34 (B) Of the seven commission members appointed under Subsection (A)(2), five shall
35 be elected public officials or their representatives and two must be members
36 chosen to represent major groups and interests in the community served
37 including, but not limited to, business, industry, labor, religious, law
38 enforcement, [~~and~~] or education stakeholders.

39 (C) The council shall designate from time to time eight geographic areas of [~~Austin~~]
40 Travis County [~~having either a Health and Human Services Department~~
41 ~~neighborhood center or a Parks and Recreation Department recreation center,~~]
42 and shall designate a seat on the commission to represent that area.

43 (D) The council may from time to time by resolution change the boundaries of a
44 designated geographic area in Subsection (C) and the name of the designated
45 area.

46 (E) The council shall designate an organization that actively represents the residents
47 of each respective geographic area designated in Subsection (C) to nominate a
48 person to serve on the commission in the seat designated to represent that area.

49 (F) The council may from time to time by resolution change the organization
50 designated in Subsection (E).

51 (G) The commission shall advise the council in the development and implementation
52 of programs designed to serve the poor and the community at large with an
53 emphasis on federally funded programs.

54 (H) In addition to the advisory role the commission serves under Subsection (G), the
55 commission serves as the advisory board required by [~~the Community Services~~
56 ~~Block Grant Act, as codified in~~] 42 U.S.C.A. §9910.

57 (I) Notwithstanding Section 2-1-21 (Eligibility Requirements and Removal) of the
58 City Code, at any time, by an affirmative vote of eight of its fifteen members, the
59 Community Development Commission may remove any of the eight
60 democratically selected members; and may recommend to council the removal of
61 any of the seven members appointed by council.

62 **PART 3.** Subsection (C) of Section 2-7-72 (*Reports*) of the City Code is amended to read
63 as follows:

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§2-7-72 **REPORTS**

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(C) The members of the following boards and commissions shall report the information required by Subsection (E):

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(1) Arts Commission;

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(2) Board of Adjustment;

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(3) Environmental [~~Board~~] Commission;

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(4) Historic Landmark Commission;

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(5) Housing Authority of the City of Austin;

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(6) Parks and Recreation Board;

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(7) Planning Commission;

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(8) Public Safety Commission;

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(9) Zero Waste Advisory Commission;

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(10) Water and Wastewater Commission;

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(11) Urban Renewal Agency; [~~and~~]

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(12) Zoning and Platting Commission[-]; and

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(13) Community Development Commission.

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PART 4. Each member of the Community Development Commission shall serve a maximum of two consecutive four-year terms in accordance with subsections (B) and (C) of Section 2-1-22 (*Membership Term and Limitation*) of the City Code. To stagger the terms, the seven appointed members of the Community Development Commission who are nominated by a council committee and appointed by council, shall serve a maximum of two consecutive four-year terms in accordance with subsections (B) and (C) of Section 2-1-22 (*Membership Term and Limitation*) of the City Code. The eight democratically selected members shall serve an initial two-year term with an additional maximum of two consecutive four-year terms in accordance with subsections (B) and (C) of Section 2-1-22 (*Membership Term and Limitation*) of the City Code. After these initial terms have expired, the subsequent terms of each member of the Community Development Commission shall not exceed the maximum of two consecutive four-year terms in

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
