### **Posting Language**

Approve an ordinance amending City Code Chapter 14-9, (*Traffic or Sidewalk Obstructions*) to broaden services regulated in the City's right-of-way, to include bicycles and micro-mobility devices, and repealing certain City Code sections.

### **Prior Council Action:**

Ordinance No. 20180426-027 approved an ordinance amending City Code Chapter 14-9, (Traffic or Sidewalk Obstructions) to expand the types of acts that are prohibited; creating a City-wide services license; and declaring an emergency, on a 7/3 vote with Council Members Alter, Flannigan, and Houston voting nay.

### **Additional Backup Information:**

City Code Chapter 14-9 authorizes the Austin Transportation Department (ATD) to permit vending within the public right of way, to include dockless micro-mobility services.

ATD is proposing an amendment to remove the specific term "dockless", to broaden the City's ability to regulate bicycles and micro-mobility device services, to mitigate future disruptions introduced within the City of Austin.

The below sections are being repealed, to move dockless providers into a Franchise permitting model where the City can better manage the market and regulate their activities by contract or written agreement.

- 14-9-23 - CITY-WIDE DOCKLESS TRANSPORTATION LICENSE AUTHORIZED,
- 14-9-24 - CITY-WIDE DOCKLESS TRANSPORTATION UNIT PLACEMENT PLAN,
- 14-9-25 - LICENSE AMENDMENT, SUSPENSION, OR REVOCATION

Micro-Mobility Device scooter or other compact device designed for personal mobility either privately owned or as part of a shared mobility service. It does not include Transportation Network Carriers (TNC's) or electric personal assistive mobility devices under Texas Transportation Code Section 551.201.
