of district lines, a number of people have expressed the view that they could not vote on a Charter amendment unless they knew where district lines would be drawn. We believe that our recommendation for a Redistricting Committee may help to assuage some of these concerns. The alternative would be to hold the Charter election in May, 2002 after the year 2000 census data has been received and district lines can be drawn. We believe that this approach could focus the voters on possible district boundaries rather than on the issue itself, to change the way we elect Council members. This would also subject the city to the large expense associated with drawing district lines with no assurance that the plan would pass. It would also delay implementation to May, 2003 if the plan is passed.

The Committee wishes to acknowledge the assistance of Kathy Donellan, Executive Assistant in the City Manager's Office; John Steiner Assistant City Attorney; and Ryan Robinson, Demographer, PECSD. They have provided the Committee with technical and administrative support without which we could not have completed our work. We also thank the many citizens of Austin who testified at the public hearings and attended the focus groups.

#### **Detailed Recommendations**

#### **Recommendation #1**

That the City Council consist of a mayor elected at large and ten members elected from neighborhood (single member) districts; that all district members have three year terms and must live in the districts from they are elected for at least six months prior to the filing deadline for the election in which they are candidates; that one third of the district representatives be elected each year except for the first year of implementation when all district candidates will be elected with terms for each district determined by lot; and that number of districts be increased to twelve when the population of the city increases by 25,000 above the population determined by the year 2000 Federal decennial census.

On a vote of 5 in favor, 3 against, with 1 abstention, the Committee voted to recommend a City Council of 12 neighborhood district representatives (later amended to 10 districts with an increase to 12 with increasing population) and a mayor for the following reasons:

- a. There is common agreement that the current system needs to be changed. Almost no one who attended our meetings, focus groups or public hearings defended the current system. Criticisms included the rapid growth of the city which precludes Council members from knowing the concerns of the various parts of the city; the high cost to candidates of getting elected; and the feeling on the part of minority voters that people elected under the so-called "gentlemen's agreement" are dependent are votes from the majority population and, thus, may not represent the interests of minorities much less neighborhoods, areas of the city, subgroups or interest groups. In the course of its research, the Committee learned that Austin is the only large city in Texas that elects its City Council purely at large. It is also one of a small handful of larger cities nationally to do so. Austin also has the smallest City Council of any city with which we might compare. It is the only city which has three year terms of office. (Appendices C and D)
- b. The need for City Council members to be accountable to a constituency was the highest ranked criteria by all focus groups (Appendix B) and was endorsed at all public hearings. Participants agreed that any system adopted should assure such accountability.
- c. The desire for geographic representation appears to be city-wide. Committee members were struck by the number of people from throughout the city who appear to be angry and alienated because they feel that the needs of their areas are not being heard or attended to by the City staff or City Council. An analysis of the residences of City Council members who were elected in the past twelve years shows that the majority of Council members have lived in central and west Austin and that all parts of south Austin, east Austin, southwest Austin, and north west Austin have been underrepresented.
- d. Smaller in area, more numerous neighborhood districts allow candidates of limited means to compete more successfully for election. They also may increase voter participation since residents of each district will feel that their votes will have more impact on who is elected. In addition, a larger number of neighborhood districts will allow for population growth that is, the number of residents per district will not be excessive, even in the face of a growing population. While the final recommendation of the Committee is for ten neighborhood districts, the need to accommodate population growth is reflected in the suggested increase to twelve districts when the City Council decides that the city has grown by 25,000 people above the number determined by the year 2000 Federal decennial census. The city of Houston's charter contains a similar provision allowing for the automatic addition of two additional districts when a certain population level is reached.

