Additional Backup Information:

As a standard business practice, the City routinely engages the services of professional engineering and architectural firms to perform analysis, design and related support associated with construction or improvement of City capital assets. Rotation list contracting allows the City to always have a group of qualified consultants available to perform a specific type of recurring work in a timely manner to meet the project needs of the City.

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The original rotation list has obligated 95% of the authority previously authorized. In order to complete an existing assignment without interruption of services, additional authorization is necessary while the City completes a replacement contract.

This amendment has been approved by the City's Change Control Committee. The Change Control Committee was established to comply with Council Resolution No. 20120126-048, which required the establishment of consistent criteria and process to evaluate contractual changes for all contracts administered by the Capital Contracting Office. The Change Control Committee is comprised of management-level subject matter experts.
