
Allegations received in FY19

MOST COMMON ALLEGATIONS

- 34% HR RELATED ISSUES, WHICH INCLUDES HARASSMENT, DISCRIMINATION, RETALIATION ISSUES
- 10% DEPARTMENTAL OPERATIONAL ISSUES

REPORTER INSIGHTS

- 71% OF REPORTERS WERE ANONYMOUS
- 42% USED THE ONLINE REPORTING FORM
- 23% USED THE WHISTLEBLOWER HOTLINE
