### Posting Language

Set a public hearing related to an application by LDG The Matador, LP, or an affiliated entity, for housing tax credits for a multi-family development that will be financed through the private activity bond program to be known as The Matador, located at or near 5900 South Congress Avenue, within the City. (Suggested date: Thursday, June 4, 2020, Austin City Hall, 301 W. Second Street, Austin, Texas).

### Additional Backup Information:

This action sets a public hearing to receive public comment on an application that will be (or has been) submitted to the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA). The Applicant, LDG The Matador, LP, or an affiliated entity, seeks funding for the Development through 4% Low Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC) and private activity bonds. After the public hearing, Council will consider a resolution about the proposed development. The property is located in Council District 2.

### Proposed Development

LDG The Matador, LP, which is an affiliate of LDG Development, LLC, is planning to develop a 285 unit multi-family development to be located at 5900 South Congress Avenue. The community will be affordable to households earning at or below 80% of the Austin Median Family Income (MFI), with 86 units at 50% MFI, 113 units at 60% MFI, and 86 units at 70% MFI. The development is proposed to be partially funded with 4% Low Income Housing Tax Credits and tax-exempt bonds issued by Austin Affordable Public Facility Commission (AAPFC), an affiliate of the Housing Authority of the City of Austin. An affiliate of AAPFC will be the General Partner of the Development's Partnership, thereby allowing for a full property tax exemption. No funding from the Austin Housing Finance Corporation is being requested.
