On May 6th, 2019, the Art in Public Places (AIPP) Panel approved the Selection Process Recommendation for the Montopolis Recreation and Community Center AIPP Project Phase II Exterior Sculpture opportunity, naming Agustina Rodriguez as the selected artist and Luis Gutierrez as the alternate artist. Additional Backup Information:

AIPP, of the Cultural Arts Division, Economic Development Department sought to commission a professional visual artist to design, fabricate and install artwork to be located in an exterior area located in the plaza near the front entrance and working in collaboration with project stakeholders and City staff. The total budget available for this project is \$90,000.

The opportunity was open to visual artists, or artist teams, at least 18 years of age who live and work in Williamson, Travis, Bastrop, Caldwell, Hays, Burnet and Blanco counties to create artwork that incorporates colors, imagery and themes that reflect the aesthetic qualities of the community; through community engagement, suggests the future aspirations of the residents of the Montopolis neighborhood; and responds to the story of the facility from 1971 to present and the activism of the surrounding community.

On April 6, 2019, the Selection Team reviewed the 25 applications. The Selection Team recommended Agustina Rodriguez as the selected artist and Luis Gutierrez as the alternate.
