21 Foundation, and St. David's Foundation; and

22 **WHEREAS**, Austin's 'silver tsunami' poses unique challenges and opportunities
23 across the City portfolio to meet the needs of the rising number of elderly, and the LBJ
24 School proposal addresses a number of these critical issues; and

25 **WHEREAS**, the City has not had a thorough consideration of the best use of the
26 City-owned RBJ Health Center; **NOW, THEREFORE**,

27 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:**

28 The City Council directs the City Manager to:

- 29 • review the analysis completed to date and assess the need for an adult day
30 center with other integrated community components on City-owned
31 facilities, such as at the RBJ Public Health Center as proposed by the LBJ
32 school team. This review should be done in conjunction with the LBJ
33 school team, the Commission on Seniors, and other experts on senior
34 services, such as the Dell Medical School, as appropriate;
- 35 • determine the feasibility of developing City-owned facilities for such
36 purposes, including the RBJ Public Health Center;
- 37 • recommend a process for developing an adult day center at the City-owned
38 RBJ Public Health Center, or other potential City-owned facilities, should
39 the City Council decide to provide that direction in the future; and

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- report back to City Council with recommendations no later than March 1, 2019.
