**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:**

The Council directs the City Manager to, by the end of 2018, construct, build or establish, either through temporary structure or other alternative arrangement, interim fire stations in at least the top two areas of greatest need as identified in the-an updated 2017, Austin Fire Department/Austin Fire Association Fire Station Risk and Service Delivery Analysis Report, that accounts for recent CAMPO funding allocated to Advanced Signal Timing technology, as well as projected mobility improvements from the 2016 City of Austin Mobility Bond. This may include options such as working with the Texas Department of Transportation to use the toll booth station located on Toll Road 130.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:**

The Council directs the City Manager to develop a six-year timeline to fund, construct, and staff five permanent fire stations in the areas of greatest need as identified in the updated 2017 Austin Fire Department/Austin Fire Association Fire Station Risk and Service Delivery Analysis Report. This plan should look at innovative solutions to streamline the entire process to significantly reduce the timeline and find other efficiencies. The plan should include creating a working group that includes all relevant City departments – from Procurement and Real Estate, to Permitting and the Fire Department – to streamline the process and may include partnering with outside entities such as Emergency service District 11 to build and/or co-locate a fire station in the Del Valle area.