- e. There is a strong desire on the part of meeting participants for greater diversity on the City Council. This diversity encompasses geographic, ethnic, and political differences. We asked the participants in our focus groups to rank a number of criteria against which one can compare election systems. After accountability to a constituency, participants ranked representation of geographic areas, representation of ethnic groups, and representation of various points of view, as their highest priorities. (Appendix B.). Participants in the public hearings agreed with these priorities.
- f. According to a 1993 analysis by the City Demographer's office, while it is mathematically possible to draw viable districts with fewer than 12, at least 12 single member neighborhood districts would be required to more fairly represent the demographics of Austin. While many members of the minority community expressed a desire to "get beyond race," the Voting Rights Act of 1964 requires that the voting strength of ethnic minority populations may not be diluted. It is estimated that a system of 12 single member districts would likely result in the election of at least one candidate preferred by the African American community and at least two candidates preferred by the Hispanic community.
- g. Although Austin is unique in having three year terms of office for members of the City Council, there was little sentiment to change them. It is the belief of many that two year terms require too frequent elections and put too much pressure on Council members since they must raise campaign funds and begin campaigning not long after they are elected. It is also believed that the added year of experience allows Council members to function more effectively.

A minority of Committee members supported a City Council of 11 members, seven elected from single member districts, three Council members and the mayor elected at large from places. Arguments in favor of this system included:

- a. A pure single member district system can lead to parochialism on the Council. At least some members of the Council, in addition to the mayor, should have a more city wide or global view.
- b. Some minorities, such as Asian Americans, are geographically quite diverse. Under a pure single member district system, they would be unable to influence any member of the Council. If at least some members are elected at large, these minorities may have influence on the Council members elected city-wide since they will be part of the electorate for those members.
- c. Some people have expressed the desire to vote for more than one Council person in addition to the mayor. They believe that Council members who do not rely on them for votes will unsympathetic to their needs which may or may not be supported by their district representative.
- d. In order for minorities to retain their power under a single member district system, they may be forced to remain somewhat racially segregated. This is contrary to what is actually happening in the city and, in fact, is contrary to what is considered by many to be a positive trend toward greater dispersion of all minorities into the general population.

Two other plans were proposed but did not receive a majority of the votes. The first was a plan with six dual member districts with district representatives elected from places and a mayor elected city-wide. This plan would have allowed people to vote for more than one representative and might allow for diversity of representation from each district. The second plan consisted of nine single member districts, three "super" districts each encompassing three of the single member districts and a mayor elected city-wide. This plan also would allow for people to vote for more than one representative. Supporters of these plans now favor the majority recommendation.

#### Recommendation #2

#### That the term of office of the Mayor be four years.

The Committee voted unanimously to recommend that the term of office of the Mayor be increased from three to four years. There was concern among Committee members that there would be a disproportionate impact on the elections of district representatives in the year in which the Mayor is elected. The four year term would, at least, shift the impact from one set of district representatives to another. It is not uncommon, in other cities, for mayors to have a different length of term from other members of their City Councils.

#### Recommendation #3

# That an independent Redistricting Committee be appointed by the City Council to perform the decennial and interim redistrictings.

The Committee voted 6-0 (three members absent) to recommend the following provisions for such a committee.

The City Council should create an independent redistricting body at the time of each decennial census and at other times when it is necessary to redistrict the city (such as large annexations, districts declared invalid or other extraordinary circumstance). The Committee shall consist of 13 members, each member of the City Council making one appointment. The seven sitting City Council members would each appoint a member of the first Committee and the Committee itself would select the other six.

Restrictions on those who could serve on the Redistricting Committee:

Committee members would not be permitted to hold or have held any public office, be a City of Austin employee, a paid political consultant or a paid campaign worker within two years prior to selection;

Or be a relative (to the third degree of affinity or consanguinity) of an Austin City Council member; or and employee of an Austin City Council member, of a commissioner or county officeholder from Travis County; or of a state legislator; or U. S. representative;

Or be or have been a registered lobbyist at any city, county or state within the last two years.

Committee members would not be permitted to hold a seat on the Austin City Council for three years after the effective date of the plan;

Or be a paid or registered lobbyist for three years after the effective date of the plan.

The Committee would be appointed not later than February 1st of each year ending in one. Its work would be required to be completed within six months of receipt of the Federal decennial census data.

Criteria for Redistricting Lines:

Districts will be of equal population with a maximum deviation from the average of no more than 5%; be compact and contiguous; and comply with the intent of the Voting Rights Act.

