

Overview

We support adults and children living with mental illness, substance use disorder and intellectual and developmental disabilities in Travis County.





Overview

- Created by Federal, State and Local laws in 1960s
- 1 of 39 Local Mental Health and Intellectual and Developmental Disability Authorities in Texas
- Governed by a Board of Trustees appointed by Central Health, City of Austin and Travis County
- Two Roles: State Designated Authority and Provider

LMHA Impact on Homelessness

Resource Development

- Local Mental Health Authority (LMHA) secures the local match required to bring federal and state resource to Travis County.
 - Match for all HUD Vouchers received by HACA
 - 100% match for Forensic Assertive Community Treatment (FACT) team
- Apply for and secure state funds
 - \$827,343 supports ECHO Coordinated Entry, Rathgeber Center, Communities for Recovery and Family Eldercare

Fund and Utilization Management

- Manage access to inpatient psychiatric hospital beds and crisis respite for people with acute mental health symptoms
- Reviews and approves anyone seeking services with Integral Care

Planning/Education/Training


- Collaborate with stakeholders to strengthen local processes and systems
- Train first responders on engaging with individuals in crisis
- Community wide training in Mental Health First Aid





Housing Continuum Where does Housing First fit?






Integral Care FY20 Homeless and Housing Funds by Source
