



International Swimming Pool and Spa Code



Proposed Adoption

- 2019: Texas Legislature passed House Bill 2858 adopting the International Swimming Pool and Spa Code effective September 1, 2020
- Applicable to construction, alteration, remodeling, enlargement, and repair of swimming pools and spas



Proposed Amendments

GOAL: Introduce minimal changes and retain current practices to the extent possible.

- Minor local amendments related to regulatory authority, administrative procedure and chain link fencing
- New code to be located in 25-12-14: Swimming Pool and Spa Code
- Relocating and modifying portions of existing City Code 10-7

Chapter 25-12: Proposed Local Amendments to International Pool & Spa Code

- Regulatory Authority to match current regulations:
 - Health Authority: Public Swimming Pools
 - Building Official: Residential Swimming Pools
- Change code references to match locally adopted codes:
 - Uniform Mechanical Code
 - Uniform Plumbing Code

Chapter 25-12: Proposed Local Amendments to International Pool & Spa Code

- Administrative Procedures to match current regulations:
 - Fees and refunds
 - Time limits on applications
 - Expiration and reactivations
 - Violation penalties
 - Stop work orders
- Chain Link Fencing additional safety measures:
 - Reduce climb ability
 - Provide additional stability
 - Prevent injury of children

Chapter 10-7: Proposed Local Amendments to Pools and Spas

- Relocate requirements to Chapter 25-12
 - Require compliance with State pool and spa regulations
 - Construction plan requirements
- Eliminate sections superseded by similar ISPSC requirements
 - Definitions
 - Health Authority designation and enforcement
 - Building permit requirement and permit issuance
 - Enclosures
