ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: Funding will be used to promote targeted, evidence-based programs and services that focus on a healthy start at birth, supporting families with infants and toddlers, and providing high-quality care learning environments that reduce the number of children entering kindergarten who are not ready to learn. The City is required to match funds as outlined below:

Year 1: Local match expected was a minimum of 50% (minimum of \$37,500 to draw down the full \$75,000), but with a plan to have communities demonstrate local investment that equals Pritzker Children's Initiative (PCI) investment.

Year 2: Local match at 100% (minimum local match of \$75,000 to draw down a PCI match of \$75,000).

The General Fund will not be required to contribute additional funds beyond those currently budgeted to this grant. When the grant funds expire, Austin Public Health Department's need for continued funding will be evaluated and may be denied.
