Posting Language

Authorize negotiation and execution of a cooperative contract with Freeit Data Solutions Inc., for hardware, software and support services for a data management platform, for a term of three years for a total contract amount not to exceed \$930,000.

Additional Backup Information:

The contract will provide continued data management platform hardware, software and support services for the Combined Transportation, Emergency and Communication Center (CTECC). Rubrik hardware and software is part of the core infrastructure that supports public safety data centers. The ongoing support is necessary to ensure CTECC can support mission-critical public safety systems and uphold stability.

The requested authorization amount is based on forecasted needs for the term of the contract.

The State of Texas Department of Information Resources cooperative establishes competitively bid contracts that can be utilized by the State and other government agencies through a cooperative agreement. Cooperative agreements save taxpayer dollars by leveraging the State's volume-buying power to drive down costs on hundreds of contracts through a streamlined cooperative purchasing program.
