ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: On June 9, 2020, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development announced an additional CARES Act award for the City of Austin of \$10,859,249 in grant funds to be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic among individuals and families who are homeless or receiving homeless assistance; and to support additional homeless assistance and homelessness prevention activities to mitigate the impacts of COVID-19. The acceptance and appropriation of these grant funds will facilitate the City's response to the current public health emergency related to the COVID-19 pandemic and will ensure the provision of services to Austin's most vulnerable population.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute additional funds beyond those currently budgeted to this grant. When the grant funds expire, Austin Public Health Department's need for continuing funding will be evaluated and may be denied.
