3 **AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CITY CODE CHAPTER 2 RELATING TO**  
4 **CITY COUNCIL COMMITTEES AND THE MUNICIPAL COURT;**  
5 **CREATING A PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE; AND DECLARING AN**  
6 **EMERGENCY.**

8 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:**

10 **PART 1.** Subsection (B) of City Code Section 2-5-103 (*Council Committees*  
11 *Created; Subject Matter of Each Committee*) is amended to read as follows:

12 (B) Council creates the following standing committees:

- 13       (1) The Audit and Finance Committee may review audit reports, matters related  
14       to the city auditor, the city clerk, internal services, bond oversight,  
15       purchasing and contract audits, taxation, financial policy, government  
16       performance, bonds and City debt, bond-funded programs, retirement  
17       systems, employee benefits, banking and investment policies, performance  
18       metrics and reporting, budget matters, affordability, and related matters. The  
19       Audit and Finance Committee shall also have oversight of the City's boards  
20       and commissions.
- 21       (2) The Mobility Committee may review land use as it concerns mobility, all  
22       transportation modes including, roads, aviation, public transit, pedestrian  
23       programs, bicycle programs, ground transportation, taxicab regulation, Lone  
24       Star Rail, core transit corridors, and related matters.
- 25       (3) The Austin Energy Utility Oversight Committee may review issues related  
26       to the City's electric utility. The Austin Energy Utility Oversight Committee  
27       is a committee of the whole council. Six members of the committee are a  
28       quorum, and the favorable votes of a majority of the quorum present at the  
29       meeting are required for the committee to take action. The committee may  
30       create subcommittees, including a subcommittee to address Austin Energy's  
31       business model.
- 32       (4) The Health and Human Services Committee may review social services,  
33       education, public health, health care services, animal welfare, sustainable  
34       food, social equity, veterans' affairs, populations at risk, and related matters.

35 (5) The Housing and Planning Committee may review housing and related land  
36 use and mobility issues, community development block grants, the City's  
37 comprehensive plan, the land development code, development processes,  
38 neighborhood planning, noise, annexations, and related matters.

39 (6) ~~The Judicial Public Safety Committee~~ may review the municipal court, the  
40 Downtown Austin Community Court, policing issues, criminal justice,  
41 emergency medical services, fire services, emergency management, code  
42 compliance, and related matters. ~~including making recommendations to the~~  
43 ~~full council on the following:~~

44 ~~(a) appointment of municipal court judges, including the presiding judge;~~

45 ~~(b) evaluation of the performance of the presiding judge of the municipal~~  
46 ~~court;~~

47 ~~(c) consultation with municipal court judges on the development of~~  
48 ~~performance criteria for the evaluation of municipal court judges under~~  
49 ~~Section 2-10-11(B)(10) (Presiding Judge);~~

50 ~~(d) appointment of the clerk of the municipal court;~~

51 ~~(e) appointment of the judge of the Downtown Austin Community Court;~~  
52 ~~and~~

53 ~~(f) evaluation of the performance of the judge of the Downtown Austin~~  
54 ~~Community Court.~~

55 (7) The Austin Water Oversight Committee may review issues related to the  
56 City's water utility, including mission, scope and responsibilities of relevant  
57 advisory commissions and task forces, strategic plans, major capital  
58 purchases or transactions, and financial policies and the financial status of  
59 the utility.

60 **PART 2.** Subsection (B) of City Code Section 2-10-11 (Presiding Judge) is  
61 amended to read:

62 (B) The presiding judge shall:

63 (1) maintain administrative control and oversight of municipal court judges;

- 64 (2) adopt rules for the orderly trial of a case in the municipal court;
- 65 (3) maintain a central docket for the cases within the municipal court's
- 66 jurisdiction;
- 67 (4) distribute cases from the central docket to the municipal judges to equalize
- 68 the workload of each judge;
- 69 (5) set the work hours for each judge;
- 70 (6) schedule and approve vacation, sick leave, and other absences for each
- 71 judge;
- 72 (7) assign the duties of each judge;
- 73 (8) assign municipal judges to exchange benches and to act for each other in a
- 74 pending proceeding;
- 75 (9) if necessary, assign a substitute judge to act in a judge's absence;
- 76 (10) at least twice during each term, evaluate the performance of each judge on
- 77 criteria other than a decision made in a judicial proceeding and forward the
- 78 evaluation to the Council ~~Judicial~~ Public Safety Committee; and
- 79 (11) perform the other duties of the presiding judge under Chapter 30
- 80 (Municipal Courts of Record) of the Texas Government Code.

81 **PART 3.** The Council finds that creation of the Public Safety Committee constitutes  
 82 an emergency. Because of this emergency, this ordinance takes effect immediately  
 83 on its passage for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
