#### Posting Language

Authorize amendments to two existing contracts with Entech Sales and Service LLC and Johnson Controls US Holdings LLC D/B/A Johnson Controls Fire Protection LP, to provide continued security and fire protection systems and related services, for an increase in the amount of \$431,000, for revised contract amounts not to exceed \$3,318,000, divided between the contractors.

(Note: These contracts were reviewed for subcontracting opportunities in accordance with City Code Chapter 2 -9C Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program. For the services required for these contracts, there were insufficient subcontracting opportunities; therefore, no subcontracting goals were established).

#### Additional Backup Information:

These contracts provide inspection, installation, maintenance, monitoring, and repair of security and fire protection systems located at City Hall and various other departmental facilities. The security system includes both security access control and closed-circuit television monitoring systems (CCTV). The preventative maintenance service includes inspection, cleaning, testing, sensor adjustments, power systems and backup batteries, cameras, monitors, and related software. City employees monitor the CCTV system, while burglar

alarm systems are monitored by the contractors.

The system components are repaired or replaced on an as-needed basis. As the City's requirements change, the contractor may be requested to provide written recommendations for upgrades or other enhancements to ensure system performance.

The proposed amendments are needed in order to authorize additional funding to the contracts to add additional sites due to the cancellation of another City contract for similar services. These amendments will support the equipment installations and monitoring services required by the departments being added to these contracts.

If the City is unable to add the authorization to these contracts, the repair of City security systems will be impacted, leaving facilities vulnerable and at risk until security equipment and monitoring services can be sourced through another contract.