No district shall be drawn for the purpose of favoring a political party, incumbent Council member or other person or group or for the purpose of augmenting or diluting the voting strength of a language or racial minority group.

In redistricting, no use should be made of data relating to the political affiliation of registered voters.

The Committee makes this recommendation because of concerns raised by some citizens as to who would be responsible for drawing the districts. This concern seems to exist, at least in part, because of unhappiness with the way that school district boundaries have been drawn as well as because of the general alienation discussed above. Although districting can never please everyone, the use of a device such as a redistricting committee as described above can remove some of the perception that the process of drawing lines is "political." Both El Paso and Dallas provide for redistricting commissions in their charters.

#### Recommendation #4

That in the year preceding the year in which the Federal decennial census is conducted, the City Council appoint a Charter Revision Committee to examine and recommend on possible changes to the method of election of the City Council.

With the rapid growth and changing demographics of the city, it is very possible that any election system will become obsolete. It is also possible that the Texas Legislature will make changes to the Election Code which would permit other, possibly more appropriate, election systems. The Committee believes that a thorough review every decade is a way to insure that the needs of the city can continue to be met. This process also structures a way for continuing evaluation and input by Austin citizens about election methods.

#### Recommendation #5

That Instant Runoff Voting be used to resolve general elections in which no candidates receives the required majority of the votes cast and that this item be a separate ballot item from the above recommendations.

Instant Runoff Voting (IRV) is a method of voting devised to eliminate the need for runoffs when no candidate receives the required percentage of votes to be elected (in Texas this is more than 50% of the votes cast). Under IRV, voters rank as many candidates as they wish by writing 1, 2, 3, etc. next to their names instead of voting for just one candidate. If any candidate receives a majority of the first choice votes, the candidate is elected. If no one receives a majority, the candidate with the fewest votes is eliminated, and votes cast for that candidate are transferred to the next choice candidate listed on the ballot. This process continues until one candidate receives a majority of the vote. This system is used in Europe and by some nongovernmental organizations. This method allows for election of people who get the most votes, rather than postponing the run-off for three weeks.

The advantage of this system is that it eliminates the very substantial cost both to the candidates and to the city of a runoff election. Also, the number of voters who vote in run off elections generally drops significantly from the number of voters in the general election. In theory, candidates will have to make more broad based appeals since they may have to depend on second or third place votes to get elected. It also can solve the problem of groups of voters splitting their votes among similar candidates, allowing a candidate with only minority support to win.

Because this is a novel recommendation, we suggest that it be a separate ballot item from the other proposals so that voters can clearly indicate whether they wish to incorporate this voting method into the City Charter.

#### **Term Limits**

The Committee considered the question of the term limit provisions currently in the City Charter. It decided not to make any recommendations on this issue although we recognize that the provisions are quite weak. This is an issue that the Council might wish to consider. There did not appear to be a groundswell of opinion on this subject at the various public meetings we held.

#### Appendix E Demographic Summary

The City of Austin's population has increased from 465,000 to an estimated 631,000 since the 1990 census, a more than a 35% increase. Because of this high growth, we cannot be completely accurate in what we know about the city's demographics. We are more comfortable with total numbers than we are with where people are located.

Most big cities are majority minority. Austin, as yet, is not although it may become so in the future.

Austin growth is caused by rapid increase in its Hispanic population and substantial in-migration of Anglos and Asian-Americans. About half of Austin's growth can be attributed to in-migration. Most of the rest of the growth is from natural increase of births over deaths. A small percentage is from annexation. (28,000 in 1997 or about 4% of the total population was by far the greatest increase due to annexation).

The proportion of African Americans in the Austin population has been the approximately the same for 40 years - 11.5%

The Hispanic population is now 27.3 % or, possibly a little higher, percentage of Austin's population. This population is expected to continue to increase faster than the general population.

Asian Americans are currently approximately 4% of the population but this population is growing rapidly and is expected to reach 6% after the turn of the century, possibly by 2010. Asian Americans are the most geographically dispersed minority population.

