SUBJECT: Response to CIUR 2186 – Resolution No. 20190808-144 regarding

Red River Cultural District Enhancements

This memorandum provides a summary of the progress the Economic Development Department and partnering departments have made in addressing the directives of City Council Resolution No. 20190808-144, and supporting City Council Resolution No. 20170608-033. Resolution 20190808-144 directs the City Manager to use available funds from the Great Streets Program to expeditiously deliver projects described in Resolution No. 20170608-033. Projects include partial alley closures, improving trash and recycling collection, installing lighting, installing temporary art, and completing pedestrian mobility improvements including sidewalk redesign. Additionally, costs associated with design, engineering, and project manager fees are to be included. Project prioritization categories include:

- Level 1 Project Prioritization inclusive of Safety and Accessibility Improvements: alley closure, lighting as deemed necessary from the study, Americans with Disabilities Act compliance, addressing absent sidewalks, installation of trash receptacles and pedestrian crosswalk restriping
- Level 2 Project Prioritization inclusive of Hardscapes and Right of Way Enhancements: sidewalk repair, design and engineering for curb cuts and sidewalk redesign, and street alignment
- Level 3 Project Prioritization inclusive of Beautification Projects: planter boxes, trees, and maintenance

Red River Cultural District Background

The Red River Cultural District is an area stretching between 6th Street and 12th Street along Red River and encompasses businesses within two blocks of Red River. The district is home to 10 live music venues, hotels and other businesses in an area essential to Austin's music industry ecosystem. Progress to Date

Staff implementation efforts continue with the achievement of several significant milestones outlined in the prior memorandum to Mayor and City Council – <u>CIUR 2186 Update (November 21, 2019)</u>:

• All permits for the alleyway gate and fence system are secured and the installation is complete. Additional details are available in the attached matrix.

- Austin Resource Recovery installed 10 trash and recycling receptacles along Red River between 6th Street and 11th Street. Austin Resource Recovery is providing regular collection service to these cans.
- Austin Energy completed a lighting study for the district. The light study concluded that the existing lighting meets and exceeds Austin Energy standards for street lighting. Staff explored solar lighting options, and this will be factored into the design and engineering phase of the project.
- Public Works staff completed conceptual designs. Economic Development Department and Public Works staff met with Red River Cultural District stakeholders on January 31, 2020 to share designs and gather feedback.
- Design Phase scope was approved, including a service agreement, and work has begun between Public Works' Engineering Services Division and Economic Development Department staff. The Design Phase will daylight any funding gaps beyond the allocated \$1.3 million and maintenance considerations.
 Design Phase will include a full construction plan for review, permitting, bidding, and construction.

Next Steps (60 Days)

Per City Council's direction, staff will prioritize the following actions over the next 60 days:

- Complete cost estimates highlighting any funding gaps beyond the allocated \$1.3 million and maintenance considerations.
- Complete the Construction Plans and Contract documents, including full construction set for review, permitting, and bidding construction.
- Develop engineering cost estimates and full project scope inclusive of site visits, Austin Utility Location and Coordination Committee coordination, and quality management.
- Continue efforts to address long term maintenance and funding allocations.

Project specific updates as well as scoping and administrative updates can be found in Matrix 1 Resolution Items, Updates and Cost Estimates. To increase transparency and communication on the items within Resolution No. 20190808-144, the City of Austin created a Red River Area Improvements webpage to share regular updates.
