Under this subaward agreement, the Austin Police Department will agree to reimburse Measure Austin for services in an amount not to exceed \$146,000, including fees and expenses. Measure Austin will work in partnership with the Austin Police Department, Austin Justice Coalition, NAACP Huston-Tillotson University Unit#69AA, SAFE Alliance, all grantor agencies, and the community to complete required deliverables. Measure Austin will drive the partnership's needs assessment, coordination, implementation planning, asset identification and capacity building, staff and community training, and workshops. Measure Austin will develop recommendations and reports concerning APD policies and practices and will work closely with grantor technical assistance providers. Data required for performance measure reports will be collected from all project partners (under the guidance of Measure Austin) and filed by the APD Grants Manager. The partnership will collectively develop the project implementation place and final report. Funding in the amount of \$146,000 is available from the U.S. Department of Justice through the Vision 21 Program (Law Enforcement and the Communities They Serve: Supporting Collective Healing in the Wake of Harm) for the 22-month grant period. This agreement will terminate on September 30, 2019.

This agreement is effective on the date the agreement is signed by the last of the parties ("Effective Date"). This Council shall terminate on September 30, 2019.

Under the sub-award agreement, Measure Austin will work in partnership with the Austin Police Department, Austin Justice Coalition, NAACP Huston-Tillotson University Unit#69AA, SAFE Alliance, all grantor agencies, and the community to complete required deliverables. Measure Austin will drive the partnership's needs assessment, coordination, implementation planning, asset identification and capacity building, staff and community training, and workshops. Measure will develop recommendations and reports to bring APD policies and practices in line with changes and will work closely with grantor technical assistance providers. Data required for performance measure reports will be collected from all project partners (under the guidance of Measure) and filed by the APD Grants Manager. The partnership will collectively develop the project implementation plan and final report.
