### **Additional Backup Information:**

This RCA requests Council approve the appointment of Dr. Mark Escott as the Health Authority commencing October 3, 2019 and ending March 31, 2020. Dr. Escott has designated Dr. Jason R. Pickett as Back-Up Alternate Health Authority.

Under state law (Health and Safety Code Section 121.029), the Health Authority may delegate any power or duty imposed on the health authority to a properly qualified physician to act while the health authority is absent or incapacitated. The physician designated by the health authority must:

- Meet license and residence requirements;
- Be appointed as a designee in the same manner as the Health Authority; and
- File the Oath of Office, executed by a duly appointed Notary Public, with the Texas Department of State Health Services.

The delegation is effective during the term of the Health Authority making the delegation. The Health Authority is responsible for the acts of the physician to whom the powers have been delegated, and the entity that appoints the Health Authority must have procedures in place to prevent duplication of authority and provide notice to the Austin Public Health Director when authority is transferred. The Austin Public Health Department (APH) has had a "Delegation of Back-Up Health Authority" in effect since July 1, 2000.

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The current curriculum vitae is attached for the Health Authority and Alternate Health Authority, as well as a copy of the required appointing documents required by the Texas State Department of Health Services.

## **PERFORMANCE**

Related Department Goal: Promote a healthy community by preventing chronic and communicable diseases and promoting improvements in social/economic/environmental factors that will result in an improved overall health status and a reduction of health disparities.

### **Health Authority**

Dr. Mark Escott received his medical degree from Flinders University School of Medicine in South Australia and a Master's in Public Health from the University of Texas at Houston School of Public Health. He has a license to practice in the State of Texas and is subspecialty certified in EMS with the American Board of Emergency Medicine. His medical education includes an internship at the University of Adelaide-Modbury Public Hospital and a residency in emergency medicine at Pennsylvania State University-MS Hershey Medical Center, including serving as Chief Resident in Emergency Medicine. Dr. Escott currently serves as EMS System Medical Director for the City and Travis County. He previously served as Director of the Division of EMS and Disaster Medicine at the Baylor College of Medicine, and as Health Authority for the Montgomery County Public Health District. Dr. Escott meets all the requirements of the Health and Safety Code to be designated as the Health Authority.

### **Alternate Health Authority**

Dr. Jason R. Pickett received his medical degree from Eastern Virginia Medical School and has been in practice between 11-20 years. He serves as the EMS System Deputy Medical Director for the City of Austin and Travis County, Texas, and is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Emergency Medicine at Wright State University. Dr. Pickett is the Tactical EMS Co-Chair for the Special Operations Medicine Scientific Assembly and is a member of the Guidelines and Practice Committee for the National Association of EMS Physicians. He is also a member of the Guidelines Committee for the Committee on Tactical Emergency Casualty Care. Dr. Pickett is Board Certified in Emergency Medicine and Subspecialty Board Certified in Emergency Medical Services. Prior to his position in Austin, Dr. Pickett served as the Director of the Center for Prehospital and Operational Medicine at Wright State University. He has served as Medical Director for several fire departments and police SWAT teams. He is currently a Lieutenant Colonel in the West Virginia Army National Guard as a Battalion Surgeon in a special operations unit. Dr. Pickett's current responsibilities include education, clinical guidelines, community health, rescue, and tactical medicine. Dr. Pickett meets all the requirements of the Health and Safety Code to be designated as an Alternate Health Authority.
