Additional Backup Information:

The contract will provide 29 galvanized steel utility poles for an Austin Energy project with the Texas Department of Transportation. Per a utility agreement with the State of Texas through the Texas Transportation Commission, Austin Energy will provide new poles and adjust, remove, and/or relocate its poles. Austin Energy design engineers determined that 29 galvanized steel poles are needed to fulfill this agreement and complete the project. The State of Texas has adjustments and reimbursement provisions under their Utility Relocation Agreement that will allow Austin Energy to recoup the cost of the poles.