We seem to be becoming less racially segregated primarily due to economic mobility. Economic status sometimes appears be more of a factor than race or ethnicity in where people are living. African Americans are currently more residentially segregated than Hispanics. Asian Americans are least residentially segregated. As Austin becomes more diverse, it will become increasingly difficult to draw districts that are homogeneous in race or ethnicity.

Per the City's most recent CAPER, 21 households were served, with an average cost of \$40,437 per household (\$849,173/21).

The Family Business Loan Program (FBLP) was approved by Council in 2012 and funded by a \$3.0 million allocation of U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Section 108 funding. The original \$3.0 million Section 108 allocation was exhausted in FY15 but an additional \$8.0 million allocation was obtained from HUD in mid-FY16. The FBLP makes low-interest fixed asset and working capital loans to qualified Austin small business owners who are ready to expand their business and create jobs. These loans commit the borrowers to create one new job for low- to moderate-income persons for every \$35,000 borrowed. Base on the \$8M allocation, Economic Development Department must create a minimum 229 over a 3 – 5 year period. EDD estimates creating 85 jobs in FY18.

Each recipient of the FBLP proceeds, must submit a yearly compliance report on their respective job creation.

At loan closing loan recipients are provided written notice of the job creation/retainage requirements of the Family Business Loan program and are contractually obligated to report on no less than an annual basis via loan closing documents.

The Family Business Loan Program conducts a bi-annual reporting process to better ensure accuracy of the count and to provide a reporting redundancy to ensure compliance with HUD reporting requirements are met and migrating risk of a failure to count due to unforeseen disruption.

(15-9-35 (A) 5) Does Chapter 25-12 Article 6 (Uniform Plumbing Code) apply to structures which are not served by the city's water utility? [See 25-1-2 (A)(5)] 6) When is the "service contract" created with Austin Water? 7) Can a customer of Austin Water terminate his/her service and thus the contract at his//her option? 8) If a client terminates his/her service and contract with Austin Water can they then use any alternate source of potable water at his/her disposal? 9) Does the Austin Development Services Department routinely investigate and enforce subdivision plat note restrictions? 10) The City of Austin Development Services Department has a "Request for Modification or Alternate Method of Compliance" form. ### **ANSWER:**

1) What condition or physical situation constitutes a connection of a lot in a subdivision to a public water system? (reference 15-9-1 (13)(b) Definitions)

A connection is constituted when the City-owned water distribution pipes have been physically joined to a property owner's cut-off valve.

2) Can a Lot in a subdivision have an actual physical connection to the public water system that terminates at the Point of Delivery on the lot (i.e. cut-off valve)?

Yes, by definition, the Point of Delivery for water service is "the water meter or the customer's property line if the meter is installed on the customer's property."

- 3) Is a connection to the public water system created when the property or lot of a subdivision has a service line coming from the main water line in the street and terminates in meter box with a cut-off valve on the lot itself?
  - Yes. By the definitions above, a connection to the public water system is created when the City's system is connected to the property owner's cut-off valve.
- 4) Does installing a meter at the end of the service line on the lot create the contractual relationship with the water utility? (15-9-35 (A)

A service contract is created when: 1) the City and a person execute a written service agreement; 2) the City accepts a written, electronic or verbal application for utility services, 3) the city provides utility services to a person, or; 4) other circumstances that obligates a person to pay the City for utility service.

5) Does Chapter 25-12 Article 6 (Uniform Plumbing Code) apply to structures which are not served by the city's water utility? [See 25-1-2 (A)(5)]

A service contract is created when: 1) the City and a person execute a written service agreement; 2) the City accepts a written, electronic or verbal application for utility services, 3) the city provides utility services to a person, or; 4) other circumstances that obligates a person to pay the City for utility service.

- 6) When is the "service contract" created with Austin Water?
  - A service contract is created when: 1) the City and a person execute a written service agreement; 2) the City accepts a written, electronic or verbal application for utility services, 3) the city provides utility services to a person, or; 4) other circumstances that obligates a person to pay the City for utility service.
- 7) Can a customer of Austin Water terminate his/her service and thus the contract at his//her option?

