Posting Language

Authorize the ratification of an agreement with El Buen Samaritano Episcopal Mission to provide direct financial assistance to Austin/Travis County residents impacted by COVID-19 in an amount not to exceed \$500,000 for the term of April 20, 2020 through September 30, 2020.

Fiscal Note

Funding in the amount of \$500,000 is included in the FY 2019-2020 General Fund Emergency Reserve Fund for Relief in a State of Emergency Fund to support COVID-19 emergency relief.

Prior Council Action:

April 9, 2020 Council approved Resolution #20200409-081 to appropriate an amount not to exceed \$15,000,000 for the Relief in a State of Emergency (RISE) Fund to support COVID-19 emergency relief, with a 11-0 vote on the virtual dais.

Additional Backup Information:

This action will authorize ratification of an Agreement with El Buen Samaritano to provide direct relief services and/or direct financial assistance to Austin/Travis County residents impacted by COVID-19. The term for this agreement is April 20, 2020 through September 30, 2020 in an amount not to exceed \$500,000 for a total contract amount of \$500,000, with no extension options.

On April 9, 2020, City Council approved an ordinance amending the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 General Fund Emergency Reserve Fund (Ordinance No. 20190910-001) to appropriate an amount not to exceed \$15,000,000 for the Relief in a State of Emergency (RISE) Fund to support COVID-19 emergency relief. On the same day, City Council approved Resolution No. 20200409-081, which authorized the City Manager to negotiate and execute new emergency contracts funded from the RISE Fund to offer immediate support services and direct financial assistance to residents impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and economic crisis.

El Buen Samaritano will use the direct financial assistance to continue serving persons of color, immigrants, and other historically marginalized communities.