  Yes. However, pursuant to 15-9-39 NOTICE OF CUSTOMER CANCELLATION, the only specific condition addressed for customer initiated service disconnection is for the case where a customer "vacates a water service address." Otherwise, according to the Plumbing Code 25-12-153, 601.1.1 connection to state licensed public potable water system is required.
- 8) If a client terminates his/her service and contract with Austin Water can they then use any alternate source of potable water at his/her disposal?

See response to Question 7 above.

9) Does the Austin Development Services Department routinely investigate and enforce subdivision plat note restrictions?

DSD considers plat notes on a case-by-case basis. The applicability of plat notes varies depending on whether they were required by the City of Austin, or are merely private restrictions, as well as whether they relate to regulatory requirements under the Land Development Code or technical code restrictions such as the ones at issue in this case.

10) The City of Austin Development Services Department has a "Request for Modification or Alternate Method of Compliance" form. What is the process for utilizing that form? Did the applicant submit that form to the department? The process for using the "Request for Modification or Alternate Method of Compliance" form depends on whether the applicant is requesting an alternate method or a modification. The code text that defines these approaches is included below. The essential difference is that to be approved as an alternate method, the applicant must be able to demonstrate equivalence (see underlined text below under 104.11) to the code requirement, even if by a method not specifically addressed by the code. A modification must meet the intent of the code as to health, safety and fire protection, and also demonstrate a unique technical reason that strict adherence to the code cannot be achieved (see underlined text below in 104.10). Mr. Rooney submitted a request for an alternate method of compliance on March 30, 2017.

Plumbing Code Section 301.2 Alternate Materials and Methods of Construction Equivalency. Nothing in this code is intended to prevent the use of systems, methods, or devices of equivalent or superior quality, strength, fire resistance, effectiveness, durability, and safety over those prescribed by this code. Technical documentation shall be submitted to the Authority Having Jurisdiction to demonstrate equivalency. The Authority Having Jurisdiction shall have the authority to approve or disapprove the system, method, or device for the intended purpose. However, the exercise of this discretionary approval by the Authority Having Jurisdiction shall have no effect beyond the jurisdictional boundaries of said Authority Having Jurisdiction. An alternate material or method of construction so approved shall not be considered as in accordance with the requirements, intent, or both of this code for a purpose other than that granted by the Authority Having Jurisdiction where the submitted data does not prove equivalency.

Building Code Section 104.10 Modifications.

Wherever there are <u>practical difficulties</u> involved in carrying out the provisions of this code, the building official shall have the authority to grant modifications <u>for individual cases</u>, upon application of the owner or owner's representative, provided the building official shall first find that special individual <u>reason makes the strict letter of this code impractical</u> and the modification is in <u>compliance with the intent and purpose</u> of this code and that such modification <u>does not lessen health, accessibility, life and fire safety, or structural requirements</u>. The details of action granting modifications shall be recorded and entered in the files of the department of building safety.


Building Code Section 104.11 Alternative materials, design and methods of construction and equipment.

The provisions of this code are not intended to prevent the installation of any material or to prohibit any design or method of construction not specifically prescribed by this code, provided that any such alternative has been approved. An alternative material, design or method of construction shall be approved where the building official finds that the proposed design is satisfactory and complies with the intent of the provisions of this code, and that the material, method or work offered is, for the purpose intended, at least the equivalent of that prescribed in this code in quality, strength, effectiveness, fire resistance, durability and safety.

- 11) Does the Development Services Department concur with Austin Water?
  - Because DSD and Austin Water evaluates the system using different criteria, DSD defers to Austin Water on this issue. DSD evaluates a potable water system to determine if it is dangerous, unsafe, unsanitary, or a nuisance. In this case, DSD determined the well was drilled consistent with state and local requirements and is not dangerous, unsafe, unsanitary, or a nuisance. Austin Water evaluates the property and system to determine whether connection to the City's water supply is required. In this case, Austin Water determined that the water well on the subject property system did not pre-date the installation of the public water system and, as a result, 601.1.1(3) does not apply.
- 12) Is the property served by an existing private potable water system?

  No. Austin Water understands that the property owner has drilled a water well on the subject property after the installation of the public water system. Therefore, the well did not exist prior to the availability of the public water system and, as such, does not qualify as an "existing private potable water system."
- 13) What specific factors such as the type of facility served, the age, condition, and capacity of the private potable water system, and the availability of records regarding the system, changes to the system, or the system demand have led the water utility to determine that any existing private potable water system cannot be used?
  - Austin Water does not have the affirmative duty to evaluate the specific factors listed here because a state licensed public potable water system is available and suitable for service within 100 feet of the subject tract.
- 14) Plat notes restricting accessory dwelling units being built on a property are not taken into consideration when the city issues building permits. Why does staff city reference a plat note on the property requiring connection to the City of Austin public water system as part of the basis for their denial? Under what circumstances does the city make permit decisions based on plat notes?

Plat notes relating to utility hookups are City requirements, not private restrictions, and are not requirements that a landowner can opt out of. The plat notation at issue in this case does provide for modification, with City of Austin approval, but the responsible decision maker, in this case Austin Water Utility, has determined not to relax the applicable standards and is, therefore, requiring the applicant to connect to the City water system.

# Additional Answer Information

**QUESTION:** 1) Please provide the information staff utilized to determine that adopting the IRC would have a positive impact on affordability. 2) Please explain the differences between the UPC and the IRC. 3) If we adopt the IRC for residential structures, and still have the UPC on commercial structures, what impact will that have on affordability, or other issues? 4) If we adopt the IRC for single family structures, should council anticipate that staff would recommend adopting the IRC for commercial structures? COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S OFFICE

### **ANSWER:**

1. Please provide the information staff utilized to determine that adopting the IRC would have a positive impact on affordability.

DSD staff concludes that adopting the IRC will increase affordability for the following reasons:

- 1. Allowances for smaller water meter sizing.
- 2. Allowances for smaller water lines
- 3. Allows for a smaller venting system with a smaller building drain and building sewer,
- 4. Distances on trap arms are greater which provides more options for vent location and potentially less vent piping.
- 5. Allows automatic vents for more design options and less pipe.
- 6. Provides consistency with the rest of the state can allow for more competitive rates.

In regards to actual cost saving numbers for example:

- The minimum water meter size allowed in the IRC is 5/8" and in the UPC it is 3/4".
- The smaller pipe sizes of the IRC allow a 5/8" meter to handle more plumbing fixtures.
- If a homeowner has to upgrade to a ¾" meter, the cost will be anywhere from \$700 to \$3,000 (based on plat date) plus private installation of the water meter (\$10K-\$20K).
- Keeping a 5/8" meter saves the customer nearly 50% every month on the service charge alone -\$7.10 vs \$13.00.
- And, smaller pipe sizes are in line with the water conversation and affordability priorities of Imagine Austin.
- 2. Please explain the differences between the UPC and the IRC. Salvage Vanguard Theatre

The process used to develop the IRC includes an organization made up of the three model code groups: Building Officials and Code Administrators (BOCA), International Conference of Building Officials (ICBO), and Southern Building Code Congress International (SBCCI). Input is received from a diverse, nationwide body of building, plumbing, mechanical and fire officials, as well as industry representatives such as BOMA and the GSA.

In contrast, the process used to develop the UPC, which is a standalone code for plumbing only, was exclusively by the plumbing and mechanical industry and plumbers' union representatives, along with a few self-selected plumbing and mechanical officials from the western region of the United States.

The IRC allows for smaller pipe sizes to be used; has smaller water supply fixture unit counts; smaller drainage fixture unit counts; longer trap arms; technology (i.e. an air admittance valve) that the UPC endorses, but does not have in their code; offers greater design flexibility with venting options and is more widely used than the UPC.
3. If we adopt the IRC for residential structures, and still have the UPC on commercial structures, what impact will that have on affordability, or other issues?  Because commercial plumbing is typically designed by an engineer, it does not impact a plumber's work.
4. If we adopt the IRC for single family structures, should council anticipate that staff would recommend adopting the IRC for commercial structures?  In the future, staff anticipates that it will recommend Council adopt International Plumbing Code for commercial plumbing requirements.


